

ORDER OF DISMISSAL

The Prehearing Conference in this case was held on November 14, 2006 at 1:30 p.m. in the Oklahoma City offices of the OMPC. Appellant appeared *pro se*, and Appellee appeared by and through its attorney, Tamar Graham Scott.


Appellant announced that he did not want to pursue his appeal further.¹ I explained to him that if he dismissed his appeal, he could never again bring to the OMPC any appeals, complaints, or other questions arising from the facts that precipitated the instant Appeal. Appellant demonstrated that he understood the limitations that a dismissal with prejudice would place on him. After conversing with Appellant on the record, I am convinced that Appellant knowingly, intentionally, and voluntarily decided to move to dismiss his appeal with prejudice.

Appellee expressed no objection to Appellant's oral motion to dismiss.

Therefore, based on Appellant's oral motion to dismiss and Appellee's lack of objection to Appellant's oral motion, this Appeal is **DISMISSED WITH PREJUDICE** pursuant to OAC 455:10-3-13(a)(1).

¹Although Appellant said that he did not want to go any further with his Appeal, I construed his words as an oral motion to dismiss. I explained to Appellant that he was asking that his Appeal be dismissed with prejudice, and he agreed that dismissal was his intent when he said that he did not want to proceed further.
