## OKLAHOMA EMPLOYMENT REPORT – April 2017 Metropolitan statistical area (MSA) and county information

### Unemployment rates improve over the year for most of Oklahoma counties in April

In April, **McIntosh County** posted Oklahoma's highest county unemployment rate of 7.5 percent. **Latimer County** had the second highest rate for the month, while **Stephens County** reported the state's third highest rate. **Cimarron County** claimed the lowest county unemployment rate of 1.9 percent. Unemployment rates were lower than a year earlier in 75 of 77 counties and higher in two counties.


