



## Q: During the past 30 days, on how many days did you smoke cigarettes on school property?

Among current smokers, high school students are more likely to smoke on school property than middle school students (MS: 22.4% vs HS:34.3%). Males are more likely than females to smoke on school property. In middle school, Hispanic and American Indian youth are more likely to smoke on school property than White youth. In high school, Hispanic youth are more likely than White or American Indian youth to smoke on school property.


Percent of current smokers who smoked on school property in last 30 days by SCHOOL GRADE




Percent of current smokers who smoked on school property last month by SCHOOL TYPE



Proportion of current smokers who smoked on school property last month by SCHOOL TYPE and GENDER




Proportion of current smokers who smoked on school property last month by RACE/ETHNICITY and SCHOOL TYPE




## Q: During the past 30 days, on how many days did you use chewing tobacco, snuff or dip on school property?

More than half of all students who currently use SLT report they use spit tobacco while on school property. Among current spit tobacco users, high school students are more likely to use SLT on school property than middle school students (MS: 54% vs HS:64%). As student grade increases, students are more likely to use SLT on school property. Rates increase from 49% in 7<sup>th</sup> grade to 76% in 12<sup>th</sup> grade.


Percent of male current SLT users who used SLT on school property in last 30 days by SCHOOL GRADE
