DECLARATION OF EMERGENCY AND ORDER

COMES NOW on this 17th day of May, 2010, the State of Oklahoma, ex rel. Kim Holland, Insurance Commissioner, by and through Darren T. Ellingson, Deputy Insurance Commissioner, and issues this order based upon the following findings and conclusions of law, to wit:

JURISDICTION

1. That Kim Holland is the Insurance Commissioner of the State of Oklahoma and as such is charged with the duty of administering and enforcing all provisions of the Oklahoma Insurance Code, 36 O.S. §§ 101-7004.

2. That pursuant to Section 6218 of Title 36 of the Oklahoma Statutes, in the event of a catastrophe, the Insurance Commissioner may declare an emergency to exist, and in the event of such a declaration, the Commissioner may issue a license as an emergency adjuster to any resident or non resident applicant.

3. That pursuant to Oklahoma Insurance Department General Administrative order 09-1251-PMT, the Insurance Commissioner delegated to Deputy Insurance Commissioner Darren T. Ellingson all powers and authority to issue orders consistent with the Oklahoma Insurance Code.

FINDINGS OF FACT

That on or around May 16, 2010, wind and hail caused widespread damage to the people and property of the State of Oklahoma, resulting in a catastrophe in the State of Oklahoma.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. That, pursuant to Section 6218, of Title 36, in the event of a catastrophe, the Insurance Commissioner may declare an emergency to exist, and in the event of such a declaration, the Commissioner may issue a license as an emergency adjuster to any resident or nonresident applicant.

2. That, pursuant to Section 6218 of Title 36, an individual licensed as an emergency adjuster pursuant to Section 6218 may only adjust claims related to the catastrophe.

3. That, pursuant to Section 6218 of Title 36, a license as an emergency adjuster shall remain in force for not more than ninety (90) days from the date of issue, unless extended for an additional ninety (90) days by the Commissioner.

4. That, pursuant to Section 6218 of Title 36, the Insurance Commissioner should declare that an emergency exists.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE DECLARED AND ORDERED by the Insurance Commissioner that an emergency exists due to a catastrophe caused by wind and hail resulting in widespread damage to the people and property of the State of Oklahoma.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that licenses shall be issued to emergency adjusters pursuant to Section 6218 of Title 36 of the Oklahoma Insurance Code to adjust losses occurring as a result of wind, hail and storms occurring on or around May 16, 2010.


