


Grades 6-8

- One-sixth of middle school females and one-fifth of middle school males have ever smoked a cigar. (females: 16.1%, males: 21.3%)
- Six percent of middle school students smoked a cigar on at least one day during the past month. (females: 3.9%, males: 7.9%)
- Few middle school students have smoked cigars on at least 20 days during the past month. (females: 0.1%, males: 0.9%)
- Half of middle schools students who smoke cigars usually or always smoke flavored cigars. (females: 50.0%, males: 52.2%)

Grades 9-12

- One-third of middle school females and more than 40 percent of middle school males have ever smoked a cigar. (females: 33.5%, males: 44.9%)
- One-fifth (20.4%) of middle school males smoked a cigar on at least one day during the past month as compared to one-tenth (10.4%) of middle school females.
- Few high school students have smoked cigars on at least 20 days during the past month. (females: 0.8%, males: 1.7%)
- Almost two-thirds of middle schools students who smoke cigars usually or always smoke flavored cigars (females: 62.9%, males: 61.5%)
