SUBJECT: Income Eligibility for SCSEP

Message: The Department of Human Services recently published updated Federal Poverty Income Guidelines that form the basis for determining income eligibility of SCSEP applicants and enrollees. The Department of Labor has established income eligibility at 125 percent of Federal Poverty Income and designates the modified figure to meet the “low income” requirement defined at Section 641.500 of the 2004 Senior Community Service Employment Program Final Rule. The poverty and “low income” guidelines are also applicable to eligibility determinations made for Older Americans Act Section 502 (e) projects. See [TEGL 21-04](#).

Action: Grantees must use the following low-income guidelines when making SCSEP participant eligibility determinations. The figures are effective from the date they were published in the Federal Register, which was February 18, 2005.

2005 Poverty and SCSEP Low-Income Guidelines for the 48 Contiguous States and DC

For family units with more than 8 members, add \$3,260.00 for each additional member and for 125 percent add \$4,075.
