Minutes

- I. Call to Order: Meeting called to order @ 10:35 AM by Chair Richie Bohach.
- II. Roll Call: Quorum present.
- III. Introductions and Announcements : None at this time

- V. Reports
 - A. Emergency Systems Report: Sean Oats introduced Jennifer Woodrow as our new EMS Administrator. Hopefully everyone meets her today she is taking pictures for the pictorial directory.

 1. Continuous Quality Improvement Sub-Committee: Heather Booher presented 5 cases to the RTAB. One good job letter, 3 waiting for response and one closed with acceptable response.
 2. Regional Planning Committee: Bob Swietek we did not have a meeting. We do have a meeting scheduled for October 23 at Comanche County Memorial Hospital Gardenway Room for 10:00 – 12:00. We will be working on Stroke and STEMI. If you are interested we would be glad to have you.
 3. Regional Medical Planning Groups / SW Medical Response Center – Bob Stewart
 - a. Surgical Extrication Team Drill approx. two weeks ago went very well Bob asked Kelley Dillon to discuss the drill. Kelley explained that it went very well and the parties involved did not know that a surgeon would be involved. They started the drill at 6 PM contacted the MERC and had a surgeon available at 6:35 PM. Surgeon was on scene at 7:10 PM and drill was tabled at 8:00PM. We still have to go back over the information but everything ran smoothly. Bob stated that they ran 2 drills this month the first one lasted 48 to 50 minutes and the second one lasted 70 minutes.

- c. RMPG this afternoon at 1:00 PM. We will have will be forming sub committees. We will have two presenters this afternoon. We will be reviewing a case study that happened in one of our facilities that I think will be very interesting to Hospitals and EMS alike.
- d. We had 4 MCI drills this quarter the first we were at 45%, second at 77%, third at 45% and fourth at 50% which means we were nowhere close to meeting our goal of 75% except for the second quarter.
- e. Had two large drills this quarter one on Fort Sill and the other in Ardmore. The biggest concern in both was no information was flowing from the scene to the MERC or hospitals. Also no EMS transport logs were ever received from either exercise.

VI. Presentation

A. Dr. Schaffer Emerging Drug of Abuse:

In his presentation Dr. Schaffer talked about synthetic cannabinoids specifically K2 and Spice because they were the two most popular drugs used. He discussed the components of the drugs. He talked about how the chemicals were attached to the material in the package and how it was distributed. He also discussed Bath Salts their components and packaging. He talked about the trademarking and that these drugs most likely would not show up on drug screen because these drugs are constantly changing. The manufacturers change one ion or component and the new drug is not illegal but they are also not tested for side effects. The last drug he spoke about was honey oil which is a derivative form Marijuana and butane that is very toxic in very small amounts.

He offered to bring this information to facilities or agencies that would like more information about these drugs. He also stated that if you have a question about a drug please call the Oklahoma Center for Poison and Drug Information.

B. Richie Bohach Surgical Extrication

Richie talked briefly about the exercise and placed a sign-up sheet out for agencies interested in this presentation. Startup of this team is expected January 1.
