



❖ **Featured Speaker: Ms. Abby Cooper**

Ms. Cooper designed and implemented the first community-based supported employment program in Washington State. She designed and implemented training for parents and teachers of transition age students focusing on obtaining employment. As administrator of the Washington State Division of Vocational Rehabilitation (DVR), she managed the Business Relations Team working with public and private employers, managed independent living services, developed and managed the Division's systems, training criteria, and infrastructure for Ticket to Work.

❖ **Featured Speaker: Col. Katherine Scheirman**

Col. Katherine Scheirman, USAF (Ret.), MD, MHA, FACPE, spent more than 20 years in the U.S. Air Force. Dr. Scheirman coordinated the military medical response to the bombing of the Oklahoma City Murrah Federal Building. During her Air Force career, she developed first-hand experience with health-care systems in the U.S., Japan, the U.K., and many other NATO countries. Since she retired in 2006, Dr. Scheirman has been an advocate for veterans, active military members and their families, and for health-care reform.

❖ **Featured Speaker: Charles D. (Chuck) Mills**

Charles D. (Chuck) Mills is the third generation President of Mills Machine Company (est. 1908) an international custom manufacturer of Earth Drilling Tools, Bits and Related Accessories. Mr. Mills is involved with the East Central Workforce Investment Board, Shawnee Chamber of Commerce, Mayor's Advisory Committee, Governor's Council for Workforce and Economic Development, OK Workforce Youth Council and many others.

Chuck has received the Governors Small Business Person of the Year in 2011, OK Mayor of the Year in 2008 as well as many other awards.

❖ **Featured Speaker: Steven Shepelwich**

Steven C. Shepelwich is a Senior Community Development Advisor at the Federal Reserve Bank of Kansas City, Oklahoma City Branch. Mr. Shepelwich leads the branch efforts to promote economic development, and fair and impartial access to financial services in Oklahoma's low- to moderate-income communities. Prior to joining the Federal Reserve Bank, he worked with national organizations focused on expanding the roles of financial institutions in low-income communities.
