Roberta Scott was raised in Tulsa, OK. On March 6, 1964, during her senior year at OSU, Roberta's left leg was amputated at the hip due to osteogenic sarcoma cancer. Having only one leg didn't stop Roberta. It was the beginning of an extraordinary life for a young woman on crutches. From 1965 – 1967 Roberta travelled throughout the United States and abroad speaking on behalf of amputees. In 1979 she returned to Tulsa where she became active in supporting services for women and minorities. During the years, Roberta has received many awards and honors for her service to others. Her distinguished career in education as the Public Information Officer of Indian Capital Technology Center ended when she retired on January 31, 2012 after 24 years of service. She was honored the following July, by being selected as a legend on the Legend Panel during the 2012 Women's Leadership Conference in Muskogee, Oklahoma. Today, Roberta continues to be a strong supporter of programs and services for Oklahoma women and minorities, and encouraging them to enter nontraditional careers.
