



Oklahoma Systems of Care

Oklahoma Systems of Care (OSOC) is a coordinated network of community-based services and supports that are organized to meet the challenges of children and youth with serious mental health needs and their families.

The Systems of Care National Evaluation is designed to demonstrate program effectiveness. This evaluation examines how child clinical and functional status and family life change over time.

The University of Oklahoma E-TEAM is the evaluator for Oklahoma Systems of Care. E-TEAM designs research and evaluations to help organizations understand and use information and data to solve real-world problems.

As part of the Systems of Care National Evaluation, local sites will collect information such as:

- Enrollment information
- Demographic information
- Ohio Scales assessment information
- School IEPs
- School-related services

As part of the National Evaluation, E-TEAM Evaluators will collect the following information:

- Demographic information
- Diagnostic information
- Enrollment information
- Risk factors
- Family composition
- Physical custody of the child
- Child's mental and physical health service use
- Caregiver employment status
- Attitudes about coercion in receiving services
- Child's presenting problem(s)
- Standardized measure of children's symptomatology
- Interpersonal relations
- Broad psychopathological domains
- Functioning in job or schoolwork
- Use of leisure time
- Importance of culture in the lives of the respondent
- Caregiver's perspective on provider's consideration of family's beliefs, traditions, and practices when providing services
- Protective factors
- Initiative
- Self-regulation
- Attachment/relationships
- Self-control
- Strengths
- Emotion regulation
- School readiness
- Language and attention skills
- Social confidence
