Course Overview: This course is designed to promote community response to and recovery from agriculture-based terrorism. The first eight modules of the course are more lecture-oriented with group activities and present the participant with information regarding federal laws and agencies pertaining to or involved with the U.S. agricultural industry. This portion also informs participants of a variety of informational resources that can assist their local preparedness and response efforts. Module 9, *Problem-Solving Scenario*, is intended to provide small- and large-group interaction where participants will be able to address current processes and procedures that would come in to play in the event of an agroterrorism attack.
