


ODMHSAS Funded Treatment

- In FY09, there were 3,318 admitted consumers served for methamphetamine. In FY10, there were 3,242 admitted consumers. Overall, there has been a 32% increase in methamphetamine use between 2001 and 2010.
- Between FY2001 and FY2006, when the use of methamphetamine use peaked, there was a 59.6% increase. Since that time, meth use has shown a slight, but consistent, yearly decrease. In comparing FY2010 to FY2006, meth use has decreased 17.3%.
- In FY2010, of the 3,242 consumers served for methamphetamine use, 51.4% were female.
- Nearly 84% of admitted consumers served for methamphetamine use in FY2010 were white, 9.9% were American Indian, 3.9% were multi-race, and 1.6% was black.
- Of the Oklahomans who sought treatment for meth in FY10, 39% started using between the ages of 18 and 25, and 33% began using between age 14 and 17.
- Of females treated for meth, 38% started using between age 18 and 25 and 33% began using between age 14 and 17.



Youth Risk Behavior Survey

- According to Youth Risk Behavior Survey (YRBS) data from 2009, 4.8% of Oklahoma high school students surveyed have used methamphetamine in their lifetime, compared to 4.1% nationally.
- Of all twelfth graders surveyed, 6.7% have used methamphetamine, compared to 4.1% nationally.
- Of all females surveyed in Oklahoma, 4.0% had used meth, compared to 3.3% nationally.
