Sewer Hook-Up Temporary Exemption Information

What do I need to do to be considered for an exemption?

You must complete the “Sewer Hook-Up Temporary Exemption Application” and return it to the City Clerk. First time applicants will need to submit the application to the City Clerk no later than the 20th of the month to be considered by the City Council the following month.

If you have been granted an exemption and want to renew the exemption, you must submit a new completed application to the City Clerk no later than two (2) months prior to the date your current exemption expires.

All applications, new and renewals, must be accompanied by a certification showing the system is function properly and constitutes no present health hazard. The certification must be given by a third-party approved by the City of Nicoma Park (i.e. licensed plumber that installs septic systems or the City-County Health Department).

All applications, new and renewal, must be accompanied by a report showing there are no contaminates in any well providing service to any residence on the property.

How much will I be charged?

The current User Fee will be the minimum Residential Rate per month. This amount is subject to change on future exemptions.

What other paperwork will I need to complete?

Once the exemption is approved by the City Council, you will be required to complete a Sewer Contract. This contract will be used for information needed to set up your sewer account. It will be noted on the contract that this is currently an exemption to hook-up.

Nicoma Park City Code - Section 90-40(b):

As an exception to subsection (a) of this section, all users described in subsection (a) of this section may apply to the City for payment of a User’s Fee, in lieu of hook-up to the public sanitary sewer. The amount of the User’s Fee to be the same amount as would be required if hooked up to the public sewer; provided, however, that said application must be accompanied by a certification that the system is functioning properly and constitutes no present health hazard. The certification must be given by a third-party approved by the City of Nicoma Park (i.e. licensed plumber that installs septic systems) or the City County Health Department. The applicant must also include a report showing that there are no contaminants in any well providing service to a residence located on applicant’s property. The City may consider reports for wells from properties abutting applicant’s property. The application must be filed with the City Clerk, and then placed on an agenda before the City Council for final action. Any exceptions granted to subsection (a) of this section shall be for a period of one-year and shall be reviewed annually.
