- 6 Rule 5.8 Gift Limits for Legislative Liaison or Legislative
- 7 Lobbyist.
- 8 A. A legislative liaison or a legislative lobbyist may make a
- 9 gift to the Governor or any legislator or any employee of the
- 10 Governor or the Legislature in recognition of infrequently
- 11 occurring occasions of personal significance. The gift shall be
- 12 given and received contemporaneously with the occasion or at
- 13 times when such gifts are traditionally given. Such gifts may
- 14 be made to a family member of the Governor or any legislator or
- 15 any employee of the Governor or the Legislature, provided such
- 16 | family member is a party to a marriage, serious illness, birth
- 17 or adoption of a child or retirement. Such gifts to any
- 18 | individual recipient may not exceed One Hundred Dollars
- 19 (\$100.00) in the aggregate in any calendar year from any
- 20 | legislative liaison or legislative lobbyist.
- 21 | B. A legislative liaison or legislative lobbyist may provide
- 22 | books and similar informational materials, including those in
- 23 | electronic, audio and/or video format, to the Governor, or any

1 Legislator, or any employee of the Governor or Legislature, so 2 long as such materials are related to the recipient's 3 responsibilities as an officer or employee of the State of 4 Oklahoma. Materials provided pursuant to this subsection are not 5 required to be reported to the Commission. 6 Any such gGifts shall be reported to the Commission and 7 aggregated with meals. and t The aggregate total of meals and 8 other gifts provided to an individual recipient by a legislative 9 liaison or legislative lobbyist may not exceed Five Hundred 10 Dollars (\$500.00). Any gift not required to be reported to the Commission under Rule 5, including those gifts listed in 11 12 subsection (B) above, are exempt from the Five Hundred Dollar 13 (\$500.00) aggregate total limit for meals and gifts. 14 Rule 5.11. Gift Limits for Executive Lobbyist. 15 An executive lobbyist may make a gift to a state officer or 16 employee of an agency for which he or she is registered or 17 should be registered as an executive lobbyist in recognition of 18 infrequently occurring occasions of personal significance. The 19 gift shall be given and received contemporaneously with the 20 occasion or at times when such gifts are traditionally given. 21 Such gifts may be made to a family member of a state officer or 22 employee of an agency for which he or she is registered or 23 should be registered as an executive lobbyist, provided such

1	family member is a party to a marriage, serious illness, birth
2	or adoption of a child or retirement. Such gifts to any
3	individual recipient may not exceed One Hundred Dollars
4	(\$100.00) in the aggregate in any calendar year from any
5	executive lobbyist.
6	B. An executive lobbyist may provide books and similar
7	informational materials, including those in electronic, audio
8	and/or video format, to a state officer or employee of an agency
9	for which an executive lobbyist is or should be registered as an
10	executive lobbyist, so long as such materials are related to the
11	recipient's responsibilities as an officer or employee of the
12	State of Oklahoma. Materials provided pursuant to this
13	subsection are not required to be reported to the Commission.
14	\underline{C} . Any such $\underline{g}\underline{G}$ ifts shall be reported to the Commission and
15	aggregated with meals.7 and t The aggregate total of meals and
16	other gifts provided to an individual recipient by an executive
17	lobbyist may not exceed Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00). Any
18	gift not required to be reported to the Commission under Rule 5,
19	including those gifts listed in subsection (B) above, are exempt
20	from the Five Hundred Dollar (\$500.00) aggregate total limit for
21	meals and gifts.
22	Rule 5.13. Lobbyist Principal Gifts for Public Service to
23	Individual State Officer or Employee

A. A lobbyist principal may give a plaque, trophy or similar		
item suitable for display no more than once per year to a state		
officer or employee in acknowledgement of the officer or		
employee's public service, provided the value of the item is no		
more than Two Hundred Dollars ($\$200.00$), Such and the gifts is		
are reported to the Commission on the Legislative Lobbyist		
Report. No state officer or employee may accept more than one		
(1) such gift during any calendar year from the same lobbyist		
principal.		
B. A lobbyist principal may provide books and similar		
informational materials, including those in electronic, audio		
and/or video format, to a state officer or employee, so long as		
such materials are related to the recipient's responsibilities		
as an officer or employee of the State of Oklahoma. Materials		
provided pursuant to this subsection are not required to be		
reported to the Commission.		
<u>C.</u> A legislative liaison, legislative lobbyist, executive		
lobbyist or lobbyist principal may provide a gift of any single		
item with a fair market value not exceeding Ten Dollars (\$10.00)		
to any state officer or employee, provided that a legislative		
liaison, legislative lobbyist, executive lobbyist or lobbyist		
principal shall not make more than one such gift during any		
calendar year to any state officer or employee. Items given		

1	pursuant this subsection are not required to be reported to the
2	Commission.
