The Health Planning Committee is a sub-committee of the Enid Metropolitan Area Human Service Commission. The priorities of the Health Planning Committee include the following: MAPP (Mobilizing for Action through Planning and Partnerships), Dental Assistance, Mental Health Issues, Tobacco Control, and Physical Fitness and Nutrition.

In the spring of 2012, members of the Health Planning Committee formed the MAPP sub-coalition to engage the community to assess the health status of county residents. The Coalition is using the Mobilizing for Action through Planning and Partnerships (MAPP) model as a tool to collect data for developing strategies to improve health. MAPP consists of four assessment methods in a structured process for gathering and utilizing data for intervention strategies. Using these 4 assessments provides for a comprehensive view of the current health status, as

well as the factors, both real and perceived, that influence this community's health.

The top five elements of health were identified for Garfield County. They include:

- Access to Healthcare and Mental Health
- Childhood Health and Infant Mortality
- Tobacco, Alcohol and Other Drugs
- Chronic Disease
- Physical Activity and Nutrition (Obesity)

The Coalition, along with the community, is working towards creating their strategic Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP) in order to establish policy change, educate and promote a healthier quality of life and also to leverage potential resources within the community.

This year's Walk This Way event was a huge success for the county. 736 people register for Walk This Way, 270 people submitted their minutes, which totaled

5,458 hours and 48 minutes that the participants walk. This event is to help the residents know the important of physical activity as well as gave them the challenge and resources to be physically active for themselves and their family.

The Health Planning Committee is also the parent coalition for the TSET Community of Excellence Wave III tobacco prevention grant for Garfield County. This year, the Garfield County Tobacco Free Coalition: earned and paid for media to address tobacco use as well as expose deceptive practices of the tobacco industry; assisted schools with becoming tobacco free, and worked to passing local ordinances addressing Clean Indoor Air and Tobacco Free Parks.
