



ICS Structure

# Mission Statement

**To provide qualified All-Hazards Incident Management Teams for the State of Oklahoma and its political subdivisions capable of supporting and assisting in the management of natural and manmade emergencies and disasters and acts of terrorism.**

# Definition of Program

**To provide guidelines and direction for the development, operation, and maintenance of Type 3 and Type 4 AHIMTs based on National Incident Management System (NIMS) standards.**

# Background

- **Assist any jurisdiction confronted with an incident beyond its capabilities in either scope or duration.**
- **Provide robust management framework to support the jurisdiction in bringing an incident to conclusion**
- **Planning, documentation, and logistical support**
- **Public information and notification support**
- **Operational support and expertise**
- **Assistance in development of Site Safety Plans, etc.**
- **Assist in development of IAP**

# IT'S ALL ABOUT SUPPORT

- Not deployed to “take over” the management of the incident from the local jurisdiction.
- The AHIMT’s role will ALWAYS be defined by the local Authority Having Jurisdiction (AHJ).
- May provide a support role for the local ICS structure.
- In the event the AHJ requests the AHIMT to manage the incident they will provide a Delegation of Authority to the AHIMT and if appropriate Unified Command will be utilized.

# A Type 3 AHIMT is:

- A multi-agency/multi-jurisdiction team for extended incidents.
- Formed and managed at the State or regional level.
- Deployed as a team of 8-12\* qualified personnel to manage major and/or complex incidents.
- Flood, tornado, multi-day hostage/standoff, terrorist incident, and other natural/manmade disasters.

# Type 4 Team

- **A single and/or multi-agency team for expanded incidents typically formed and managed at the town, city, or county level.**
- **Consists of 5-8 \* trained personnel.**
- **Major structure fire, MCI, armed robbery, HazMat, planned event, or other incidents requiring expanded incident organization.**
- **Manage expanded complex incidents prior to arrival of and transition to a Type 3 AHIMT.**

# Administration

- **The Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security will serve as the lead agency for AHIMTs**
- **Provide direction of the AHIMTs following the guidance and recommendations of Oversight Committee.**
- **A host agency responsible for managing administrative and logistical needs.**
- **Host agency will provide a Team Leader and Asst. Team Leader to serve as a program manager.**

# Staffing

- **Broad cross section of jurisdictions and disciplines.**
- **Law enforcement, fire, EMS, public works, Emergency Management, Public Health, and others.**
- **Selection will be made through recommendation of the AHIMT Oversight Committee based on NIMS-ICS knowledge, experience, and training.**

# Training

- **Pre-requisite training requirements: NIMS-ICS 100, 200, 300, 400, 700, 800**
- **Once a candidate has attained membership on a team he/she will be required to complete the following training:**
  - **Command and General Staff Functions for Local IMT (40 hours).**
  - **Position specific training (16 to 40 hours).**
  - **Annual continued education (16 hours per year).**
