Lindsey Flowers serves as the Development Coordinator of the Oklahoma Film & Music Office (OF&MO). In that role, she composes press releases, maintains the office website, oklahomafilm.org, which includes an events page that highlights film and music events statewide. She also edits the weekly e-newsletter *This Week in Film and Music* that has circulation of over 2,500. Lindsey oversees the office internship program, designs marketing materials, and maintains records of the Oklahoma Film & Music Office in the media.

The OF&MO markets Oklahoma as a viable location for producing motion picture, television and music projects, providing resources for every aspect of production including personnel, locations, equipment and permitting. OF&MO also administers an incentives program to recruit films to the state. The agency works closely with Oklahoma businesses, lawmakers and community leaders to increase awareness of the importance of the film and music industries in diversifying Oklahoma's economy.

A native to Oklahoma, Lindsey received her Bachelor of Fine Arts degree in Visual Communications from the University of Oklahoma in 2005, and proceeded to become a Peace Corps volunteer, serving two years in Kenya teaching in a school for the Blind and Deaf. She then moved to Tokyo, Japan where she was a teacher at an International Kindergarten and also helped facilitate music and art events for a local non-profit organization. Upon her return to Oklahoma, she found her passion for development while working at a non-profit organization that serves underemployed and homeless individuals in Oklahoma City.

An artist, musician and dance instructor herself, Lindsey is ecstatic for the opportunity to exercise her passion for film, music, creativity, and the State of Oklahoma in the position of Development Coordinator of the Oklahoma Film & Music Office.
