Tactical Planning for WMD Incidents (MGT-321)

Tulsa, OK

April 3-5, 2012

Course Overview: This course is designed to provide sworn state, local, and tribal law enforcement tactical commanders, their deputies, tactical supervisors, tactical team leaders, and assorted law enforcement command staff with the necessary knowledge, skills, and abilities to effectively plan and command tactical missions for incidents involving WMD and/or hazardous materials. The course consists of eleven modules taught through classroom sessions and comprehensive practical exercises.

Participant Audience: Emergency Medical Services, Emergency Management Agency, Fire Service, Governmental Administrative, Hazardous Materials Personnel, Law Enforcement, Public Health; Tactical commanders control the response of law enforcement tactical teams to incidents where the release of WMD agents has occurred or is likely to occur because of terrorist actions. These commanders may have to assume a more aggressive role than is typical during a more conventional incident. Their mission planning may require them to order tactical teams to enter hazardous environments to arrest terrorists, affect the rescue of hostages, and/or prevent the release of a WMD.

Prerequisites: Completion of a WMD Awareness-level training course and completion of a training program in basic tactical operations
