A. The changes will be made to the Bylaws and sent out to the Regional Education and Planning Committee for approval at the next meeting.





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- B. Trauma Plan changes update: It was discussed and decided that they would use the format from the trauma plan to work on the time sensitive medical conditions recommend by the committee. Some of the areas identified are as follows. Stroke, STEMI, Pediatrics, Trauma and Snake Bites. The recommended next step for the working group is to look at the region and locate where the resources for that medical condition are and educate the region on the resources they have and which are appropriate for them to use.

V. PUBLIC COMMENTS:

- A. Bob Swietek discussed that OTERAC approved working groups some of which are Education to educate physicians on the trauma systems. OTEP training should be mandatory for anyone working in an Emergency Room to include physicians.
- B. Emergency department do not prioritize patients that need to transferred or wait till they have three or four transfer and expect ambulance services to be able to move all the patients at the same time and do not realize that the services do not have the resources to accommodate multiple transfers at the same time.
- C. Do we want to get away from trauma and go to education on anything?
