



# Community Health Status Assessment Cleveland County

## Population Estimates

- 15.1 % increase from 2000 to 2008 (203, 376 to 239,760)
- Ranked 5<sup>th</sup> for growth in state 2008 Census Estimates
- Hispanic/Latino ethnicity = 5.8%
- White = 85.2%
- Native Americans = 5.1%
- Black = 5.5%
- Under 5 = 6.1%
- 65 and over = 9.3%
- Median age = 32.2 years



## Cleveland County Families

- Total school enrollment in Cleveland County = 76,500 in 2008
- 10% of county families are female headed households with no husband present
- In 2007, there were 835 persons receiving TANF payments
- The 2008 median household income was \$53,950 with 10% living under the poverty level

## Health of Cleveland County

- The State of Oklahoma ranks *below average* in multiple key health status indicators and ranks 46<sup>th</sup> in the nation in overall health.
- Cleveland County ranks in the *top 5 counties* in the state of Oklahoma in health outcomes.
- Cleveland County ranks *below average* in heart disease and stroke deaths when compared to the nation.
- Cleveland County has consistently improved its tobacco use rates from 24.4% in 2003 to 21.4% in 2008.
- The newly released Oklahoma Health Improvement Plan has targeted the state to focus on Tobacco Use Prevention, Obesity Reduction, and Children's Health.
- 83.7% of Cleveland County adults did not eat the recommended 5 servings of fruits and vegetables a day
- 7.2% of Cleveland County citizens have been diagnosed by a health professional as having diabetes
- Infant mortality rate was 6.3 per 1000 births and accounted for a 21% decrease from the state rate of 8.0 deaths per 1000
- The low birth weight rate is 7% and is a 14% decrease from the state and national rate

## Programs/Resources Funded through United Way

- **CATCH**-A Nutrition & Physical Activity program to decrease childhood obesity serving 240 kids daily
- **General Medical/Dental/Pharmacy**- 4890 people seen for general medicine, 2539 dental appointments and 7822 Rx's distributed through Health for Friends
- **Community Outreach**- Transition house provides services for 75-85 individuals annually
- **Transitional Living**- Treatment, education, and support for 30-40 individuals annually
- **Nutrition/Wellness Expansion**- 39 members have improved nutrition/health & wellness
