



About Us...

Creek County is located in east-central Oklahoma. As of 2010, the population was 69,967. Its county seat is Sapulpa with a population of 20,544.

Other cities and towns in Creek County include: Bristow, Depew, Drumright, Kellyville, Kiefer, Mannford, Mounds, Oakhurst, Oilton, Shamrock, Slick. Unincorporated towns include: Milfay, Olive, Bowden, Gypsy, and Lawrence Creek.

The Creek County Community Partnership was formed in 1993 as the Creek County Interagency. In 2006, after strategic planning with the support of such agencies as the Federation of Families and Sooner SUCCESS, the name was changed to Creek County Community

Partnership to encompass all of Creek County services and agencies. In 2007, the Creek County Community Partnership sought a Systems of Care grant and became the SOC Community Team naming CREOKS Behavioral Health as the host agency for the \$120,000.00 grant.

Currently there are well over 30 agencies represented in the partnership. The CCCP continues to serve as a valued resource for not only community partners but families as well.

The CCCP meets the second Tuesday of each month at the Creek County Literacy Program office.

Through various work groups and committees, the CCCP has tackled child abuse prevention, healthy lifestyles initiatives, drug and tobacco prevention and most recently has been collaborating with the Regional Outcome Epidemiological Workgroup to look at data affecting Creek County outcomes. The Coalition has participated in community events such as the Blue Ribbon Dash to both raise awareness about child abuse prevention but also about healthy lifestyles as

well. They have also participated in resource and transition fairs associated with area schools as well as assisted with activities in area schools during Red Ribbon week. This fall the Coalition will be giving a SAMHSA best practices DVD to each school in Creek County featuring Matt Damon called Real Drug Stories which documents the real life stories of young people. We will also feature a panel presentation of experts available for each school when they view the video.
