



About Us...

Marshall County Partners in Progress (MCPIP) is an active coalition that formed in Spring 2006 and is working towards improving the health of all communities within Marshall County.

According to the 2014 Oklahoma County Health Rankings, Marshall County is ranked 19th out of 77 counties. Proof that efforts of the coalition are working, as the ranking was decreased from 27th.

MCPIP focused their efforts on promoting the Certified Healthy Oklahoma (CHO) Program during 2013. As a result, Madill Public Schools and Kingston Public Schools were awarded Excellent status in the CHO Schools category. Also, City of Madill and City of Kingston were also awarded Certified Healthy. These certifications make each of these entities eligible to apply for Incentive Grant monies through the Oklahoma Tobacco Settlement Endowment Trust (TSET). MCPIP has utilized the Certified Healthy Oklahoma program to increase the awareness of healthy and active living and hopes it will become a catalyst in passing policies to promote healthy lifestyles and assisting with systematic

changes in business, schools and communities within the county.

The National Sand Bass Festival is a week long annual event that sees 25-40,000 people each year. MCPIP advocated for the National Sand Bass Festival to become a tobacco free event for a second year in a row. It was mentioned on all media outlets, advertising and even the emcee on the stage each night made sure to remind everyone the event was tobacco free. Also, in conjunction with the Sand Bass Festival, the MCPIP hosted a revamped Health Fair for it's second year.

This health fair touched 3 times the people it has in the past because of choice of venue and timing. Many community partners came together and were able to spread the word about healthy living

and promoted health at home.

MCPIP hosted it's first ever Community Baby Shower this year as well. There were more than 30 pregnant families in attendance. Those families were able to ask questions and concerns to one of the three doctors at the event and learned about pre and postpartum care for the infants and mothers. There were booths set up with

giveaways and each family received an infant care package.
