Jada also worked in Guymon as a Substance Abuse Prevention Director at Next Step and as Community Development Specialist for the City of Guymon, where she was involved with the arts and humanities.

In 1998, Jada moved to Spearman, Texas where she remarried and now resides. Since relocating to Spearman, Jada has Managed the O’Loughin Center, which is a multi-fasted community organization with fitness equipment, basketball court, senior citizen activities and hosts wedding receptions and showers.

“My kids brought me back to Guymon because I was missing out on their events,” said Jada. “Together, my husband and I have eight children and six of them are in the Guymon/Goodwell area.

Jada said she is ready to “Be active in the Community and get out face-to-face to show that I care.”
