## INTRODUCTION

This report includes psychiatric facility utilization data for the six-month period from December 2004 through May 2005. The occupancy information for this report was provided by the State Health Department, pursuant to Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes, Sections 1-880.4 and 1-880.7.

Effective November 1, 2001, the license standards in Title 43A of the Oklahoma Statutes were modified by House Bill 1107. That new law effectively removed the authority of the Department of Health and the State Board of Health to license and inspect alcohol and drug abuse treatment centers.

Consistent with HB 1107, the State Board of Health recently amended the Certificate of Need Standards for Psychiatric/Chemical Dependency Beds (Oklahoma Administrative Code, 310:635) by deleting all references to alcohol and drug abuse treatment facilities licensed under Title 43A of the Oklahoma Statutes. The rules were signed by Governor Keating on May 9, 2002, and became effective June 27, 2002.

**Therefore, this report will no longer show occupancy for these facilities.**

**The statewide occupancy rate, number of facilities, and number of beds is provided on the statewide summary page at the end of this report.**

The report consists of two parts, the first part including the following information:

- \* county in which the facility is located;
- \* name of the facility;
- \* number of licensed psychiatric youth, and adult beds at the facility;
- \* number of psychiatric days, including patient service days, and reserve days for both youth and adult;
- \* psychiatric services occupancy rate (%) at the facility for the six month period for youth, adult and the two combined;
- \* occupancy rate (%) for all services at the facility for the six month period.

The second part including:

- \* totals for the entire state, for youths, adults, and the two groups combined.

**DISCUSSION OF MISSING DATA**

The following facilities have not reported data for December 2004 through May 2005 period. Those facilities are shown in the table below. Anyone considering a Substance Abuse and/or Psychiatric project which includes these facilities in its proposed service area should contact the Certificate of Need staff for possible update.
