Assessment completed by 12/31/2011 – report pending.	The Oklahoma Legislature began an assessment through a series of Town Hall Meetings September 14. The meetings began with an overview of health outcomes and the ACA, and the impact of the ACA on Medicaid. The final report from this task force is pending and will include the impacts on the insurance marketplace, health insurers, brokers, businesses, healthcare providers and private healthcare. The OSDH continues to assess the impact of the implementation of ACA on primary care, particularly the limited availability of primary care providers. Medicaid continues to assess the impact of expansion and Medicaid and associated costs as well as planning for necessary changes in the MMIS system to integrate with a health insurance exchange.

Assess the limited availability of primary care, in consideration of the expansion of health insurance coverage contemplated in the ACA, develop strategies and recommendations to provide greater access to care.	12/31/2012		Lead: OSDH	Measures: 1. Primary care availability assessment completed by 12/31/2011. 2. Strategies and recommendations provided in 2012.	The OSDH is currently conducting an analysis of the impact of expansion of insurance coverage on access given the shortage of healthcare providers in Oklahoma. Results are anticipated by in 2012. Initial analysis has focused on gathering current data on active primary providers and working with the OHCA to identify provider shortage areas for Medicaid expansion.
