

The OSIM State Health System Innovation Plan (SHSIP)

What is the State Health System Innovation Plan?

[The State Health System Innovation Plan \(SHSIP\)](#) puts forth a new healthcare model to move Oklahoma into value-based purchasing of healthcare. It is the final deliverable of the State Innovation Model (SIM) grant and is scheduled to be submitted to the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) on March 31, 2016. The SHSIP is being posted for a 30 day public comment period.

How was the SHSIP developed?

The SHSIP is the culmination of a year of stakeholder engagement and technical assistance associated with the SIM grant, which was directed by the Center for Health Innovation and Effectiveness within the Oklahoma State Department of Health. The SIM grant procured five contractors and vetted 15 deliverables through the OSIM/OHIP workgroups to help inform the development of the SHSIP. Stakeholder feedback, both one-on-one and through workgroups, ultimately guided—and will continue to guide—the SIM process and the proposed model.
