The Mustang Prevention and Coalition Team (MPACT) was established in 2011 when concerned citizens wanted to make a difference in Mustang. MPACT is a Turning Point Partnership who is committed to creating an environment that promotes a healthy lifestyle for Mustang residents and those who attend Mustang Public Schools.

This year the MPACT student ambassadors from each school in Mustang came up with themes of events for each month pertaining to areas of focus around health. As each month came and went the ambassadors were able to teach and share health education methods and messages to the youth of their school. This was a way to have peer to peer interaction, while making learning fun.

One focus area for MPACT is risky behaviors particularly around prescription drug abuse prevention. In April MPACT Ambassadors from all schools hosted a Prescription Drug Take Back Day in conjunction with the Relay for Life Event that the schools holds each year. This event was a great way to spread the word and educate on safe disposal of unused prescription drugs.

MPACT ambassadors are out of school for the summer but have not slowed down. In May the coalition held a food drive to collect food to fight summer hunger for the youth in Mustang. This was a way to not only give back to the community but also to get the community involved in helping for a good cause.

In February the MPACT youth hosted the youth speak out and invited youth from Mustang and Yukon schools to participate. 12 youth (7th-12th grade) spoke out to the community and school leaders about everyday issues that they see or are faced with in school. This event and topics that were brought forth will help set goals for MPACTS upcoming strategic plan.

Also this year the Mustang Public Schools applied to become Certified Healthy. 11 out of 12 schools were certified healthy their first time to apply. This success is very supportive of the mission and goals of the coalition and student ambassadors of creating an environment that promotes a healthy lifestyle.

- ◇ 10 youth presented at Youth Speak Out


