

Creek County Bristow Turning Point 2004

- **Activities**
 - Created a Habitat for Humanity 502c3.
 - Created Youth Council that now attends coalition meetings.
 - Bristow Schools received \$94,373 PEP grant.
 - Finished community garden at the senior site.
 - Began construction on the trail system behind the schools.
 - Opened the Free Clinic. It is located at the Health Department and is currently open one night a month.

- **Outcomes**
 - Have raised over \$40,000 and have 2 families identified for the Habitat project.
 - Youth Council has elected leadership and will be starting their plans for after school programs for at-risk kids.
 - A task force was formed to help finish the trail system and solicit more funding streams for the completion.
 - About 20 senior citizens work in the garden daily. The Master Gardener is a man living at the nursing home who has Alzheimer's. The garden has been wonderful therapy for him and many others. The food is used in preparing the meals at the senior site.
 - Plan to expand the free clinic hours to 2 nights a week and one Saturday a month. They currently are seeing 10-15 patients a night.

- **Future Plans**
 - Finalize the after school programming with the Youth Council.
 - Complete the trail system by the Wild Flower run in May.
 - Build 2 Habitat for Humanity homes in 2005.
