

## Pat Stanislaski Bio

Currently, Pat is the Director of her own consulting firm: Partnering for Prevention, LLC. Prior to beginning her own business, she served as Administrator of the Office of Early Childhood Services at the NJ Department of Children & Families. While there, her duties include providing more than \$10 million in prevention services for the most vulnerable children - 0 to 6 years old. Prior to this position, Pat served as the Executive Director of the New Jersey Child Assault Prevention (CAP) Project for 23 years. She also served as Executive Director of the National/International Center for Assault Prevention for 12 years. Pat has conducted trainings in child abuse prevention across the United States and around the world. To date, she has trained more than 4,000 people in child abuse prevention strategies.

She is a frequent presenter at national and international conferences and is the recipient of several awards including the prestigious Commissioner's Award from the US Administration of Children, Youth and Families, awarded to one person from each state for outstanding contributions in the field of child abuse prevention. . A long time member of the International Society for Prevention of Child Abuse and Neglect (ISPCAN), she currently serves as a member of their Expert Faculty. She has served as President of the Association for Sexual Abuse Prevention (ASAP), and currently serves as a member of the National Coalition to Prevent Child Sexual Abuse and Exploitation.

# Be a Life Saver for Oklahoma Children!

In 2011, there were 8,110 confirmed cases of child abuse and neglect in Oklahoma.  
In 2009, 52 Oklahoma children died from child abuse and neglect.

EVERYONE has a role to play in keeping children safe...  
Parents, Neighbors, Grandparents, Teachers, Coaches, and all.  
However, there are times when professional services are warranted.

## Support Oklahoma's Child Abuse Prevention Programs.<sup>1</sup>

### Oklahoma State Department of Health

#### ○ Start Right Programs (Office of Child Abuse Prevention)

- ▶ During 1997-2007, 71% of the Start Right children were never named as a victim in a report to Oklahoma Department of Human Services Child Abuse Hotline. Furthermore, 90% of these Start Right children were never named in a *confirmed* case.

#### ○ Children First (Oklahoma's Nurse Family Partnership)

- ▶ A retrospective study has shown that if the general Oklahoma population of 0-2 year olds had the same rate of child abuse and neglect as Children First 0-2 year olds, 914 **fewer** children would have been confirmed maltreatment victims.<sup>2</sup>

#### ○ Child Guidance Services

- ▶ 48% of families who received Child Guidance Services reported a decrease in inappropriate social emotional behaviors. 25% of parents receiving Child Guidance Services reported a decrease in risk factors for child abuse and neglect.

### Oklahoma State Department of Education

#### ○ Oklahoma Parents as Teachers

- ▶ Children enrolled in OPAT showed a reliable gain in cognitive, language, social, and motor development. Two separate statistical analyses showed significant, positive changes in total scores and children's at-risk classification after participation in OPAT.

### Oklahoma State Department of Human Services

#### ○ SafeCare

- ▶ Statistically significant improvements in parenting skills and reductions in child abuse/neglect reports due to domestic violence in highest risk families compared to services as usual.





## Proclamation

Whereas, Oklahoma's future prosperity depends on nurturing the healthy development of almost one million children currently living, growing and learning within our many diverse communities; and

Whereas, research shows that safe and nurturing relationships and stimulating and stable environments improve brain development and child well being, while neglectful or abusive experiences and unstable or stressful environments increase the odds of poor childhood outcomes; and

Whereas, the abuse and neglect of children can cause severe, costly and lifelong problems affecting all of society, including physical and mental health problems, school failure and criminal behavior; and

Whereas, research also shows that parents and caregivers who have social networks and know how to seek help in times of trouble are more resilient and better able to provide safe environments and nurturing experiences for their children; and

Whereas, individuals, businesses, schools, and faith-based and community organizations must make children a top priority and take action to support the physical, social, emotional and educational development and competency of all children; and

Whereas, the Oklahoma Child Abuse Prevention Action Committee in partnership with the Oklahoma Interagency Child Abuse Prevention Task Force engage public and private sector agencies, early learning professionals, advocates for children and youth, and residents throughout the state in activities that increase understanding of topics related to child, family and community success; and

Whereas, during the month of April, the Oklahoma State Department of Health in collaboration with its statewide partners will be engaging individuals and communities throughout Oklahoma in a coordinated effort to prevent child abuse and neglect by promoting awareness of healthy child development, positive parenting practices and the types of support families need within their communities; and

Whereas, I encourage all citizens of Oklahoma to recognize that prevention starts with each of us;

Now, therefore, I, Mary Fallin, Governor of the State of Oklahoma, do hereby proclaim the month of April, 2012 as

**"Child Abuse Prevention Month"**

in the State of Oklahoma.

In Witness Whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Oklahoma to be affixed.
