Creek County is located in east-central Oklahoma. As of 2010, the population was 69,967. Its county seat is Sapulpa with a population of 20,544.

Other cities and towns in Creek County include: Bristow, Depew, Drumright, Kellyville, Kiefer, Mannford, Mounds, Oakhurst, Oilton, Sapulpa, Shamrock, Slick. Unincorporated towns include: Milfay, Olive, Bowden, Gypsy, and Lawrence Creek.

After engaging in a re-organization process in 2010, the Creek County Community Partnership (CCCP) which resulted in a new name, the creation of a mission statement and by-laws being passed. Partnership agencies can be involved in several ways (1) active or voting member and (2)

Supporting members. Currently there are well over 30 agencies represented in the partnership. The CCCP continues to serve as a valued resource for not only community partners but families as well.

The CCCP meets the second Tuesday of each month at the Creek County Literacy Program office.

The **Tobacco Coalition** a member of the partnership. The coalition activities are funded and guided by the Tobacco Settlement Endowment Trust. The purpose of the coalition is to work at the local level to prevent and help eliminate tobacco use. The Tobacco Coalition meets the third Tuesday of each month at the Creek County DHS building.

Improvement Project (C.H.I.P.) is based in Bristow, OK and is a frequent collaborator with the Creek County Community Partnership. The group is seeking to re-establish itself after a brief hiatus. The group held a meeting in June 2011 to identify priority areas for action. Sherry Fisher and Dr. “Chip” Cooper helped to convene the group.

The Creek County Child Abuse Prevention Taskforce is also seeking to re-establish itself. A meeting to kick off these efforts was held on August 11, 2011. The Taskforce’s efforts are being led by Erin Brook, the Executive Director of the Youth Services of Creek County.
