Kingfisher Community Collaborative, Inc. (KCC) was initially organized in 1997 and has worked to assist our schools and improve communication among the many area help agencies and organizations. The Collaborative role in the community is always evolving based on the culture and issues impacting the county. KCC has been successful in sustaining projects that have proven outcomes and recognized those that have not.

KCC has began the MAPP (Mobilizing for Action through Planning and Partnerships) process in order to have a 5 year Community Health Improvement Plan.

Currently according to the 2014 County Health Rankings, Kingfisher County ranks 1st out of 77 counties. This has not allowed KCC to slow down but to encourage us to do more to maintain this healthy status.

This year KCC and partners were instrumental in becoming a Certified Health Improvement Organization (CHIO). This gave KCC a grant opportunity from the OU Health Science Center to collaborative with primary care physicians to make preventive health care a necessary step in primary care. This \$100,000 grant will begin July 1, 2014.

This year KCC also collaborated with the Kingfisher physicians and faith based organizations to provide the Compassion Clinic to the residents of Kingfisher County and surrounding areas. This project is to provide medical care to people that are un or under insured. All costs are donated through churches, community events, or volunteerism.

KCC also recently partnered with Mercy Hospital to provide a FREE "Spring Into Fitness 5K" event. Over 100 people showed up to par-

ticipate in this event and learn more about being healthy.

Because KCC members and partners know that often money and time can be a reason for people to not take care of their own personal health, KCC has made it a mission to partner and offer programs and means of service to the community for FREE. This method has shown to be effective in that people want to be healthy at low cost.

KCC is working to build healthy communities today for a healthy Kingfisher County tomorrow.

Partnered with Mercy to provide FREE fun run/5K to Kingfisher County residents


Partnered with Law enforcement to sign SUIDI form pledges to decrease infant mortality
