Distribution of "The Notice" Via Paper Mail to End

The June 1, 2004 edition of "The Notice" was the last to be mass-mailed on paper by the Oklahoma State Department of Health.

Beginning in July 2004, the Notice will be distributed exclusively through the State Department of Health Internet site at:

Section 8 of Enrolled House Bill 2723 changes the distribution method for Certificate of Need status reports. The amended law requires the monthly notice to be posted on the State Health Department's Internet site.

"The Notice" has been mailed monthly in Oklahoma for more than 25 years, and its address list has grown to some 2,100 people. The Health Department's staff looks forward to distributing Certificate of Need project information in the less costly and more timely manner afforded via the Internet.

House Bill 2723 Amends Oklahoma Certificate of Need and Nursing Home Laws

Enrolled House Bill 2723 by Rep. Wayne Pettigrew and Sen. Glenn Coffee amends numerous sections of the Long Term Care Certificate of Need Act and the Nursing Home Care Act. Governor Brad Henry signed Enrolled House Bill 2723 on June 4, 2004. The bill has an emergency clause and takes effect immediately.

Sections 1 through 9 of the bill amend the Long Term Care Certificate of Need Act. Certificate of Need changes include:

- new and revised definitions;
- deletion of the requirement for the Health Department to collect monthly occupancy data (instead, occupancy data collected by the Oklahoma Health Care Authority will be used for project reviews);
- modification of the types of projects that are subject to Certificate of Need review or exempt from review;
- amendments to fees for certificate of need applications and exemption requests;
- changes in the findings and standards for approval or denial of certificate of need applications;
- extensions of the time allowed for completion of construction projects; and
- increases in penalties for violation of the Certificate of Need law.

Sections 10 and 11 modify the Nursing Home Care Act. Nursing facility licensure changes include:

- amended definitions; and
- establishment of fees for construction plan reviews on construction or modification projects that increase beds.

Section 12 changes the section of law dealing with criminal history background checks for nurse aides and other facility staff persons. Definitions are amended to include an assisted living center or continuum of care facility as a type of employer that is subject to requirements for criminal background checks.

Section 13 amends the law that sets certain limits on the training and employment of nurse aides and medication aides. The changes include:

- a provision that until October 31, 2005 the Health Department shall not assess monetary penalties against a facility that has applied for a temporary emergency waiver;
- a requirement for the Board of Health by September 30, 2004 to promulgate rules for temporary emergency waivers of restrictions on using nurse aides who are not certified; and
- clarification of requirements relating to certified medication aides and authorization for Board of Health rules on safety of medication administration by CMAs.

Section 14 repeals an outdated provision from the Long Term Care Certificate of Need Act that provided for collection of nursing facility occupancy data by the Department of Human Services.

Recently adopted and proposed amendments to State Board of Health rules

Permanent Rule Changes adopted on February 12, 2004 and effective May 27, 2004 are the following:

Chapter 285, Lodging Establishments. The proposal amends Subchapter 3 of the present Lodging Establishment rules to clarify limitations of food service at a lodging facility.

Chapter 661, Hospice Rules. The amendments set requirements for hospice inpatient facilities.

Chapter 675, Nursing and Specialized Facilities. The proposal creates a new section in Subchapter 13, Staff Requirements, titled, "Flexible staff-scheduling."

Permanent Rule Changes adopted by the Board of Health on March 18, 2004 and projected effective July 12, 2004 are:

Chapter 205, Alarm Industry. This proposal amends or adds numerous sections, and includes fee changes and provisions for inspection and tagging of alarm and fire sprinkler systems.

Chapter 256, Food Service Establishments. The proposal's intent is to provide public protection from food borne infection by establishing prescriptive rules for operators of food service establishments and farmers' markets. This proposal modifies the rules to conform to the 1999 Food and Drug Administration Model Food Code.

Chapter 265, Hearing Aid Dealers and Fitters. This proposal clarifies exemptions, examinations, continuing education, and business name and defines hearing testing and screening, qualified waivers, 30-day refund policy, questions on client's history, medical evaluations for clients under 18, and complaint procedure.

Chapter 276, Home Inspection Industry. This proposal defines the term "client" and changes the waiting period between each home inspection license examination to 30 days.

Chapter 400, Licensed Marital and Family Therapists. This proposal amends several sections, clarifies requirements for reapplication, and provides for suspension of license based on probable cause.

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Chapter 403, Licensed Behavioral Practitioners. This proposal amends several sections, clarifies requirements for reapplication, and provides for suspension of license based on probable cause.

Chapter 405, Licensed Professional Counselors. This proposal amends several sections, clarifies requirements for reapplication, and provides for suspension of license based on probable cause.

Chapter 605, Adult Day Care; Chapter 663, Assisted Living and Continuum of Care; and Chapter 680, Residential Care Homes. The amendments require the design and construction of these centers and homes to comply with accessibility requirements specified in Chapter 11 of the International Building Code, 2003 Edition, published by the International Code Council.

Chapter 641, Emergency Medical Services. Numerous sections are added or amended. Ground and air ambulance operational standards are refined, and transfer protocols are required to be submitted for Department approval. Certain fees are amended.

Chapter 659, Health Maintenance Organizations. This proposed new rule is intended to ensure that health maintenance organizations comply with provisions that the State Commissioner of Health is charged to enforce under the Health Maintenance Organizations Act of 2003, Title 36 O.S. Section 6901 et seq.

Chapter 667, Hospital Standards. The amendments require all licensed hospitals to participate in a regional system to provide twenty four hour emergency services as a means to help ensure that minor-to-moderate trauma patients are transported to a hospital where they can receive appropriate care and that the resources of facilities classified at Level I and II for Trauma and Emergency Operative Services are preserved for the most seriously injured patients. The proposed amendments add a requirement for hospitals to report data on quality indicators.

Chapter 675, Nursing and Specialized Facilities. The proposed amendments are intended to ensure that facilities comply with the tax-related financial reporting requirements in Title 63 O.S. Section 1-1930.1.

Chapter 677, Nurse Aide Training and Certification. The proposed amendments establish fees to recover the costs of processing nurse aide certification applications for waivers, exceptions, re-testing, and interstate reciprocities. A fee is added for approval of CMA continuing education courses.
