**Course Overview:** Only with a robust incident management infrastructure can United States communities hope to prevent, deter, prepare for, or respond to a weapon of mass destruction (WMD) terrorist incident. Whether such a threat involves conventional or non-conventional WMD, successful prevention and deterrence depends upon law enforcement personnel who are adequately trained, equipped, and exercised. As these threats have increased and evolved, the U.S. government has expanded its support of initiatives to prepare federal, state, and local first responders, including law enforcement personnel, to prevent and deter terrorist incidents involving weapons of mass destruction, which may include chemical agents, biological agents, radiological or nuclear materials, or explosives.

**Prerequisites:** Must be sworn members of a federal, state, county/parish, or municipal law enforcement agency currently assigned and functioning as patrol officers or line supervisors
