## OKLAHOMA EMPLOYMENT REPORT – November 2017 Metropolitan statistical area (MSA), county and other subarea information

### Unemployment rates improve over the year for most Oklahoma counties in November

In November, **McIntosh County** posted Oklahoma's highest county unemployment rate of 7.0 percent. **Latimer County** had the second highest rate for the month, while **Okmulgee County** reported the state's third highest rate. **Cimarron, Grant and Harper Counties** claimed the lowest county unemployment rate of 2.0 percent. Unemployment rates were lower than a year earlier in 76 of 77 counties and unchanged in one county.




