## OKLAHOMA EMPLOYMENT REPORT – February 2019

Metropolitan statistical area (MSA), county and other subarea information

### Unemployment rates down over the year for most counties in Oklahoma in February

In February, **Latimer County** posted Oklahoma's highest county unemployment rate of 6.5 percent. **McIntosh County** had the second highest rate for the month, while **McCurtain County** had the state's third highest rate. **Cimarron County** claimed the lowest county unemployment rate of 1.8 percent. Unemployment rates in February were lower than a year earlier in 73 counties, higher in three counties and unchanged in one county.

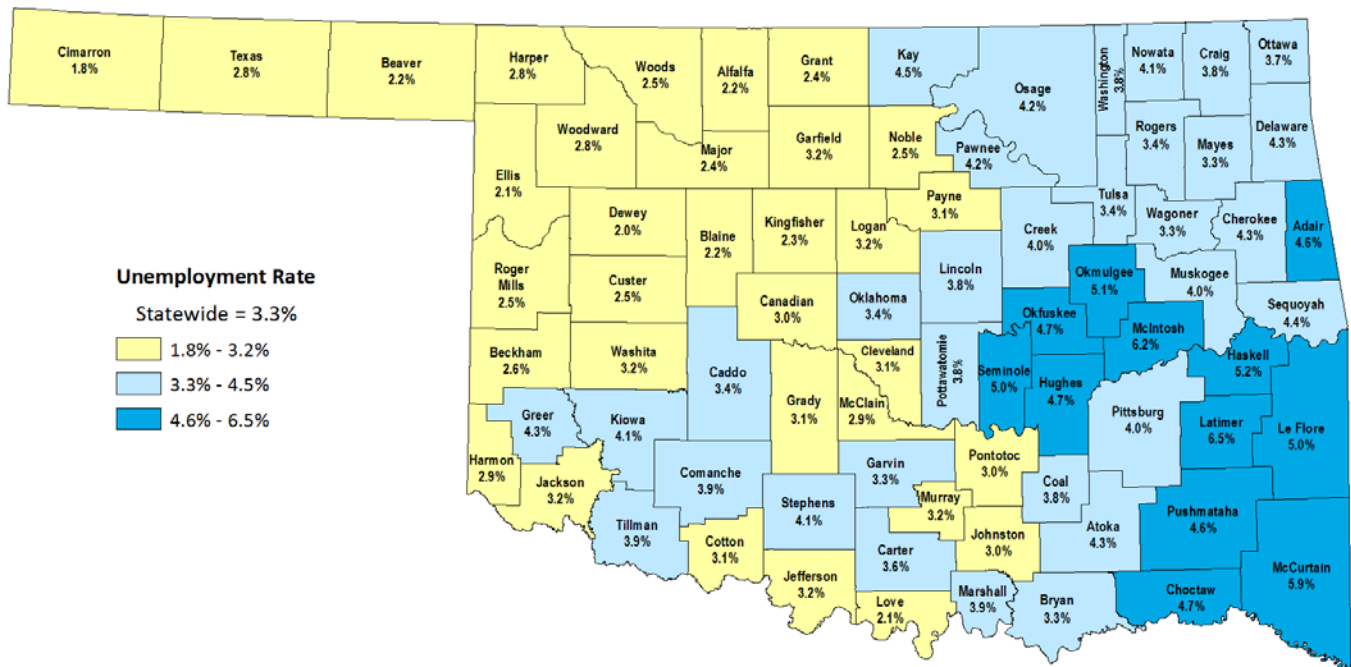

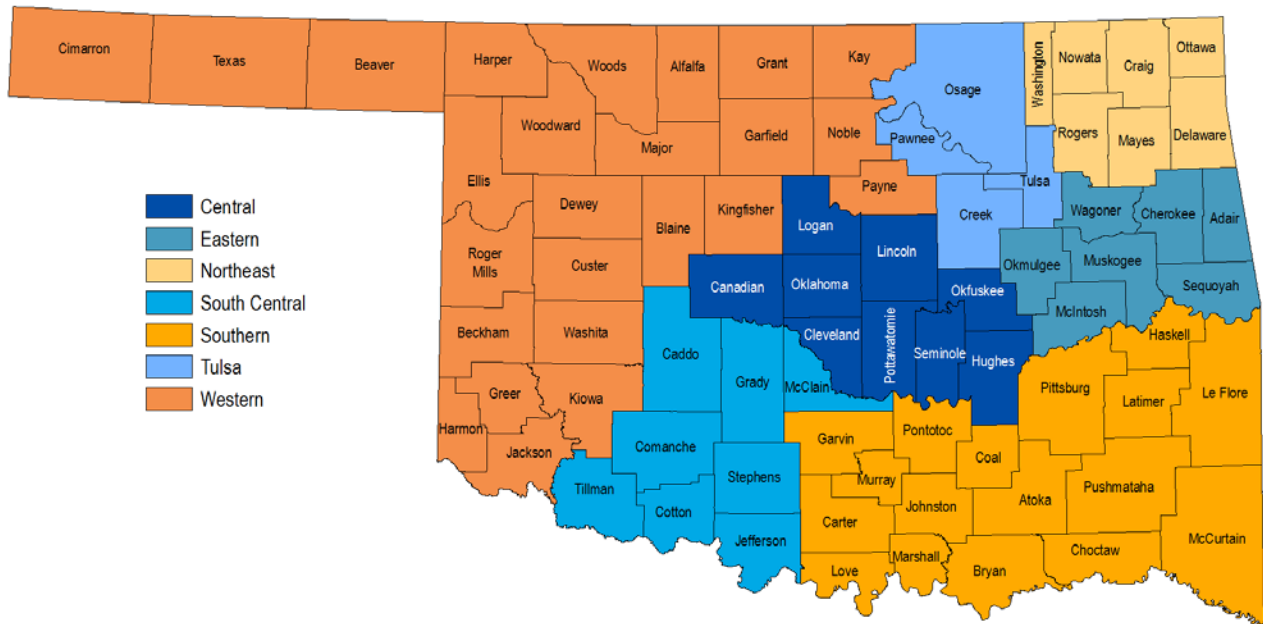
