Guest Speakers



Lisa Tripp is an Assistant Professor at Atlanta's John Marshall Law School. She teaches Health Care Law, Torts and Remedies. Professor Tripp practiced health care law and commercial litigation prior to joining the faculty of John Marshall Law School in 2006. As an attorney for the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) for six years, Professor Tripp focused primarily on long term care enforcement. She litigated many cases involving physical and sexual abuse, elopements, falls, neglect and substandard quality of care. Prior to her employment at HHS, Professor Tripp was an associate in the commercial litigation practice group of Smith, Gambrell & Russell, LLP in Atlanta. Professor Tripp received her law degree, with honors, from George Washington University of Law School in Washington, D.C.

Rick E. Harris received a law degree from the University of Pennsylvania in 1980. He joined the staff of the Alabama Department of Public Health in 1989, beginning as legal counsel for the Division of Licensure and Certification, and from 1998 until 2010 he served as director of the Bureau of Health Provider Standards, the state survey agency for Alabama. He is past president of the Association of Health Facility Survey Agencies (AHFSA) and represented AHFSA on a national assisted living workgroup that was formed at the request of the United States Senate Special Committee on Aging. He currently is serving as a professional subject matter expert on various consulting projects for the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS), including the Complaint Investigation and Supervisory Review project and the State Agency Director Course project.

Guest Speakers (cont'd)



Linda Mae Shell is a registered nurse with a BS and MA in nursing. Linda has been employed by Volunteers of America (VOA) for nine years. She provides oversight for the education, training and leadership development for 14 skilled nursing facilities, 10 assisted living centers, four home health agencies and three PACE programs in various parts of the United States, including Minnesota, Ohio, Arizona, Nevada, Colorado and Vermont. Linda's role within the VOA organization involves coaching, teaching, collaboration, advocacy, quality improvement and research. She has a master's degree in nursing leadership and serves as adjunct faculty at Bethel University in the RN and BSN programs. She has worked in aging services for more than twenty years and served in leadership positions in a number of local, state and national organizations.

Linda developed and teaches dementia curriculum and supports the promotion and expansion of Validation as a method of caring for elders with dementia. She has been a member of the Empira consortium for over nine years and has been involved in the falls and sleep program in the areas of research, development and training.

Linda has been a professional speaker for the last 10 years at multiple education sessions for Aging Services of Minnesota and other aging services providers. She currently coaches in the Aging Services Leadership Academy and teaches Leadership Classes for Directors of Nursing and Home Care Managers. Linda recently wrote an article and presented a webinar for Advances in Long Term Care Management on the topic of falls and root cause analysis. In November 2011, Linda facilitated a session on falls at the National Leading Age Conference.

Guest Speakers (cont'd)



Sue Ann Guildermann currently designs and produces educational seminars and conferences for Empira, a consortium of 27 skilled nursing facilities in Minnesota, a position she has held for nine years. She directs quality improvement projects based upon resource analyses, evidence based practices and data assessment and interpretation. For the last three years, Sue Ann has designed, presented and directed the education for both the management and direct-line staff of 23 skilled nursing facilities for a national and state pay-for-performance quality improvement grant. The purpose of this grant was to conduct a project to reduce resident falls in skilled nursing facilities. The outcomes from this fall reduction project were so successful, that Empira was awarded a subsequent three year government grant.

Sue Ann has over thirty-five years experience providing education, leadership and consultation to non-profit and for-profit Long Term Care organizations. Sue Ann is a Registered Nurse with a BA and MA in communication and education. Sue Ann has edited, designed and written educational and professional manuals, printed materials and videotapes. She also currently teaches at the University of Minnesota in the School of Public Health. Sue Ann is both a nationally and internationally recognized speaker. She received the 2005 Chairperson's Award from the Care Providers Association "in recognition of her outstanding leadership in educational programming."
