At a Glance

Knowing that access to health care is a key factor in a thriving community, Lindsay learned about Turning Point in their search for assistance establishing a Rural Primary Care Clinic. Upon learning of Turning Points broad view of Public Health, they quickly convened a broader founding group to establish the Greater Lindsay Turning Point Partnership. They immediately targeted drug and alcohol use as a community threat and set about developing a community plan to alleviate the problems. During their second month of existence they successfully competed for a grant to fund their drug and alcohol prevention program. Greater Lindsay Turing Point led by community visionary John Martin, has big plans for positioning Lindsay as a 21st Century Community. Today the original effort to establish a clinic has expanded to developing parks and recreation expansion plan and the construction of a new city jail. We will be hearing more from this Partnership.
