Love County Turning Point Partnership 2004

- **Activities**
 - Conducted nine leadership activities
 - Received \$5400 in donations to sponsor event
 - Implemented outreach program for 400 displaced workers
 - Conducted Job Fair
 - Conducted advocacy on a state and national level on receive job training funding for displaced workers
 - Conducted two day training and sign up event for displaced worker and to enroll in job training
 - Advocated for expansion of domestic violence prevention and treatment services in Love County
 - Planned monitored walking programs that use expertise from Love County Hospital
 - Provided mentor training to 18 adults

- **Outcomes**
 - Received \$200,000 in federal job training funds from a National Emergency Grant
 - 104 persons received job training interviews
 - Established Strategic Health Improvement Plan
 - Established Mentoring Program in Marietta Schools
 - 12 students received mentors and have weekly meetings with adult mentors
 - Received Sisters of Mercy, Catherine's Legacy Grant to establish Victims Advocate staff in Love County, this is a project of Love County Health Center and Sisters of Mercy
 - Conducted Class I and II of Leadership Love County
 - Established pool of 40 leaders who have completed program and stand ready to serve Love County

- **Future Plans**
 - Increase services to victims of violence
 - Decrease incidence of violence
 - Increase the number of children who engage in regular physical activity
 - Support Class III of Leadership Love County
 - Update strategic health improvement plan
