The data in this publication reflects the most current U.S. Census data and pertinent Oklahoma labor force information needed to formulate affirmative action programs for the nation, state, metropolitan statistical areas (MSAs) and all 77 Oklahoma counties. Detailed Equal Employment Opportunity reports for occupations of civilian labor force by minority status/gender are available upon request for the nation, state, MSAs and counties. This publication is printed and issued by the Oklahoma Employment Security Commission (OESC) as authorized by the Oklahoma Employment Security Act and paid through federal funds granted to the OESC by the U.S. Department of Labor.

The information contained herein utilizes data from the 2000 Census as well as the 2006 Census population estimates. Data were obtained from the U. S. Census Bureau. The reports furnished in this document were prepared in accordance with the procedural requirements of the Office of Federal Contract Compliance Programs (OFCCP) within the Employment Standards Administration of the U. S. Department of Labor (41 CFR 60-2). LABOR FORCE DATA STATISTICS AND TABLE DESCRIPTIONS

This publication format presents pertinent statistical data to enable employers to adhere to the requirements of federal and state legislation regarding affirmative action programs. .

Tables 3 and 4 contain year 2000 data from the U.S Census Bureau's Decennial Census and will remain current until the U.S. Census Bureau obtains and releases the Census information for 2010.

The statistical information reflected within Tables 1 utilizes the accepted and required data analyses as established by the Office of Federal Contract Compliance Programs, U.S. Department of Labor and the Oklahoma Employment Security Commission. To further assist employers in the formulation of their affirmative action programs, the information is arranged in accordance with the criteria developed for employers in designing Affirmative Action Programs as suggested by the Office of Federal Contract Compliance Programs of the U.S. Department of Labor (41 CFR 60-2.10).

41 CFR 60-2.10 - GENERAL PURPOSE AND CONTENTS OF AFFIRMATIVE ACTION PROGRAMS

(a) Purpose. (1) An affirmative action program is a management tool designed to ensure equal employment opportunity. A central premise underlying affirmative action is that, absent discrimination, over time a contractor's workforce, generally, will reflect the gender, racial and ethnic profile of the labor pools from which the contractor recruits and selects. Affirmative action programs contain a diagnostic component which includes a number of quantitative analyses designed to evaluate the composition of the workforce of the contractor and compare it to the composition of the relevant labor pools. Affirmative action programs also include action-oriented programs. If women and minorities are not being employed at a rate to be expected given their availability in the relevant labor pool, the contractor's affirmative action program includes specific practical steps designed to address this underutilization. Effective affirmative action programs also include internal auditing and reporting systems as a means of measuring the contractor's progress toward achieving the workforce that would be expected in the absence of discrimination.

(2) An affirmative action program also ensures equal employment opportunity by institutionalizing the contractor's commitment to equality in every aspect of the employment process. Therefore, as part of its affirmative action program, a contractor monitors and examines its employment decisions and compensation systems to evaluate the impact of those systems on women and minorities.

(3) An affirmative action program is, thus, more than a paperwork exercise. An affirmative action program includes those policies, practices, and procedures that the contractor implements to ensure that all qualified applicants and employees are receiving an equal opportunity for recruitment, selection, advancement, and every other term and privilege associated with employment. Affirmative action, ideally, is a part of the way the contractor regularly conducts its business. OFCCP has found that when an affirmative action program is approached from this perspective, as a powerful management tool, there is a positive correlation between the presence of affirmative action and the absence of discrimination.

(b) Contents of affirmative action programs. (1) An affirmative action program must include the following quantitative analyses:

- (i) Organizational profile--Sec. 60-2.11;
- (ii) Job group analysis--Sec. 60-2.12;
- (iii) Placement of incumbents in job groups--Sec. 60-2.13;
- (iv) Determining availability--Sec. 60-2.14;
- (v) Comparing incumbency to availability--Sec. 60-2.15; and

(vi) Placement goals--Sec. 60-2.16.

(2) In addition, an affirmative action program must include the following components specified in the Sec. 60-2.17 of this part:

(i) Designation of responsibility for implementation;

(ii) Identification of problem areas;

(iii) Action-oriented programs; and

(iv) Periodic internal audits.

(c) Documentation. Contractors must maintain and make available to OFCCP documentation of their compliance with Secs. 60-2.11 through 60-2.17.

CHANGES TO THE AFFIRMATIVE ACTION PROGRAMS

The U.S. Department of Labor has issued regulations, effective December 13, 2000, addressing affirmative action requirements for federal contractors and subcontractors (broadly referred to hereafter as "contractors") under Executive Order 11246. The new regulations include several significant changes that will directly affect a covered employer's affirmative action plans. Employers are not required to make any changes to their existing affirmative action plans.

Eight Factor Analysis Scaled Down to Two Factors The "eight factor availability analysis," often criticized as complicated and largely meaningless, has been reduced to a two factor analysis - external availability and internal availability. (1) External availability is the percentage of minorities or women with requisite skills in the reasonable recruitment area. The reasonable recruitment area is defined as the geographical area from which the contractor usually seeks or reasonably could seek workers to fill the positions in question. (2) Internal availability is the percentage of minorities or women among those promotable, transferable, and trainable within the contractor's organization.

The contractor must separately determine the availability of minorities and women for each job group.

Some employers may choose to continue using an eight factor availability analysis.

Contractor Training

Factor 8: The degree of training the contractor is reasonably able to undertake as a means of making all job classes available to minorities is determined by the number of jobs in which training occurs AFTER employment and determining the percentage equal to that of minorities in the relevant labor force market area. This factor may sometimes be the same as Factor 6.

Eight Factor Analysis For Females:

Factor 1: The size of the female unemployment force in the labor area surrounding the facility is contained in Table 3.

Factor 2: The percentage of the female work force as compared with the total work force in the immediate labor area is contained in Table 3.

Factor 3: The general availability of women having the requisite skills in the immediate labor area is contained in Tables 2, 4 and 5.

NOTE: The area applicants registered with the local OESC Employment Service Offices as of June 30, 2006, are listed by O*NET Codes for the local area in Table 2. Tables 4 and 5 contain 2000 Census information of the civilian labor force.

Factor 4: The availability of women having the requisite skills the contractor can reasonably recruit is contained in Tables 2, 4 and 5.

NOTE: If the recruitment area is local, this is the same as Factor 3. For recruitment in another state, contact the U.S. Department of Labor.

Factor 5: The availability of women seeking employment in the labor or recruitment area of the contractor is contained in Table 2. For nationwide recruitment or recruitment in another state, please contact the U.S. Department of Labor.

Factor 6: The availability of promotable and transferable females within the contractor's organization comes from the contractor's (employer's) personnel files. The past hiring patterns of the organization reflect the availability of females on the contractor's payroll who have the requisite skills for the job group being analyzed.

Factor 7: The existence of training institutions capable of training persons in the requisite skills is reflected by the percentage of females enrolled in educational and training institutions serving the contractor's recruitment needs. If recruiting is done from a training institution, you may contact the educational institution and request the number of females graduating in a particular program or field of study from which you recruit.

Contractor Training

SOURCES OF INFORMATION REGARDING AFFIRMATIVE ACTION

FEDERAL LAWS AND REGULATIONS

Executive Order 11246, as amended

The equal opportunity clause contained in Section 202 of the Order requires that Federal contractors and subcontractors not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, sex, or national origin. The contractor/subcontractor will take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed, and that employees are treated during employment, without regard to their race, color, religion, sex, or national origin.

Section 503 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended

Section 503 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended (29 U.S.C. 793), requires Government contractors and subcontractors to take affirmative action to employ and advance in employment qualified individuals with disabilities. Under the Act, contractors can not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of physical or mental disability in regard to any position for which the employee or applicant for employment is qualified.

Vietnam Era Veterans' Readjustment Assistance Act of 1974, as amended

The Vietnam Era Veterans' Readjustment Assistance Act of 1974, as amended (38 U.S.C. 4212, or VEVRAA), requires Government contractors and subcontractors to take affirmative action to employ and advance in employment qualified special disabled veterans, veterans of the Vietnam era, recently separated veterans, and other protected veterans.

ADA - The Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990

Title I of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 prohibits private employers, state and local governments, employment agencies and labor unions from discriminating against qualified individuals with disabilities in job application procedures, hiring, firing, advancement, compensation, job training, and other terms, conditions, and privileges of employment.

Revisions to the Standards of the Classification of Federal Data on Race and Ethnicity

Federal Register Notice (62 FR 58782-58790) October 30, 1997.

Background: The Office of Management and Budget (OMB) announced revisions to the standards for classification of federal data on race and ethnicity in a Federal Register Notice on October 30, 1997 (62 FR 58782-58790).

Office of Management and Budget – OMB Bulletin NO. 00-02, March 9, 2000.

An excerpt:

The five minimum race categories are American Indian or Alaska Native, Asian, Black or African American, Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander, and White. Census 2000 will be the first nationwide implementation of the revised standards. Data from Census 2000 will capture more accurately the increasing diversity of the Nation's population. Results from the Census 2000 will display a full range of single and multiple races reporting by the American people. As the revised standards for collecting and presenting the data are implemented, we must ensure that we maintain our ability to monitor compliance with laws that offer protections for those who historically have experienced discrimination.

In response to requests from agencies responsible for monitoring and enforcing civil rights laws, OMB has led an interagency group to develop guidance. This guidance addresses the allocation by agencies of responses, whether individual or aggregate, for use in civil rights monitoring and enforcement.

In 62 FR 58782-58790, Section E: Tabulation Issues: Guidelines for Tabulation, the combined format method requires six minimum categories: American Indian or Alaska Native, Asian, Black or African American, Hispanic or Latino, Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander, and White. In addition to the minimum single race categories and ethnic category, responsible agencies will determine additional combinations that meet the 1 percent threshold for the relevant jurisdictions. A balance category is provided to report those individual responses that are not included in (1) one of the five single race categories and ethnic category, or (2) other combinations that represent more than 1 percent of the population jurisdiction. "When aggregate data are presented, data producers shall provide the number of respondents who marked (or selected) only one category, separately for each of the six categories." This refers to Census tabulations for "alone" for each of the five racial categories and the ethnic category Hispanic or Latino. "In addition to these numbers, data producers are strongly encouraged to provide the detailed distributions, including all possible combinations of multiple responses. In cases where data on multiple responses are collapsed, the total number of respondents reporting "Hispanic or Latino and one or more races" and the total number of respondents reporting "more than one race" (regardless of ethnicity) shall be provided" (62 FR 58782-58790) (Page 17 of 19).

Revisions to the Standards of the Classification of Federal Data on Race and Ethnicity (Continued)

62 FR 58782-58790

3. *Standards for Record Keeping and Reporting*
 - a. *Statistical Reporting*

“Any other variation will have to be specifically authorized by the Office of Management and Budget through the information collection clearance process.”

b. Civil Rights and Other Compliance Reporting – These standards shall be used by all federal agencies in either the separate or combined format for civil rights and other compliance reporting from the public and private sectors and all levels of government. Any variation in requiring less detailed data or data which cannot be aggregated into the basic categories must be specifically approved by OMB for executive agencies. More detailed reporting, which can be aggregated to the basic categories, may be used at the agencies’ discretion.

1. *Presentation of Data on Race and Ethnicity*

Displays of statistical, administrative and compliance data on race and ethnicity shall use the categories listed above. In displaying detailed information that represents a combination of race or ethnicity, the description of the data being displayed shall clearly indicate that both bases of classification are being used (page 18 of 19).

Effective Date is immediate for all new or revised record keeping or reporting requirements and all existing record keeping or reporting requirements no later than January 1, 2003.

Standards for Maintaining, Collecting and Presenting Federal Data on Race and Ethnicity (Excerpt from Federal Registry, October 30, 1997)

Categories and Definitions

The minimum categories for data on race and ethnicity for federal statistics, program administrative reporting and civil rights compliance reporting are defined as follows:

- **American Indian or Alaska Native:** A person having origins in any of the original peoples of North and South America (including Central America), and who maintains tribal affiliation or community attachment.
- **Asian:** A person having origins in any of the original peoples of the Far East, Southeast Asia or the Indian subcontinent including, for example, Cambodia, China, India, Japan, Korea, Malaysia, Pakistan, the Philippine Islands, Thailand and Vietnam.
- **Black or African American:** A person having origins in any of the black racial groups of Africa. Terms such as "Haitian" or "Negro" can be used in addition to "Black or African American."
- **Hispanic or Latino:** A person of Cuban, Mexican, Puerto Rican, South or Central American, or other Spanish culture or origin, regardless of race. The term "Spanish origin" can be used in addition to "Hispanic or Latino."
- **Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander:** A person having origins in any of the original peoples of Hawaii, Guam, Samoa or other Pacific Islands.
- **White:** A person having origins in any of the original peoples of Europe, the Middle East or North Africa.

White and American Indian: In Oklahoma, this racial category meets the 1 percent threshold at the state level, the four MSA levels and for numerous counties.
