## OKLAHOMA EMPLOYMENT REPORT - May 2012

Metropolitan statistical area (MSA) and county information

### County unemployment rates increase in May

In May, **LeFlore County** reported Oklahoma's highest county unemployment rate of 8.5 percent. **Latimer County** and **Sequoyah County** rounded out the three highest rates for the month. **Dewey, Ellis and Roger Mills counties** recorded a three-way tie for the state's lowest county rate. All Oklahoma counties except **Okmulgee County**, which registered no change, saw their unemployment rates increase over the month.


