7253 Boy Scouts of America, Last Frontier Council

Boy Scouts learn about patriotism, courage, leadership and self-reliance. Emphasis is placed on important values such as giving, caring and sharing. The council operates two year round camps. Some of the current programs deal with problems such as drug abuse, hunger, illiteracy and an outreach to at-risk children.

7260 Christian Family Counseling Center

This agency provides professional counseling services, which integrate Christian values with the knowledge gained from modern psychology, to anyone in need regardless of their ability to pay or faith perspective. They are dedicated to the preservation and strengthening of marriages and family relationships.

7267 Girl Scouts - Sooner Council, Inc.

Girl Scouting inspires girls with the highest ideals of character, conduct, patriotism and service so that they may become happy and resourceful citizens. Girls Scouts provide a development program that seeks to reduce at risk behaviors.

7259 Legal Aid Services of Oklahoma, Inc.

This agency's mission is to provide high quality civil legal services to the poor and elderly; groups that could otherwise be without counsel. United Way of Stephens County funding has helped to make a Duncan office a reality for this agency, which is vital to ensuring client accessibility and confidentiality.

7264 Power Shop, Inc.

Power Shop provides service and support for individuals with developmental disabilities. A vocational program provides employment skills training to help each individual reach greater independence through work activities, employment and social/life skills programs.

7261 Women's Haven

Women's Haven provides trained crisis volunteers who provide emotional support, a link to legal assistance and advocacy services to the victims of sexual assault or domestic violence. Safe shelter is also available for these victims.

7265 Youth Services for Stephens County, Inc.

This state, federal and locally funded agency serves Stephens, Jefferson and Cotton counties. Youth Services provides free services which include individual, group and family counseling, parenting classes, child abuse prevention, emergency youth shelter, a first time offender program, a Community Intervention Center and the Kaleidoscope outreach to seventh graders.

HOW MUCH SHOULD I GIVE?

This question is frequently asked by those who sincerely want to help – and to help enough. Since the State Charitable Campaign (SCC) is entirely voluntary there is no single answer. Most employees wish to contribute a “fair share” of their income as defined by the Suggested Giving Guide. The guide is provided because employees so often ask for one; however, this guide is not a quota nor an assessment. The choice to give or not give is your decision, and you have the right not to be influenced in making a decision regarding your contributions in the SCC.

As a state donor, you may direct your gift to specific voluntary agencies or a group of your choice by designating in the boxes provided on the pledge card. These are the only agencies authorized to participate in this year’s SCC.

You may also choose not to designate to any agency. Undesignated money will be distributed based on the distribution of undesignated funds as put forth by the Office of Personnel Management.

SUGGESTED GIVING GUIDE:

ONE HOUR’S PAY PER MONTH

The State Charitable Campaign is a program that gives state employees the opportunity to share in providing support to agencies of their choice. This is the only state approved program permitted by the State of Oklahoma to conduct a campaign once a year, with on-the-job solicitation and the privilege of payroll deduction.

LEADERSHIP GIVING

Contributions of \$500 or more by an individual or couple are recognized by membership in Leadership Giving. These contributors receive a one-time gift of a walnut plaque with a year bar for each consecutive year pledging.
