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The Center for Therapeutic Interventions

- Comprehensive Outpatient Counseling Agency-Tulsa
- Recently became Comprehensive Community Addiction Recovery Center (CCARC)-Added a medical team
- Nearly all clinicians are dually licensed to treat MH/SA
- Focused on Family Unit and issues & providing counseling to all members individually
- IOP programs for Men, Women, adolescent males and adolescent females
- Treat all ages and all therapeutic issues
- Work with Felony Drug Court and Family Drug Court

Family Drug Court

- A Specialty Court serving families struggling with a substance abuse issue that have an open case with DHS-CW.
- Strengths Based with extensive “wraparound” services
- High need very intense cases
- Team approach

About the Grant

- Children Affected by Methamphetamine (CAM)
- CTI requested to participate from ODMHSAS
- SAMSHA & Children and Family Futures overseeing
- Extremely focused on trauma treatment
- Consumers must be participating in FDC in some capacity

Purpose of the Grant

- Improve permanency
- Enhance safety, and
- Increase well being of the TCFDC's participants, their children, and caregivers through the use of clinical interventions

The Clinical Interventions

- Comprehensive Assessment and service linkage- for both children and adults that include six key domains
- Development
- Education
- Primary healthcare
- Mental health
- Familial substance abuse screening
- Comprehensive trauma assessment and treatment

The Clinical Interventions

- Parent, child, and family skills training and education
- Strengthening Families Program & Celebrating Families Program
- Both are designed to increase child, adult, and family functioning, increase the likelihood of timely reunification with birth families, and decrease the likelihood of maltreatment recurrence; and to increase the capacity of the community through the implementation of a multiyear community-wide education initiative about substance abuse, child welfare, and trauma-informed interventions.

The Clinical Interventions

- The establishment of a training agenda for community-wide capacity building-DMH
- CTI is being advanced trained in TF-CBT and all clinical staff receive
 - 40 hours of workshop trainings
 - ongoing consultation from national trainers
 - 2 hours per month of supervision calls for 1 year
 - Advanced training on treatment modalities & assessments
 - Beyond Trauma
 - Seeking Safety

Strengthening Families Program & Celebrating Families

- 26 week interactive parenting program-
- 14 weeks of SFP & 12 weeks of CFP
- 1 night per week 2.5 hours-
 - serve a 30 min meal for families
 - 1 hour of group (children are separate from parents)
 - 1 hour family groups
 - Treatment is provided for under 3 yrs of age
 - We have a graduation after completion of SFP and a final graduation after CFP

Honors in the first year

- CTI is one of 11 agencies nationwide participating in this grant
- CTI is the only agency in the nation implementing both SFP & CFP together as a program
- CTI is working closely with SAMSHA, SFP & CFP developers, Children and Family Futures, Kansas University in data collections, and DMH
- CTI assisting in the development of infant SFP curriculum- 1st to be trained

More First Year Feedback

- Very high number of Fathers participating either single dads or co-parenting dads
- Significant number of “other” primary caretakers involved in treatment
- Despite the disproportional numbers of homelessness many families are successfully reunited
- Relational Focus

Touching Moments

- “C” and his red rain boots
- “D's & H's” sisters progress
- “S”'s progress- success after failure
- “R” continuing despite work conflicts
- “D and mom” development and specialized services
- “J” finally stopped crying
- Transition, stability & security
