In affiliation with the American Public Health Association/Oklahoma Public Health Association The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) announced on September 25 the awardees of a highly competitive set of grants, and the American Planning Association is among that select group. APA has been awarded \$3 million in funding to advance community-based strategies to improve health and prevent chronic disease, under the CDC program *National Implementation and Dissemination for Chronic Disease Prevention*. APA's initiative will focus on improving the capacity of planning and public health professionals, and will be implemented in partnership with the American Public Health Association (APHA).
