Frequently Asked Questions

WHAT IS THE STATE CHARITABLE CAMPAIGN (SCC)?

The State Charitable Campaign (SCC) was created in 1989 by the State of Oklahoma to provide the employees of the State with a convenient and responsible system to contribute to accountable nonprofits. Giving to the SCC is voluntary. The campaign offers donors the convenience of payroll deduction if they choose.

The Oklahoma State Employee Charitable Contribution Act, Sections 7001 through 7010 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes provides guidance for the campaign which is codified in Oklahoma Administrative Code, Chapter 10 of Title 695. WHO DECIDES WHAT CHARITIES ARE INVOLVED?

The SCC is governed by the Oversight Committee for State Employee Charitable Contributions (OCSECC). Comprised of state employee appointees, the OCSECC acts as the campaign's board of directors approving charities to participate, overseeing campaign procedures, and contracting with a non-profit organization to manage the campaign annually. HOW MUCH OF THE MONEY GIVEN ACTUALLY GOES TO CHARITY?

By state regulation, campaign administrative costs cannot exceed 10%, meaning at least 90 cents of every dollar donated goes directly to charity.

HOW DOES THE CHARITY GUIDE HELP ME IN MAKING MY CONTRIBUTION?

This charity guide lists all of the eligible charitable federations and their member charities. Through the SCC, you may designate your gift to federations or member charities by indicating your choices on your pledge card. Each federation and charity is listed separately, with an assigned four-digit charity code (e.g. 1234) that must be used when making a selection to ensure that your contribution reaches the charity or charities you wish to support.

To support a federation and have your gift shared among all of its charities, choose the federation code as it appears preceding the federation name and description. To support an individual charity within a federation, select that charity's code as it appears preceding the charity name and description. Pledge cards returned with donations but without charity code numbers will be counted as undesignated donations.

WHAT HAPPENS TO THE UNDESIGNATED DONATIONS?

According to Oklahoma Statutes, undesignated money shall be distributed in the same proportion as designated dollars within the state of Oklahoma. For example, if a charity receives 10% of all the designated contributions, that organization will also receive 10% of the undesignated donations.

Save the Children is the leading independent organization creating lasting change for children in need in the U.S. and around the world.


0329 The United States Fund for UNICEF
