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
OKLAHOMA BUSINESS EMPLOYMENT DYNAMICS: 1st Quarter 2016

Gross Job Gains and Gross Job Losses: 1st Quarter 2016

From December 2015 to March 2016, gross job gains in Oklahoma totaled 72,627, while gross job losses numbered 80,611, according to the Oklahoma Employment Security Commission, Economic Research and Analysis Division, and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, (see Chart 1, below and Table 1, page 7). Gross job losses exceeded gross job gains by 7,984, marking the fifth consecutive quarter of negative net change. During the previous quarter, gross job losses exceeded gross job gains by 2,106.

March 2006 - March 2016, seasonally adjusted





The change in the number of jobs over time is the net result of increases and decreases in employment that occur at all businesses in the economy. Business Employment Dynamics (BED) statistics track these changes in employment at private business establishments from the third month of one quarter to the third month of the next. *Gross job gains* are the sum of increases in employment from expansions at existing establishments and the addition of new jobs at opening establishments. *Gross job losses* are the result of contractions in employment at existing establishments and the loss of jobs at closing establishments. The difference between the number of gross job gains and the number of gross job losses is the net change in employment, (see Technical Note, p. 7, for more information).

The number of gross job gains in Oklahoma declined by 7,227 from December 2015 to March 2016, (see Chart 1, above and Table 1, page 7). Gross job losses also declined from the previous quarter by 1,349 for the three months ended March 2016. In the past ten years, gross job losses in the state peaked in 1st quarter 2009, at the end of the ‘Great Recession’, when 101,545 jobs were lost.

Gross Job Gains and Losses: Openings vs. Closings and Expansions vs. Contractions

Contracting establishments in Oklahoma lost 67,178 jobs in the 1st quarter of 2016. This number represents 1,368 more jobs lost from the previous quarter. Expanding establishments gained 58,279 jobs, a decline of 5,838 jobs compared to the 4th quarter of 2015, (see Chart 2, above).


Closing establishments lost 13,433 jobs from December 2015 to March 2016. This represents 2,717 fewer jobs lost than the prior quarter. Opening establishments gained 14,348 jobs during the 1st quarter of 2016. This represents 1,389 fewer new jobs from private sector establishment openings than in 4th quarter 2015.

In Oklahoma, the number of private sector establishment births, (a subset of the openings data), decreased by 99 to 2,247 in the 1st quarter of 2016. These new establishments accounted for 9,323 jobs or 689 fewer jobs than the previous quarter, (see Chart 3, next page).

Data for establishment deaths, (a subset of the closings data), are now available through the 2nd quarter of 2015. From March 2015 to June 2015, 9,058 jobs were lost at 2,545 private sector establishments in Oklahoma. In the prior quarter, 7,315 jobs were lost at 2,338 private sector establishments.

Gross Job Gains and Gross Job Losses: Percent of Total Private Sector Employment

Gross job gains represented 5.7 percent of total private sector employment in Oklahoma for the quarter ending in March 2016 with expansions accounting for 4.6 percent of total private sector employment and openings contributing 1.1 percent. Nationally, gross job gains accounted for 5.8 percent of private employment in the 1st quarter of 2016. With few exceptions, Oklahoma's rates of gross job gains have generally tracked with the U.S. rates, (See Chart 4, page 5).

In the 1st quarter of 2016, Oklahoma's rate of gross job losses as a percent of total private sector employment was 6.4 percent, with contractions accounting for 5.3 percent and closings adding another 1.1 percent. That was higher than the national rate of 5.7 percent. Although the rate of gross job losses in Oklahoma mirrored the national rate from 1st quarter 2010 to 2nd quarter 2013, from the 3rd quarter 2013 forward it has shown more volatility and appears almost counter-cyclical to the national trend, (See Chart 5, page 5).

March 2006 - March 2016, seasonally adjusted




March 2006 - March 2016, seasonally adjusted




Gross Job Gains and Gross Job Losses by Industry: 1st Quarter 2016

During the 1st quarter of 2016, gross job losses exceeded gross job gains in 8 of the 11 reported industry sectors in Oklahoma. Transportation and warehousing saw the largest negative net change in jobs as gross job losses exceeded gross job gains by 2,211 jobs. While 2,074 jobs were created at opening and expanding transportation and warehousing establishments, 4,285 jobs were lost at closing and contracting establishments for the three months ending in March 2016. Manufacturing closely followed as a gain of 3,749 jobs at opening and expanding establishments was offset by the loss of 5,955 jobs at closing and contracting establishments, resulting in a net job loss of 2,206 jobs. Professional and business services also saw a large negative change in jobs as gross job losses exceeded gross job gains by 1,930.

Retail trade had the largest positive net change in jobs in the 1st quarter of 2016, as gross job gains exceeded gross job losses by 1,365 jobs. Opening and expanding retail trade establishments gained 12,021 jobs while contracting and closing establishments lost 10,656 jobs in the 1st quarter of 2016. Education and health services followed with a net gain of 952 jobs. Leisure and hospitality had a net job gain of 581 for the quarter ending March 2016. (See Chart 6 below and Table 5, pages 13-16).

Technical Note

Concepts and Methodology

The Business Employment Dynamics (BED) data are a product of a federal-state cooperative program known as Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW), or the ES-202 program. The BED data are compiled from existing quarterly QCEW records. The QCEW reports are sent by the State

Employment Security Agencies (SESAs) to BLS and form the basis of the Bureau's QCEW program and establishment universe sampling frame. These reports are also used to produce the QCEW data on total employment and wages. Other important Bureau uses of the QCEW reports are in the Current Employment Statistics (CES) program. The CES program produces monthly estimates of employment, net changes, and earnings by detailed industry.

In the BED program, the QCEW records are linked across quarters to provide a longitudinal history for each establishment. The linkage process allows the tracking of net employment changes at the establishment level, which in turn allows the estimation of jobs gained at opening and expanding establishments and jobs lost at closing and contracting establishments.

The change in the number of jobs over time is the net result of increases and decreases in employment that occur at all businesses in the economy. BED statistics track these changes in employment at private business establishments from the third month of one quarter to the third month of the next. Gross job gains are the sum of increases in employment from expansions at existing establishments and the addition of new jobs at opening establishments. Gross job losses are the result of contractions in employment at existing establishments and the loss of jobs at closing establishments. The difference between the number of gross jobs gained and the number of gross jobs lost is the net change in employment.

Gross job gains and gross job losses are expressed as rates by dividing their levels by the average of employment in the current and previous quarters. The rates are calculated for the components of gross job gains and gross job losses and then summed to form their respective totals. These rates can be added and subtracted just as their levels can. For instance, the difference between the gross job gains rate and the gross job losses rate is the net growth rate.

The formal definitions of employment changes are as follows:

Openings: These are either establishments with positive third month employment for the first time in the current quarter, with no links to the prior quarter, or with positive third month employment in the current quarter following zero employment in the previous quarter.

Expansions: These are establishments with positive employment in the third month in both the previous and current quarters, with a net increase in employment over this period.

Closings: These are either establishments with positive third month employment in the previous quarter, with no employment or zero employment reported in the current quarter.

Contractions: These are establishments with positive employment in the third month in both the previous and current quarters, with a net decrease in employment over this period.
