The Craig County Turning Point harnesses the power of multiple sectors of the community to work together toward using various approaches for drug prevention. The partnership received the Drug Free Community Support Grant from SAMSHA/CSAP for five years to create drug prevention programs among Craig County Youth. This group will carry out activities such as town hall meetings on drug issues, youth summits, local drug use surveys, beverage server training, youth leadership training, social marketing campaigns, and policy change. The two major goals of the drug prevention programs are to reduce substance abuse, including alcohol, tobacco, and drugs among youth and to strengthen collaboration among various sectors in the community. The drug prevention programs are an important element of a balanced national drug control strategy.
