



About Us...

Marshall County Partners in Progress (MCPIP) is an active coalition that formed in Spring 2006 and is working towards improving the health of all communities within Marshall County.

According to the 2013 Oklahoma County Health Rankings, Marshall County is ranked 27th out of 77 counties. This puts Marshall County at healthier than more than half the counties in the state.

MCPIP focused their efforts on promoting the Certified Healthy Oklahoma (CHO) Program during 2012. As a result, Madill Public Schools was awarded Excellent status in the CHO Schools category for all campuses. Madill Public School system was also eligible to apply for the Healthy Schools Incentive Grant (HSIG) for receiving an Excellence rating at more than half their campuses. Not only did they apply for the HSIG for the first time, but the school was awarded the grant, at the highest level of \$15,000. This is a huge accomplishment for the largest school district in the county. Kingston High School was also awarded Excellent status in the CHO Schools category. In the CHO Business Category, Marshall

County Health Department was awarded merit level. And, in the CHO Restaurants category, Deep South Diner was awarded Basic certification. There were some great accomplishments in this community, and there will be many chances for improvement over the next year.

MCPIP has utilized the Certified Healthy Oklahoma program to increase the awareness of healthy and active living and hopes it will become a catalyst in passing policies to promote healthy lifestyles and assisting with systematic changes in business, schools and communities within the county.

The National Sand Bass Festival is a week long annual event that sees 25-40,000 people each year. MCPIP advocated for the National Sand Bass Festival to become a tobacco free event. And, for the first time in the festival's almost 40 year history, it became tobacco free this year. It was mentioned on all media outlets, advertising and even the emcee on the stage each night made sure to remind everyone the event was tobacco free. Also, in conjunction with the Sand

Bass Festival, the MCPIP hosted a revamped Health Fair. This health fair touched 3 times the people it has in the past because of choice of venue and timing. Many community partners came together and were able to spread the word about healthy living and promoted health at home.

The Substance Abuse Prevention and Education committee also used the National Sand Bass Festival venue to promote the new Social Host Law. A 15 second video was aired each night of the festival informing everyone of the new law and how it impacts citizens. MCPIP has received many inquiries as to how they can help educate the community on this new law.

Marshall County Partners in Progress is working towards modeling healthy lifestyle choices where they live, work, learn and play!
