Course Overview:

This course offers participants insight into, and practical experience with, emergency management and decision-making skills necessary to effectively manage an EOC and the overall response to a large-scale Type III or Type II and Weapons of Mass Destruction (WMD)/terrorism incident or all-hazards event utilizing the MACS. The EOC course is 24 hours in length, with decision-based exercises comprising eight of the 24 hours. This course will develop and reinforce emergency management, situational awareness, information management and decision-making skills for course participants. The course adapts existing emergency management procedures to the unique requirements of EOC operations.

Prerequisites:

Participants must be actively employed, or tasked to work in an EOC. It is also expected that participants will have at least an intermediate level of understanding of ICS and some experience in incident management. IS-701 and IS-775 are recommended.

Disciplines include the following: Fire Service, Emergency Medical Services, Hazardous Materials, Law Enforcement, Public Health, Public Works, Emergency Management, Government Administrative, Non-governmental Organizations, Private Sector and Military.
