- 2. A short statement of what qualifies you to oversee the work of the folks you supervise."the supervising physician shall be trained and fully qualified in the field of the mid-level practitioner's specialty."
- 3. It seems from a quick review that these folks are not at your practice location. I would also need a short statement of how you do remote supervision.

I can only grant such authority on a temporary basis. So if I grant, or not, you will have to appear before the Board on March 14, 2024 to request the exception in person.

"Practice Agreement" means a written agreement between a physician assistant and the delegating physician concerning the scope of practice of the physician assistant to only be determined by the delegating physician and the physician assistant based on the education, training, skills and experience of the physician assistant. The agreement shall involve the joint formulation, discussion and agreement on the methods of supervision and collaboration for diagnosis, consultation and treatment of medical conditions. 59 O.S. § 519.2(9).

1. DESCRIPTION OF THE SCOPE OF PRACTICE OF THE PHYSICIAN ASSISTANT

PA provides primary care services and psychiatric services, including MAT.

"Supervision" means overseeing or delegating the activities of the medical services rendered by a physician assistant through a practice agreement between a medical doctor or osteopathic physician performing procedures or directly or indirectly involved with the treatment of a patient, and the physician assistant working jointly toward a common goal of providing services. Delegation shall be defined by the practice agreement. The physical presence of the delegating physician is not required as long as the delegating physician assistant are or can be easily in contact with each other by telecommunication. At all times a physician assistant shall be considered an agent of the delegating physician. 59 O.S. § 519.2(7).

2. DESCRIBE THE METHOD(S) OF SUPERVISION AND COLLABORATION OF THE PHYSICIAN ASSISTANT WHICH INCLUDES REVIEWING A SAMPLE OF OUTPATIENT MEDICAL RECORDS. THIS REVIEW OF A SAMPLE OF OUTPATIENT MEDICAL RECORDS MAY OCCUR USING ELECTRONIC OR VIRTUAL CONFERENCING OR AN AGREED UPON SITE.

Collaboration, communication and supervision performed through a combination of in person and Teams/phone. Sample of notes has been reviewed.

All practice agreements and any amendments shall be filed with the State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision within ten (10) business days of being executed.

COLLABORATIVE PRACTICE AGREEMENT

I. Statement of Purpose

The Advanced Practice Registered Nurse (APRN), under the supervision of and in collaboration with a physician, may perform medical services as outlined in this Agreement within the APRN's education, training, experience and certification, and in accordance with following Oklahoma Board of Nursing regulations § 567.4a.

Scope of Practice: APRN shall provide healthcare services to assigned patients through initial and maintenance visits, post-hospital visits and visits for treatment of acute or chronic conditions in accordance with this Agreement and the Protocols attached to this Agreement as Exhibit A ("Protocols"). The Protocols are incorporated in this Agreement by reference and are kept available at each practice site. The APRN shall make the Agreement available for review upon request by the State Board of Nursing. APRN shall not engage in any diagnosis, treatment or other conduct which the APRN is not qualified to perform.

Licensure: APRN shall be responsible for keeping APRN's nursing license active and current with the State Board of Nursing.

Physician Consultation or Referral: APRN, consistent with his or her clinical expertise, shall be responsible for obtaining consultations with Physician when necessary. The Physician and APRN may determine specific reasons why the APRN should seek consultation from the Physician. These may include, but are not limited to, patient emergencies, acute change of condition, chronic condition exacerbation, or consideration for hospitalization. Consultations and a resulting care plan shall be noted in the patient's medical record. Consultation options include, but are not limited to, telephone contact, on-site case review or discussion and/or physical examination of the patient by Physician.

Management of Abnormal Lab Tests: APRN, consistent with his or her clinical expertise, shall be responsible for reviewing and responding to all diagnostic results. Consistent with the statement above on Physician Consultation or Referral, the APRN may seek consultation with the Physician when necessary.

Communication: APRN shall establish jointly agreed upon communication standards with Physician. This may include when to communicate, what is required to communicate, frequency of communication, and methodology of communication. Communication may include rounding jointly, calls or secure texts for sharing of information or seeking consultation, notification of certain events, i.e. patient sent to hospital, patient placed on skilled status as examples.

Medical Records: APRN shall maintain accurate medical records documenting history and physical findings and results of diagnostic tests and consultations concerning a patient, including diagnosis and treatment plans.

III. PHYSICIAN RESPONSIBILITIES

Availability for Consultation and Referral: Physician agrees to be immediately available to APRN for consultation and referral, either in person or by electronic means. Physician agrees to provide necessary consultation, referral and client services according to customary standards of medical clinical practice. In patient emergency situations, the Physician and APRN will jointly determine how and when communication and consultations will occur.

Physician agrees to designate a backup or alternate Physician contact ("Alternate Physician") for consultation and referral if Physician is not immediately available. The Alternate Physician may supervise the APRN on a temporary basis if the physician is not available.

Scope of Medical Services: Physician shall ensure that the medical services provided by APRN are commensurate with the education, training, experience and level of competence of APRN, and within the scope of practice of APRN.

Review of Charts: Physician shall conduct a review of select charts of the APRN to provide appropriate clinical oversight in accordance to state regulations and TruHealth policy.

IV. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTORS

APRN and Physician are independent contractors, and this Agreement shall not be construed to create an employment relationship or agency relationship between APRN and Physician.

V. RESPONSIBILITY FOR DAMAGES

Each party shall be responsible for any and all damages, claims, liabilities or judgments which may arise as a result of his or her own negligence or intentional wrongdoing in accordance with State law. VI. PROFESSIONAL LIABILITY AND MALPRACTICE

During the term of this Agreement, TruHealth will provide professional liability and malpractice

insurance to APRN. Physician shall maintain his or her own professional liability and malpractice

insurance.

VII. INDEMNIFICATION

TruHealth agrees to hold harmless and indemnify the Physician to the full extent permitted by law

against any liability arising out of this Agreement, including but not limited to the collaboration with

the APRN; provided that, this Agreement and the indemnification contained in this Section shall not

apply to the Physician's own acts or omissions.

VIII. TERM AND TERMINATION

This Agreement must be reviewed, revised as parties deem appropriate, and signed annually. If no

changes are made in the Agreement, a new cover sheet with signature may be completed. If either

party has their license suspended, no longer participates in the programs described herein, practices

in the state covered by this Agreement, has been excluded or opted out from participation in any

federal health care program, as defined in 42 U.S.C. § 1320a-7b(f) ("Federal Health Care Program"),

or is debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded by

any federal department or agency, or is otherwise unable to perform the medical or supervision

services described herein, this Agreement shall terminate immediately.

This Agreement may be terminated without cause upon providing thirty (30) days' written notice to

either party. (Or to both parties in the case of a termination by TruHealth).

IX. APPENDIX A: PROTOCOLS

APPENDIX A: PROTOCOLS

I. Qualifications

Advanced Practice Registered Nurses (APRNs) are registered nurses with specialized advanced

education and clinical competency to provide health and medical care for diverse populations in a

variety of primary, acute, and long-term care settings. A Master's degree is required for entry level

practice.

II. Process of Care

The APRN utilizes the scientific process and national standards of care as a framework for

managing client care. This process includes:

A. Assessment of Health Status.

-obtains a relevant health and medical history

-performs a physical examination based on age and history

- -performs or orders preventive and diagnostic procedures based on the
- -patient's age and history
- -identifies health and medical risk factors.

B. Diagnosis.

The APRN makes a diagnosis by:

- utilizing critical thinking in the diagnostic process
- synthesizing and analyzing the collected data
- formulating a differential diagnosis based on the history, physical examination, and diagnostic test results
- establishing priorities to meet the health and medical needs of the individual, family, or community.

C. Development of a Treatment Plan.

The APRN, together with the patient and family, establishes a mutually acceptable cost-awareness plan of care that maximizes health potential. Formulation of the treatment plan includes:

- ordering additional diagnostic tests
- selecting appropriate pharmacologic and non-pharmacologic interventions
- developing a patient education plan
- appropriate consultation/referral.

D. Implementation of the Plan.

Interventions are based upon established priorities. Actions by the APRN are:

- individualized
- consistent with the appropriate plan of care
- based on scientific principles, theoretical knowledge, and clinical expertise
- consistent with teaching and learning opportunities.

Actions include:

- accurately conducting and interpreting diagnostic tests
- prescribing pharmacologic agents and non-pharmacologic therapies
- providing relevant patient education

- making appropriate referrals to other health professionals and community agencies.

E. Follow up and Evaluation of the Client Status.

The APRN maintains a process for systematic follow-up by:

- determining the effectiveness of the treatment plan with documentation of patient care outcomes
- reassessing and modifying the plan as necessary to achieve health and medical goals.

III. Care Priorities

The APRN's practice model emphasizes:

A. Patient and family education

The APRN provides health education and utilizes community resource opportunities for the individual and/or family.

B. Facilitation of patient participation in self-care

The APRN facilitates patient participation in health and medical care by providing information needed to make decisions and choices about:

- promotion, maintenance, and restoration of health
- consultation with other appropriate health care personnel
- appropriate utilization of health care resources.
- C. Promotion of optimal health
- D. Facilitation of entry into the health care system
- E. Promotion of a safe environment

IV. Interdisciplinary/Collaborative Responsibilities

The APRN participates as a team member in the provision of health and medical care, interacting with professional colleagues to provide comprehensive care.

V. Accurate Documentation of Patient Status and Care

The APRN maintains accurate, legible, and confidential records.

VI. Responsibility as Patient Advocate

Ethical and legal standards provide the basis of patient advocacy. As an advocate, the APRN participates in health policy activities at the local, state, national, and international levels.

VII. Quality Assurance and Continued Competence

APRNs recognize the importance of continued learning through:

- participation in quality assurance review, including systematic review of records and treatment

plans on a periodic basis

- maintenance of current knowledge by attending continuing education programs

- maintenance of certification in compliance with current state law

- applying standardized care guidelines in clinical practice.

VIII. Adjunct Roles of APRN

APRNs combine the roles of provider, mentor, educator, researcher, manager, and consultant.

The APRN interprets the role of the APRN to individuals, families, and other professionals.

IX. Research as Basis for Practice

APRNs support research by developing clinical research questions, conducting or participating in

studies, and disseminating and incorporating findings into practice.

Medical Management Protocols

The TruHealth NPs will utilize the 23 Clinical Practice Guidelines for Long Term Care (CPG's) published by American Medical Director's Association, Geriatrics at your Fingertips 16 th Edition, or later published by American Geriatric Society, and Up to Date. A copy of this document will be available in each practice site and with each ARNP at all times. The APRN will have electronic access to these clinical guidelines at all times.

Requirement for Documented Consultation

For certain circumstances, either prescribed by law, or when the APRN has performed an encounter during which a medication or treatment was prescribed which falls outside of the protocols outlined here, the APRN will notify the supervising physician: either verbally, in writing, via communication book, via telephone, or via email within one (1) week to notify them that the physician must undertake a personal review of the historical, physical and therapeutic data of the encounter within ten (10) days of the visit, and sign documentation of this review within thirty (30) days. The NP will notify the MD under the following circumstances:

- 1. The medical scenario is such that the NP desires consultation
- 2. The patient requests a review or consultation
- 3. The prescriptions written as a result of the encounter fall outside of the specific protocols outlined here
- 4. When a controlled drug (schedule II-V) has been prescribed.

After one of the above forms of approved notification has taken place, the charts will be made

available for the physician to complete the necessary review.

Introduction

Bethany Bia, APRN and Sarah Jones, APRN meet the qualifications and practice requirements as stated in Oklahoma Board of Nursing Nurse Practice Act and are licensed and registered as a registered professional nurse practitioners in good standing, holds a certificate as a nurse practitioner with the American Association of Nurse Practitioners Certifying Body and herein meets the requirement of maintaining a collaborative practice agreement with James Cail, DO a duly licensed and currently registered physician in good standing with the Oklahoma Medical Board. Bethany Bia, APRN and Sarah Jones, APRN will both be working part-time hours (less than 32 hours per week).

I. Scope of Practice

The practice of a registered professional nurse as a nurse practitioner may include the diagnosis of illness and physical conditions and the performance of therapeutic and corrective measures including prescribing medications for patients whose conditions fall within the authorized scope of the practice as identified on the college certificate. This privilege includes the prescribing of all controlled substances under a DEA number. The nurse practitioner, as a registered nurse, may also diagnose and treat human responses to actual or potential health problems through such services as case finding, health counseling, health teaching, and provision of care supportive to or restorative of life and well-being.

III. Physician Consultation

The parties shall be available to each other for consultation either on site or by electronic access including but not limited to telephone, facsimile and email.

IV. Payment Agreement

Bethany Bia, APRN and Sarah Jones, APRN agree to collectively pay \$500 monthly to Dr. James Cail, DO. Payment shall be made on the last business day of each month.

V. Alteration of Agreement







Dear Oklahoma State Board of Osteopathic Medicine,

Thank you for considering my request to increase my NP supervision limits at the December 2023 board meeting. I have additional information to provide clarity for your decision-making process. The request in consideration is to increase my current number of nurse practitioner collaborative agreements from 6 to 10. I know it is a concern of the board that NPs/PAs are properly and equitably supervised in practice, and this is also important in my practice. From the December meeting comments, I recognized that random chart audit was an important piece of collaboration that I was not performing regularly. For the past month, I have implemented this practice and understand the importance of this regular practice.

First an foremost, I am a fully licensed osteopathic physician with current DEA and OBNDD licenses. I am board certified in Emergency Medicine and Hospice and Palliative Medicine. For wellness and aesthetic practice, I have done self-study as well as observational training in the common practices. I am scheduled for a formal course in Oklahoma City on April 13th to continue my learning and training. As an Emergency Medicine doctor, I have formal training and experience in managing complications of common procedures in aesthetics, which is an added benefit to my patients. As a Palliative Medicine doctor, regular and routine supervision of prescribing practices is critical. My practice with APPs is to establish a face-to-face patient encounter with palliative medicine patients who receive any schedule 2 prescriptions. As I work alongside APPs in my clinic and hospital practice, this supervision is simultaneous and direct.

My work can be divided into three buckets. I direct Palliative Medicine services at OU, supporting a clinic team and a hospital team of providers. I am a medical director for the Valir PACE program with responsibilities of reviewing quality of care and contributing to provider education. I also collaborate with advanced reactive nurses in aesthetic practice, which holds special interest for me. For both of these programs I provide formal in-person educational lectures and clinical practice review at least monthly. I am also available by phone/text to this group of practitioners at any time and they are comfortable calling me to discuss patient care at will. Prior to working with OU and Valir, I was in collaboration with 3 NPs that now have part-time aesthetics practices. Personally, I am drawn to the area of wellness and aesthetics as I am actively participating in aesthetic sports. I also enjoy the element of coaching others on health, nutrition and fitness that should accompany aesthetics. "Practice Agreement" means a written agreement between a physician assistant and the delegating physician concerning the scope of practice of the physician assistant to only be determined by the delegating physician and the physician assistant based on the education, training, skills and experience of the physician assistant. The agreement shall involve the joint formulation, discussion and agreement on the methods of supervision and collaboration for diagnosis, consultation and treatment of medical conditions. 59 O.S. § 519.2(9).

1. DESCRIPTION OF THE SCOPE OF PRACTICE OF THE PHYSICIAN ASSISTANT

Physician assistants (PAs) in palliative medicine at Stephenson Cancer Center work within our interdisciplinary team alongside physicians, nurses, pharmacists, behavioral health specilaists and other providers. The scope of practice of a PA in palliative medicine includes:

Medical Histories and Physical Exams: PAs can take detailed medical histories and perform thorough physical examinations.

Diagnosis and Treatment: PAs are authorized to diagnose and treat illnesses, order and interpret medical tests, "Supervision" means overseeing or delegating the activities of the medical services rendered by a physician assistant through a practice agreement between a medical doctor or osteopathic physician performing procedures or directly or indirectly involved with the treatment of a patient, and the physician assistant working jointly toward a common goal of providing services. Delegation shall be defined by the practice agreement. The physical presence of the delegating physician is not required as long as the delegating physician and physician assistant are or can be easily in contact with each other by telecommunication. At all times a physician assistant shall be considered an agent of the delegating physician. 59 O.S. § 519.2(7).

2. DESCRIBE THE METHOD(S) OF SUPERVISION AND COLLABORATION OF THE PHYSICIAN ASSISTANT WHICH INCLUDES REVIEWING A SAMPLE OF OUTPATIENT MEDICAL RECORDS. THIS REVIEW OF A SAMPLE OF OUTPATIENT MEDICAL RECORDS MAY OCCUR USING ELECTRONIC OR VIRTUAL CONFERENCING OR AN AGREED UPON SITE.

PA will be working in clinic directly alongside the physician in collaboration. This physician will be reviewing and cosigning all charts until such time the PA has been adequately trained and is comfortable with visits and documentation. At that time, random chart audits will be performed for ongoing supervision outside of direct observation. PA will also undergo usual annual provider performance evaluations with collaborating physician. If physician is out of clinic, PA will have access to physician by phone, text and EHR for timely collaboration.

All practice agreements and any amendments shall be filed with the State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision within ten (10) business days of being executed.



- 1. In July 2019, Dr. Ho was issued Oklahoma Osteopathic Medical License No. 6672. Dr. Ho is an anesthesiologist and most recently practiced in Lawton, Oklahoma.
- 2. In July 2021, Dr. Ho contacted former Executive Director Michael Leake and self-reported his use of fentanyl without a legitimate prescription since May 2021. Dr. Ho advised that he was addicted to fentanyl and had obtained the medications from his employer, Comanche County Medical Center ("CCMC"). Dr. Ho stated that he had been using fentanyl due to his depression from being away from his severely ill wife in Maryland.
- 3. From July 15, 2021, until September 30, 2021, Dr. Ho obtained inpatient treatment for substance abuse at Bradford Health Services.
- 4. On August 16, 2021, while still in residential treatment at Bradford, Dr. Ho executed an Agreement Not to Practice with the Board wherein he agreed not to practice until he appeared before the Board.
- 5. Upon release from Bradford, on October 12, 2021, Dr. Ho signed a five (5) year monitoring contract with the Oklahoma Health Professional Program ("OHPP") and has remained in compliance since that time.
- 6. On June 6, 2022, the Department of Health and Human Services ("DDHS") officially excluded Dr. Ho from participating in all federal health care programs as defined in Section 1128B(f) of the Social Security Act.

- 7. On April 3, 2023, Dr. Ho was charged in the Western District of Oklahoma, Case No. CR-23-150-SLP with One (1) Felony Count of Obtaining a Controlled Dangerous Substance by Subterfuge, in violation of Tit. 21 U.S.C, Section 843(a)(3).
- 8. On April 19, 2023, Dr. Ho plead guilty to the charge, stating in open Court to District Judge Scott Palk that he was addicted to fentanyl and had illegally obtained fentanyl on the job while working at CCMC.
- 9. On December 12, 2023, Dr. Ho was sentenced to 36 months' probation, a \$2,500.00 fine, and a \$100.00 special assessment.
- 10. Dr. Ho has violated the following provisions of the Oklahoma Osteopathic Medicine Act:
 - a. Has engaged in the use or employment of dishonest, fraud, misrepresentation, ... unethical conduct or unprofessional conduct, as determined by the Board, in the performance of functions or duties of an osteopathic physician, including but not limited to dispensing, prescribing, administering or otherwise distributing any drug, controlled substance or other treatment or violating any state or federal law on controlled dangerous substances. 59 O.S. §637(A)(2)(g).
 - b. Has entered a guilty plea in a criminal proceeding for any offense reasonably related to the qualifications, functions, or duties of an osteopathic physician. 59 O.S. §637(A)(5).
 - c. Has had the authority to engage in the activities regulated by the Board revoked by a federal agency. 59 O.S. §637(A)(5).
 - d. Has been guilty of habitual addiction to the use of habit-forming drugs. 59 O.S. §637(A)(12).

Dr. de Gaston received his license to practice as an osteopathic physician in Oklahoma from the Board on July 1, 2019, and primarily practices in family medicine.
- 2. Dr. de Gaston began OSU College of Health Sciences Family Medicine Residency (the "OSU-CHS Residency") on July 1, 2018. Due to repeated issues with respect to professionalism, inattentiveness, and frequent mistakes throughout the OSU-CHS Residency, hospital staff required Dr. de Gaston to undergo three (3) focused reviews and placed him on two (2) separate periods of probation. Dr. de Gaston took courses in areas such as Risk Management, Diversity and Inclusion, and volunteering with pertinent causes to remedy these issues. However, OSU-CHS Residency staff ultimately placed Dr. de Gaston on a zero-tolerance plan in a final attempt to remediate continued observed deficiencies.
- 3. In early 2021, hospital staff gave Dr. de Gaston the option of resigning from the OSU-CHS Residency in lieu of being dismissed due to Dr. De Gaston's inability to remediate continued observed deficiencies. Dr. de Gaston initially opted to resign but then withdrew his resignation. Hospital staff then dismissed Dr. de Gaston from the OSU-CHS Residency on February 23, 2021.
- 4. Dr. de Gaston has worked as a staff physician at John Lilley Correctional Facility in Boley, Oklahoma ("JLCC") since being terminated from the OSU-CHS Residency. JLCC Staff have reported no observed deficiencies regarding Dr. de Gaston's professionalism or knowledge and have indicated that he has excelled in his current

position.

Acted in a manner which results in final disciplinary action by any ... hospital or medical staff of such hospital in this or any other state ... if the action was in any way related to professional conduct, professional competence, malpractice or any violation of the Oklahoma Osteopathic Medicine Act. 59 O.S. §637(A)(2)(f).
 - c. Has engaged in repeated acts of negligence, malpractice or incompetence during the OSU-CHS Residency. 59 O.S. §637(A)(4).

Dr. De Gaston's participation in training was open, raw, and transformative in a meaningful way. I continue to welcome the opportunity to work with him as he continues to grow as an ally for oppressed communities. This work can be painful. We all stumble, but what matters is how well we get back up and how dedicated we are to picking up our stumbling neighbors. Dr. De Gaston has demonstrated a willingness to accept responsibility and more importantly, a desire to set the standard for change within his community.

After training Dr. De Gaston and continuing to communicate with him about the topics included in training, I believe that he should remain within the residency program. Individuals all have inherent biases. Covert and overt forms of racism and gender-based discrimination are prevalent within the field of healthcare at all levels. Socialization into the gender binary begins in infancy and it is a deeply rooted social construct that requires a macro level social response.

Changes clearly should be made within the program to eliminate the potential for discrimination, but the changes need to be made first within the policies and procedures held by the residency program. If no policy exists to dictate the parameters for the requirements for provider chaperones for specific exams or treatments, it should be created. Patient satisfaction, provider security and overall outcomes would improve with more strict guidelines on the requirements for situations demanding additional oversight. The residents should have the ability to recall a specific protocol for the requirements of additional individuals for chaperoning in the same manner that they would have information on how to proceed with a bomb threat or severe weather issue.

The gender binary is something that is so much a part of the social fabric of the culture within the United States that it is the standard of assumption. Learning to view individuals outside of only male or only female requires intentional effort that should be spearheaded by the program. The ability of the residency program to offer specific training on inclusion across the spectrum of identities would increase access and improve healthcare outcomes for all patients as well as decrease the amount of oppression experienced by staff and patients with nondominant identities.



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It is my expert opinion that Dr. De Gaston should be allowed to continue with his training so as to not delay his Family Medicine Board Certification. There is no value in training or teaching the values of inclusion, if an opportunity to return to the workforce armed with the knowledge to make a difference is not extended. Unfairly harsh punishments extended in the face of genuine

acknowledgement of previous lack of awareness and a sincere dedication to creating change is damaging for the growth of lasting social change and is far more harmful to oppressed populations than a lack of initial action. When communities know better, they can do better. It isn't justice to insist upon the desired outcome prior to the required learning. Paulo Freire warns against the oppressed becoming the oppressors in his work, Pedagogy of the Oppressed. His warning is valid for this instance. After years of doing this work, I feel certain that Dr. De Gaston will become a valuable ally for the oppressed among his patients and coworkers and I caution against the potential harm to individual and community growth that could come from hindering his progression within his career and within the movement.

I have had concerns in the past but felt this is an opportunity and responsibility of the program to oversee and guide him in areas of deficiency. I feel that if this was brought to the attention of Dr. De Gaston in a constructive way, he would turn around and implement said criticism/learning 110%. Dr. De Gaston has always been receptive and shown immediate implementation of recommendations from attending experience/recommendations or evidence-based medicine in the past, both from peer-peer and attending-resident discussions. Dr. De Gaston sought to review his clinical decision making on Asthma vs COPD with myself, when it was a critical point for an ICU patient to ensure he was providing the highest-quality standard of care.

He has been a positive influence on me, with his willingness and availability to assist other resident's in covering shifts. I know he volunteered to cover multiple call-shifts during the viral pandemic when other residents were incapacitated or in quarantine situations. He demonstrated his passion and skills in medicine when he became involved with an epidemiological tracking organization, that reviewed patterns of viral spread during the SARS Cov2 Pandemic. I remember our attendings supporting his work and he provided elective lectures in academics to increase awareness about the disease state to our entire department, during a time of low clinical education and limited patient encounters.

Dr. De Gaston has always had an extremely positive attitude, even in managing difficult dally task. His greetings and sincere check-ins have multiple times elevated my mood in a positive manner or kept me from hyper-focusing on negative aspects of my day. His patients seem to value his care significantly, constantly requesting him since his absence from continuity clinic, even though Dr. De Gaston recognizes he still has personal growth achieve as a physician. He has graduated medical school, passed multiple board certifications that involved many ethical questions, and has come to the tail-end of a residency training during an unprecedented time with unique obstacles, which have never been seen in medicine. I am writing regarding Dr. Daniel Heywood de Gaston,

I am a current fellow resident at the OSU Family Medicine Residency. In my three years observing Dr. de Gaston, I have witnessed growth in his medical knowledge and abilities. I feel that Dr. de Gaston is a competent physician and has the ability to take care of patients. Since his termination I have heard that his patients have been saddened to lose him as their physician. I do believe this is also represented in his patient satisfaction scores. His patients demonstrate a loyalty to him that only comes from feeling cared for in the physician-patient relationship. I have read through patient's charts of some of his clinic patients and appreciate his documentation of clinic encounters with medical decision making clearly stated with sound plans of what his next office visit would encompass. Furthermore, I have received hand off during hospital months with succinct understandings of his patient's cases as well as thorough documentation of patient's hospital courses.

I have clinic on Mondays and Wednesdays at the health care center. Dr. de Gaston was often present before clinic had started, and would stay afterwards completing notes at the end of the work day. I know this, because I also arrive early and rarely leave before my notes are completed. I cannot attest to every day, but I can witness to the fact that many days, he was present on time, unlike many family medicine attendings.

Dr. de Gaston has held his head high despite what appears to be attending targeting. He is contacted and reprimanded for things that other residents are not subjected to. When he discusses the timelines his clinic notes must be completed to avoid texts from attendings, it is different than majority of other residents.

I have personally witnessed Dr. de Gaston demonstrate respect for personal boundaries. He comes from a large and loving family, where physical affection is the norm. However, in a professional setting, physical affection is to be avoided. I had explained to him that I like "my bubble" and personal space. One time during clinic, he walked up to innocently put his hand on my shoulder, and stopped himself saying, "that's right, you don't like to be touched". I really appreciated the fact that despite what is his natural inclination towards friends, he was able to stop himself and respect a boundary we had discussed previously.

I feel it is pertinent to give a statement in regards to the trans gender nurse, especially due to the fact that this grievance seemed to be the triggering event that led to termination. This individual started with the OSU Health Care Center as a female. Overnight, they decided to change their gender. Multiple residents have been confronted in a challenging manner by both this nurse and Dr. Tiller, with emphasis on proper pronouns. It should also be noted that Dr. Tiller is this individual's medical physician providing transitional hormone therapy. I stated, "Shea is a really good nurse, I really like her". Dr. Tiller corrected me stating, "HE". I responded with confusion. She stated, "HIS preferred pronouns are his and him. He is transitioning. It is very exciting. We offered to make an announcement at the clinic for him, however he did not want that. He just wants it to come out slowly". There has been confusion about chaperones across the residency and how to approach transgender situations with respect to patient's wishes:

Attendings themselves have said that this is new territory that we are unsure how to navigate at this time. How can a resident be terminated for something that attendings admittedly state they themselves do not know the proper ways to approach?

Dr. de Gaston is a joyful person who has pure intentions despite at times an awkward delivery. I fear leadership inaccurately assessed his character which led to an unjust termination. I know he has been volunteering with the LGBT community to try and improve his understanding and sensitivity to that community. He was not offered any kind of probation or remediation pertaining to these specific events prior to termination, and this seems improper and negligent.

I am writing regarding Dr. Daniel Heywood De Gaston. I have been a fellow resident and I have worked with Dr. De Gaston since starting residency in the summer of 2018. We have worked together several months in the hospital and clinic. I have seen him work, volunteer for extra shifts, lectures, and even fill in for other residents when they didn't feel comfortable presenting a M&M lecture during grand rounds. During our time in residency, he and I have discussed medical plans and patient care in which he has always been able to think outside the box in finding solutions for his patients and develop a strong physician-patient relationship. In addition, there have been several examples during patient care where Dr. De Gaston was able to solve and find solutions to medical mysteries on complicated patients that other doctors were unable to find a solution, including myself. A couple examples are noted below:

- 1) During our intern year Dr. De Gaston, after his weekend off, started to care for a patient who was in the hospital for influenza, COPD exacerbation, and had a history of end-stage renal disease. After a couple of days in the hospital, the patient's vital signs and COPD had improved, but she appeared to be acutely altered and having a psychotic break as she was unable to remember her own name, where she was, or what day or time it was. Dr. De Gaston stayed late and was able to determine that the patient had been dosed full strength tamiflu over the weeked, after stopping the tamiflu and repeating dialysis the patient's neurologic condition improved rapidly.
- 2) Back in September 2020, while I was on service overnight, I had a patient that was initially seen by Emergency Medicine, admitted to Internal Medicine, and then transferred to Family Medicine for care in the hospital. This patient was admitted for being acutely altered, nausea, vomiting, and had an electrolyte imbalance. The patient was hypoglycemic and hypotensive. Between all 3 teams the patient was given zofran, IV fluids, multiple amps of D50, starting a D10 drip, and even started midodrine to increase the patient's blood pressure and control glucose. At sign out I was very worried about the patient's condition and recommended a possible transfer to the ICU. The next day I noticed that this patient had much improved on the floor. I discussed the case with Dr. De Gaston so that I could learn why things had changed. Dr. De Gaston had figured out that the patient had adrenal insufficiency and started steroids, resulting in rapid improvement.

In addition to the situation that I described above I have also noted that Dr. De Gaston looks to stay positive and keeps a good attitude even on the toughest and most frustrating days. He has been the doctor primarily responsible for the care of some of the most difficult patients during the hospital service months that I have been on with him. He has been there to comfort families and loved ones on several occasions when the prognosis of their loved one was grim. Even with the difficult tasks he tends to still be a positive and uplifting force for the team that helped make hospital service, clinic, and additional work much better and easier to get through. Even

with all this, Dr. De Gaston appears to have been targeted by attendings. He has received text messages less than 24 hours after clinic about notes not being submitted. They are not willing to answer his questions about billing, make rude and disparaging comments about him to other residents, and ignore him when he asks for assistance during clinic.

Regardless of the shortcomings that have been brought against Dr. Daniel de Gaston, I believe that he is a great doctor, a caring doctor, and after helping to take care of his patients in clinic I have noted that he is a loved doctor that fulfills the residency mission of training compassionate, competent and caring physicians. He fulfills this better than most. He makes a positive impact while providing a high level patient care. I fully stand behind and support Dr. De Gaston. My hope is that his training should not be stopped as he will be a valuable asset and great family physician, as well as a community leader wherever he plans to serve. I know that supporting him will likely also put a target on my back, but I also know it's the right thing to do.

MOTION TO REINSTATE AND MOTION TO DISMISS

COMES NOW the Respondent, Gregory Rampey, D.O. ("Dr. Rampey" or "Respondent"), and, pursuant to Okla. Admin. Code 510:1-5-1 *et seq*, respectfully requests the State Board of Osteopathic Examiners ("Board") reinstate his license and dismiss the complaint against Dr. Rampey. In support of this request, Dr. Rampey states as follows:

- 1. The Amended Complaint was served on counsel on May 25, 2016. Dr. Rampey filed his answer on July 15, 2016.
- 2. The Amended Complaint alleged violations of the Osteopathic Medicine Act as it relates to controlled dangerous drugs, his prescriptions related thereto and medical record issues, *inter alia*.
- 3. On July 14, 2016, Dr. Rampey was charged for allegedly obtaining or attempting to obtain controlled drugs by fraud. He entered a *nolo contendere* plea on February 13, 2017, and received a 3 year deferred sentence with probation.

- 4. On October 26, 2016, Dr. Rampey was charged for allegedly distributing controlled drugs not in the course of legitimate business. He entered a *nolo contendere* plea on February 13, 2017 and received a 3 year deferred sentence with probation.
- 5. On September 21, 2017, Dr. Rampey was charged for allegedly possessing controlled drugs and for possessing without a tax stamp. He entered a *nolo contendere* plea on April 15, 2019 and received a 7 year deferred sentence with probation.
- 6. In September of 2016, Dr. Rampey signed a voluntary agreement not to practice. He likewise signed a voluntary surrender of his DEA registration in July of 2017. His Board medical license lapsed while he was undergoing treatment and managing his addiction, as further described below.
- 7. The 2016 criminal complaints are set to be dismissed, as Dr. Rampey completed all probationary requirements. The 2017 complaint will follow the same procedure.
- 8. Dr. Rampey completed his medical training at Oklahoma State University, graduating in 1999. His internship was with St. Elizabeth's and the University of Texas Medical Branch, and his residency was in family medicine at Oklahoma State University. He also received board certification from the American Board of Anti-Aging and Regenerative Medicine. Following his residency, he served in the Air Force as a family and ER doctor from 2002 until 2004 when he received an honorable discharge at the Major rank and a Commendation Medal in 2005. Since then, he worked as an ER doctor at Wagoner Hospital, then Hillcrest Hospital, before

becoming Director of the ER at Bailey Medical Center in Owasso, Oklahoma. He left Bailey Medical Center to practice on his own, until his voluntary surrender.

- 9. In June 2015, Dr. Rampey suffered a basilar skull fracture, which worsened certain aspects of his health that were already disturbed due to multiple concussions he experienced in high school and college, some of which resulted in brief loss of consciousness, and a closed head injury in 2008 from a car crash. This history of traumatic brain injury caused disturbed sleep, fatigue, difficulty reading for extended periods, decreased attention, and decreased STM. They did not result in residual cognitive deficits but did include some residual short-term memory problems.
- 10. Dr. Rampey has had chronic sleep issues, which worsened after his skull fracture. Further, during that same time period, he went through a contentious divorce, beginning in 2011, which was finalized in late 2017. He had limited access to his children until the divorce was granted, which caused him significant emotional distress. All these emotional and historical stress-events further exacerbated his sleep problems. To combat Dr. Rampey's disordered sleep, anxiety, and stress-induced complications, he was prescribed Ambien, et al.
- 11. On September 28, 2017, after the Board's Complaint and his criminal cases were filed, he signed a contract with OHPP.
- 12. In October of 2017, Acumen Assessments, LLC diagnosed him with sedative use disorder severe, opioid use disorder severe, alcohol use disorder severe and considered and considered him unfit to practice. In April 2018, OHPP, through Robert Wescott, requested a comprehensive forensic multiday evaluation, which was completed by SHANDS at the UNIVERSITY OF FLORIDA. He was diagnosed with unspecified depressive disorder, unspecified anxiety disorder, unspecified sleep disorder, *inter alia*. It was recommended that he enter treatment at a PHP level and that he should not return to practice medicine yet.

- 13. Thereafter, in May of 2018, Dr. Rampey admitted to the Florida Recovery Center for sedative use disorder severe, unspecified depressive disorder and his continued sleep problems. He remained at the Florida Recovery Center for three months. After discharge in August, and per discharge instructions, he reported to the VA to see an addiction specialist for six months until it determined he was no longer in need of their services.
- 14. Dr. Rampey remained committed to OHPP throughout his contract. It required him to complete random drug tests and attend multiple support meetings.
- 15. After he completed in five-year contract successfully in 2022, Dr. Rampey voluntarily entered into the "senior mentoring program" with OHPP, which includes quarterly hair tests and semi-regular attendance at caduceus meetings. He continues to be in this program and also has created a solid support system through his rehab cohorts.
- 16. Dr. Rampey has taken significant steps to recognize and treat his addiction and remains committed to his sobriety.
- 17. The Amended Complaint should be considered mooted and otherwise dismissed, given the length of time since the Amended Complaint was filed, the changed circumstances since Dr. Rampey signed the voluntary agreement not to practice, and his actions post-criminal proceedings, *inter alia*.
- 18. Dr. Rampey is seeking reinstatement. His plan for re-entry to the practice is to work with Dr. Brad Starkey at his clinic, Access Pain Solutions in Broken Arrow. Dr. Rampey met Dr. Starkey through OHPP. Dr. Starkey will act as a preceptor, with mentorship. Said preceptorship will provide Dr. Rampey with a transition to practice and allow his skills to be assessed and expanded without practicing on his own. Dr. Rampey intends to provide additional information on his plan at the meeting on March 14.

19. During his time away from the Board, Dr. Rampey took 29.5 hours of CME, including on proper prescribing. When his license expired, he was unable to complete CMEs for *credit*, but has verification of the same. He will continue with his CMEs as soon as his license

20. Dr. Rampey further proposes he take the COMVEX exam to prove his retained medical knowledge.

becomes active.

21. Dr. Rampey has taken responsibility for the actions that brought him before the Board and requests this Board allow him to present evidence on the above and authorize his reinstatement, with conditions the Board find necessary.

WHEREFORE, Dr. Rampey respectfully requests that the Amended Complaint against him be dismissed and that he be reinstated to practice.

FINDINGS OF FACT, CONCLUSIONS OF LAW, AND ORDER OF PROBATION WITH TERMS AND CONDITIONS

This matter comes on for consideration before the Oklahoma State Board of Osteopathic Examiners ("Board") at a regular meeting of the Board on December 14, 2023. The Board is represented by the Special Prosecutor for the Board, J. Patrick Quillian. Daniel Garrison, D.O. ("Dr. Garrison") appeared in person without counsel. Lowell Robertson, M.D., of the Oklahoma Health Professionals Program ("OHPP") appeared and offered sworn testimony. The Board's Chief Investigator, Richard Zimmer, also appeared and gave sworn testimony. The parties also submitted exhibits for the Board's consideration.

This Order is issued pursuant to the Oklahoma Osteopathic Medicine Act, 59 O.S. § 620 *et. seq.* and the Oklahoma Administrative Procedures Act, 75 O.S. § 250 *et. seq.*

The Board, after reviewing the pleadings, hearing testimony, and being fully advised enters this Order of Probation with Terms and Conditions, as set out below.

After reviewing the pleadings, exhibits, and hearing testimony, and being fully

advised specifically the Board finds the following Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law

to be true and correct and proven by clear and convincing evidence:

1. Dr. Garrison is the holder of a license to practice osteopathic medicine in the State

of Oklahoma, license number 6306. At the time this action commenced, Dr.

Garrison's license was suspended by agreement.

2. Dr. Garrison received proper notice of the hearing, and a true and correct copy of

the Verified Complaint ("Complaint"), as required by Oklahoma law.

3. On or about January 6, 2023, the Board was made aware Dr. Garrison was

featured in a KSWO article regarding animal abuse charges in Comanche County.

Two men working in West Lawton had alleged they witnessed overhearing what

sounded like a dog being struck, and later witnessed a man dressed in medical

scrubs disposing of a small dog by throwing it into the woods.

4. On or about January 11, 2023, Dr. Garrison's employer, Comanche County

Memorial Hospital ("CCMH"), terminated his employment after a suspension that

resulted from the incident and arrest.

5. On or about March 13, 2023, Dr. Garrison admitted to Board investigators to killing

the dog and voluntarily entered an Agreement Not to Practice with the Board. The

Agreement Not to Practice resulted in Dr. Garrison's Oklahoma license being

suspended.

6. Evidence at the hearing revealed that Dr. Garrison was arrested, charged, and

pled guilty to one count of cruelty to animals in Comanche County.

ORDER OF PROBATION WITH TERMS AND CONDITIONS Daniel Garrison, D.O. (#6306) Case No. OSBOE-2023-009 **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

1. The Board has jurisdiction to hear this matter pursuant to the Oklahoma

Osteopathic Medicine Act, 59 O.S. § 620 et. seq. ("Osteopathic Act"), and the

Oklahoma Administrative Procedures Act, 75 O.S. § 250 et. seq.

2. The Board concludes by clear and convincing evidence that Dr. Garrison violated

the Oklahoma Osteopathic Medicine Act, specifically, Tit. 59 O.S. § 637 (A)(2),

(A)(2)(f), (A)(8), (A)(13).

3. The Board also concludes that such actions are grounds for imposing any sanction

against Dr. Garrison's license to practice osteopathic medicine in the State of

Oklahoma that is permitted by Oklahoma law as well as the rules and regulations

of the Board.

<u>ORDER</u>

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED by the Board that Dr.

Garrison's license to practice osteopathic medicine in the State of Oklahoma is reinstated

and the following terms and conditions shall apply:

1. That Dr. Garrison's license is restricted under a five (5) year term of **PROBATION**.

Said Probation may be extended or continued at the discretion of the Board.

2. That Dr. Garrison must stay in full compliance with all terms of their current contract

with Oklahoma Health Professional Program ("OHPP"). Dr. Garrison shall sign a

release for the Board to obtain any records from, or communicate with, OHPP

regarding Dr. Garrison.

3. That Dr. Garrison must appear before the Board, in person, every three (3) months

during the pendency of this matter or as requested by the Board. At said

- appearances, Order(s) may be amended.
- 4. That Dr. Garrison will maintain monthly contact with their Board Investigator.
- 5. That Dr. Garrison shall bear the financial costs of any expenses incurred from this Order.
- 6. That Dr. Garrison ensure all authorizations are fully and accurately completed and signed to release all reports, evaluations, assessments, and/or documents, directly to the Board.
- 7. Board staff shall have oversight of this Order on behalf of the Board, and the authority to direct Dr. Garrison to provide any and all reports, evaluations, assessments, and/or documents, relevant to this matter, including but not limited to, the signing of any authorizations necessary for the release of any and all evaluations/reports directly to the Board.
- 8. That Dr. Garrison complete the Compliance Information Request Form within ten (10) days of signing this Order. (Exhibit A, Compliance Information Request Form).
- 9. That Dr. Garrison complete the Monthly Supervision Self-Report by the tenth (10th) day of each month. (Exhibit B, Monthly Supervision Self-Report).
- 10. That Dr. Garrison is assessed an ongoing monthly Administrative Maintenance fee of one hundred dollars (\$100), due by the first day of each month and continued monthly during the pendency of any active and ongoing Board Order.
- 11. That Dr. Garrison may utilize their right to consult legal counsel in connection with this inquiry by the Board known as OSBOE-2023-009, this Order, or any other inquiry by the Board.
- 12. That Dr. Garrison is required to notify the Board within fourteen (14) days of any changes to legal counsel.
- 13. Dr. Garrison shall provide a copy of this Order in whole with any current or potential employer.
- 14. That Dr. Garrison is required to notify the Board within fourteen (14) days of any changes to their residential or practice address.
- 15. That Dr. Garrison is required to notify the Board within fourteen (14) days of any changes to their cell phone number.

16. That Dr. Garrison renews their license yearly as required by the Board's statues and rules. Failure to renew their license could result in cancellation by the Board.

17. That Dr. Garrison maintains compliance with continuing medical education ("CME") Credits as required by the Board's statutes and rules.

18. In the event Dr. Garrison leaves the State of Oklahoma to practice medicine in another jurisdiction, and surrenders their license here in Oklahoma, the terms and conditions of this Order shall be tolled.

Any violation of this Order may result in further discipline of Dr. Garrison's license to practice osteopathic medicine in the State of Oklahoma.

This Order is a public record and therefore subject to the Oklahoma Open Records

Act. Further, This Order may be reportable to the National Practitioner Data Bank

("NPDB") pursuant to federal law, including but not limited to, 45 CFR Part 60.

Moreover, as facts may indicate any violation of this Order may result in a referral to the Oklahoma Attorney General for the unauthorized practice of osteopathic medicine in the State of Oklahoma.

FINDINGS OF FACT, CONCLUSIONS OF LAW, AND ORDER OF PROBATION WITH TERMS AND CONDITIONS

This matter comes on for consideration before the Oklahoma State Board of Osteopathic Examiners ("Board") at a regular meeting of the Board on December 14, 2023. The Board is represented by the Special Prosecutor for the Board, J. Patrick Quillian. Clayton Howell, D.O. ("Dr. Howell") appeared in person at the hearing on this date represented by legal counsel, Kaylee Davis-Maddy, J.D. Lowell Robertson, M.D., of the Oklahoma Health Professionals Program ("OHPP") appeared and offered sworn testimony. The Board's Chief Investigator, Richard Zimmer, also appeared and gave sworn testimony. Exhibits were submitted for the Board's consideration.

This Order is issued pursuant to the Oklahoma Osteopathic Medicine Act, 59 O.S. § 620 *et. seq.* and the Oklahoma Administrative Procedures Act, 75 O.S. § 250 *et. seq.*

The Board, after reviewing the pleadings, hearing testimony, and being fully advised enters this Order of Probation with Terms and Conditions, as set out below.

After reviewing the pleadings, exhibits, and hearing testimony, and being fully

advised specifically the Board finds the following Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law

to be true and correct and proven by clear and convincing evidence:

1. Dr. Howell is the holder of a license to practice osteopathic medicine in the State

of Oklahoma, license number 5398. At the time this action commenced, Dr.

Howell's license was suspended by agreement.

2. Dr. Howell received proper notice of the hearing, and a true and correct copy of

the Verified Complaint ("Complaint"), as required by Oklahoma law.

3. That the Board moved to strike paragraph number 7 of the Complaint and did not

submit evidence in support thereof at the Hearing.

4. That evidence at the hearing revealed Dr. Howell was T.E., patient, Primary Care

Physician (PCP) from April 2019 to January 2022. Dr. Howell engaged in a sexual

relationship with patient T.E from November 2021 to January 2022 while T.E. was

his patient. Dr. Howell terminated T.E. as a patient in January 2022.

5. On or about November 16, 2022, the Board filed a Complaint and Citation and

Notice of Hearing to Dr. Howell regarding his engagement in sexual activity within

the physician/patient relationship.

6. On or about December 20, 2022, Dr. Howell voluntarily entered an Agreement Not

to Practice with the Board.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Board has jurisdiction to hear this matter pursuant to the Oklahoma

Osteopathic Medicine Act, 59 O.S. § 620 et. seq. ("Osteopathic Act"), and the

- 9. That Dr. Howell complete the Compliance Information Request Form within ten (10) days of signing this Order. (Exhibit A, Compliance Information Request Form).
- 10. That Dr. Howell complete the Monthly Supervision Self-Report by the tenth (10th) day of each month. (Exhibit B, Monthly Supervision Self-Report).
- 11. That Dr. Howell is assessed an ongoing monthly Administrative Maintenance fee of one hundred dollars (\$100), due by the first day of each month and continued monthly during the pendency of any active and ongoing Board Order.
- 12. That Dr. Howell may utilize their right to consult legal counsel in connection with this inquiry by the Board known as OSBOE-2022-139, this Order, or any other inquiry by the Board.
- 13. That Dr. Howell is required to notify the Board within fourteen (14) days of any changes to legal counsel.
- 14. Dr. Howell shall provide a copy of this Order in whole with any current or potential employer.
- 15. That Dr. Howell is required to notify the Board within fourteen (14) days of any changes to their residential or practice address.
- 16. That Dr. Howell is required to notify the Board within fourteen (14) days of any changes to their cell phone number.
- 17. That Dr. Howell renews their license yearly as required by the Board's statues and rules. Failure to renew their license could result in cancellation by the Board.
- 18. That Dr. Howell maintains compliance with continuing medical education ("CME") Credits as required by the Board's statutes and rules.
- 19. In the event Dr. Howell leaves the State of Oklahoma to practice medicine in

another jurisdiction, and surrenders their license here in Oklahoma, the terms and conditions of this Order shall be tolled.

Any violation of this Order may result in further discipline of Dr. Howell's license to practice osteopathic medicine in the State of Oklahoma.

- Investigators have called, left voice mails, and emails to Dr. Lukac since February due to noncompliance (detailed letter sent on 2-13-24)
- o Dr. Lukac stated over the phone that she was not aware of the board orders, never received copies of them and was not made aware of the last hearing. Dr. Lukac stated her address, email and phone has not changed. Dr. Lukac was emailed on 1-10-24.

- Misrepresented on Licensure Application, hand typed letter mentioned transferring from GA PHP to OK PHP, applicant was terminated well before the letter was written. MOTION TO MODIFY ORDER

COMES NOW the respondent, Junaid Alam, D.O. ("Dr. Alam"), by and through undersigned counsel, and hereby moves the Board to amend the *Order of Probation with Terms and Conditions* ("Order") (Exh. A) filed with the Oklahoma Board of Osteopathic Examiners on January 10, 2024, pursuant to the Oklahoma Osteopathic Medicine Act, 59 O.S. § 620 et seq., the Oklahoma Administrative Procedures Act, 75 O.S. § 250 et seq., and administrative regulations contained in Title 435 of the Oklahoma Administrative Rules. Patrick Quillian, Board Prosecutor, has been advised of the contents of this Motion and does not object. Specifically, Dr. Alam requests the following modifications:

First, Dr. Alam requests Paragraph 2 be modified. On January 10, 2024, the same day the Board's Order was entered, PRC sent an e-mail to Dr. Alam in response to his earlier inquiry about the recommendation for a workplace monitor. (Exh. B). PRC clarified they are **not recommending** a workplace monitor, Recommendation No. 6. In order for the Board's Order to accurately reflect the recommendations of PRC, Dr. Alam requests paragraph 2 be modified as such:

CURRENT: That Dr. Alam shall complete the eighteen (18) recommendations from the Professional Renewal Center ("PRC") Discharge Summary Recommendations from their discharge December 10, 2023.

PROPOSED: That Dr. Alam shall complete the recommendations from the Professional Renewal Center ("PRC") related to communication skills development, stress tolerance skills, assertiveness skills, and emotional competency skills.

This modification resolves both the current position of PRC and also allows PRC to further modify/resolve recommendations going forward without need for motion practice to the Board to modify the Order. This promotes efficiency and economy of the Board.

Second, Dr. Alam requests Paragraph 1 be modified. The Board reviewed Dr. Alam's application and ultimately granted his license to practice medicine in Oklahoma on September 1, 2023. Since that time there have been no limitations or restrictions on his scope of practice, prescriptive authority, or ability to treat and follow-up with any patient by the Board. In fact, PRC specifically concluded "Dr. Alam is able to practice medicine." The challenge faced by medical professionals oftentimes comes from a single word that is interpreted without the requisite context by Insurance Companies, Credentialing entities or others that can have the opposite effect the Board has sought: that Dr. Alam practice medicine in Oklahoma while receiving the mental health support that has been recommended. Here, there has not been any indication from the Board throughout this process that there is a desire to restrict Dr. Alam from practicing medicine or prescribing medications. Indeed, PRC's recommendations relate to "communication skills development, distress tolerance skills, assertiveness skills, and emotional competency skills." As such, Dr. Alam respectfully requests paragraph 1 be modified as such:

CURRENT: That Dr. Alam's license is restricted under a five (5) year term of Probation. Said Probation may be extended or continued at the discretion of the Board.

Page 2 of 3 Motion to Modify Order *Alam,* OSBOE-2023-125 PROPOSED: That Dr. Alam license is unrestricted, but under a five (5) year term of Probation as outlined below. Said Probation may be abrogated, extended, or continued at the discretion of the Board.

Finally, Dr. Alam requests a finding by the Board that none of this process, recommendations made, or actions taken by the Board were a result of patient safety concerns or incompetence of Dr. Alam. There have been no such allegations or evidence and there is no basis for them. The Board should reject any attempt to do so.

MOTION TO REMOVE CONDITIONS

COMES NOW Respondent, Lisa Baracker, D.O. ("Dr. Baracker" or "Respondent"), and pursuant to Oklahoma Admin. Code 510:10 *et seq*, and respectfully requests the State Board of Osteopathic Examiners ("Board") remove the conditions (or restrictions) on her license and grant her full licensure. In support of this request, Dr. Baracker states as follows.

- 1. Dr. Baracker completed her Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine and also completed a Master of Public Health from Touro University of California in 2018. Prior to this date, she obtained an Associates of Science in Biology from the Community of Aurora in 1998, a Bachelors of Science in Chemistry from Metropolitan State University in 2000, and a Master of Arts, Chemistry and Biochemistry from the University of Denver in 2003.
 - 2. Thereafter, she entered into residency programs, as further described herein.
- 3. In 2021, Dr. Baracker was accepted to Oklahoma State University's McAlester Regional Health Center's Family Medicine Residency Program ("McAlester"). She sought licensure from this Board at that time.

- 4. Her licensure was granted on March 24, 2022 with various conditions (order dated April 14, 2022), specifically that she was limited to practice while actively employed in an Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education ("ACGME") accredited residency program with no moonlighting or other activity permitted. Further, she was required to complete a professional communication certification course (Crucial Conversations), and a zero-tolerance policy for poor professional communication, *inter alia*.
- 5. Dr. Baracker was unable to complete her residency at McAlester and was terminated from the program.
- 6. On December 8, 2022,¹ Dr. Baracker sought to obtain an unconditioned/unrestricted license under Okla. Admin. Code 510:10-3-1 (licensure by equivalency) and sought approval to take the COMVEX exam to prove her medical knowledge.
- 7. Dr. Baracker has been working with Klamath Health Partnership for several months as a Patient Care Specialist and then a Pharmacy Program Specialist. She has developed significant relationships with this organization, which hopes to hire her as a physician when she obtains her unrestricted medical license. Prior to obtaining her Oregon license, she seeks to have the conditions lifted on her Oklahoma license and obtain full licensure.
- 8. Pursuant to Okla. Admin. Code 510:10-3-1, to obtain licensure, an applicant must complete one year of postgraduate training at an ACGME or American Osteopathic Association ("AOA") residency. In the event an applicant hasn't completed a residence, then the experience can be based on equivalent education.
 - 9. The one-year equivalent education must include the following:

- b. Two months general internal medicine
- c. One month general surgery
- d. One month obstetrics/gynecology
- e. One month pediatrics
- f. Three months of selectives (defined as one of the core categories in a-e or Emergency medicine)
- g. Three months of electives (any category chosen by the student)
- 10. Dr. Barracker's post-graduate training fulfills all the requirements for a licensure by equivalency.
- 11. Dr. Baracker completed a PGY-1 year with the Sparrow/Michigan State University Family Medicine Residency Program ("Sparrow"). This was a twelve-month program. The confirmation of her competition of PGY-1 is attached hereto as Exhibit 1.
- 12. Dr. Baracker trained at the Montana Family Medicine Residency ("Montana") for what amounts to ten months, as further described herein. The confirmation of her training at Montana is attached as Exhibit 2.
- 13. Dr. Baracker trained at McAlester for what amounts to four months, as further described herein. The confirmation of her training at McAlester is attached as Exhibit 3.
- 14. As shown on Exhibit 1, while at the Sparrow PGY-1 program, Dr. Baracker completed 3 months (12 weeks) of family medicine ambulatory clinic, 1 month (4 weeks) surgery, 1 month (4 weeks) nursery, 3 months (12 weeks) family medicine in-patient care, 1 month (4 weeks) pediatric in-patient, 1 month (4 weeks) emergency medicine, 1 month (4 weeks)

osteopathic manipulative medicine, 1 month (4 weeks) intensive care, and 1 month (4 weeks) obstetrics and gynecology.

- 15. As shown on Exhibit 2, while at Montana, Dr. Baracker completed .5 month (2 weeks) of outpatient continuity clinic, 1 month (4 weeks) outpatient pediatrics, .5 month (2 weeks) geriatrics, .5 month (2 weeks) orthopedics, 1 month (4 weeks) pediatric emergency, 1.5 months (6 weeks) of elective, 2 weeks of management of health systems, 1 week of oral health, 1.25 months (5 weeks) obstetrics, and 2.5 months (8 weeks) family medicine inpatient service/nocturnist.
- 16. As shown on Exhibit 3, while at McAlester, Dr. Baracker completed 1 month (4 weeks) inpatient psychiatry, 1 month (4 weeks) radiology, .5 month (2 weeks) sports medicine, .5 month (2 weeks) family medicine.
- 17. Dr. Baracker's training has successfully completed the Okla. Admin. Code 510:10-3-1 equivalent educational program and meets the one-year equivalent education categories necessary for licensure.
- 18. Further, Dr. Baracker took the COMVEX exam on February 12, 2024, with a passing score, showing her medical proficiency. A copy of the scores is attached hereto as Exhibit 4.
- 19. Since obtaining her license, she has not remained idle in furthering her medical knowledge. In 2022, Dr. Baracker took 294 hours of CME. In 2023, Dr. Baracker took 359.75 hours of CME. So far in 2024, Dr. Baracker has taken 28.5 hours of CME. A significant number of these courses focused on her chosen field of study, family medicine. Dr. Baracker provides a list of these courses attached hereto as Exhibit 5.

- 20. Since obtaining her conditioned license, she has continued to give back to her local community, a longstanding practice deeply ingrained in her personal history and character. Dr. Baracker attaches her CV, which details her volunteer experience, as Exhibit 6.
- 21. Evidence of her character, temperament, and knowledge can be further shown through the many letters of recommendation in support of Dr. Baracker,² which are attached as a combined Exhibit 7.
 - 22. A few select quotations are listed below:
 - a. From a medical school classmate: "She carried herself with integrity throughout, and anyone who knew her in school would attend to her strong sense of justice and commitment to do what was right for her future patients." *Dr. Adam Brown, D.O.,* 2023.



This matter comes on for consideration before the Oklahoma State Board of Osteopathic Examiners ("Board") at a regular meeting of the Board on September 21, 2023. James Magnusson, D.O. ("Dr. Magnusson"), appeared in person without counsel to request reinstatement of his Oklahoma osteopathic medical license. The Board's Director of Licensing, Christi Aquino, also appeared and gave testimony.

This Order is issued pursuant to the Oklahoma Osteopathic Medicine Act, 59 O.S. § 620 *et. seq.*, and the Oklahoma Administrative Procedures Act, 75 O.S. § 250 *et. seq.*

After reviewing Dr. Magnusson's Application and hearing sworn testimony, the Board entered this Interim Order Tabling Application ("Order"). Future consideration of this Application will occur upon the completion of the following terms and conditions:

- 1. In order to protect the public, Dr. Magnusson shall undergo a clinical evaluation in the specialty of plastic/reconstructive surgery, at an entity approved by the Board.
 - a. Dr. Magnusson shall sign all authorizations necessary to release the evaluation findings directly to the Board.
- 2. In order to protect the public, Dr. Magnusson shall take the appropriate Continuing Medical Education (CMEs) to be current on all CME requirements, providing documentation for proof of completion.
- 3. Dr. Magnusson's Application shall remain tabled until such time as the Board receives the requested documentation and/or information in this Order.
- 4. Dr. Magnusson shall bear the financial costs of any expenses incurred herein, including but not limited to the cost of any hearings, investigations, or evaluations that are ordered or result from the Board's consideration of Dr. Magnusson's Application.
- 5. Following receipt of the requested documentation and information, Dr. Magnusson

- will be scheduled to appear before the Board for review of all documents and for any other issues raised by Dr. Magnusson's Application and history.
- 6. This Order is not a final determination of this Board and is therefore not appealable as a final order.
- 7. The Board has not reached any final determination in the Application, and nothing in this Order shall guarantee further licensure of Dr. Magnusson.
- 8. This Order is a public record and, therefore, subject to the Oklahoma Open Records Act.

DEFENDANT MARY KATHRYN MERCER, D.O.'S APPLICATION TO REINSTATE LICENSE WITH CONDITIONS

Comes now Defendant, Mary Kathryn Mercer, D.O. ("Dr. Mercer") and for her Application to Reinstate License with Conditions, alleges and states as follows:

FACTUAL BACKGROUND

- 1. Dr. Mercer previously held Oklahoma Osteopathic Medical License No. 2887.
- 2. On or about September 15, 2016, the Oklahoma State Board of Osteopathic Examiners (the "Board") entered an Interim Order of Suspension.
- On or about December 14, 2017, the Board entered an Order Modifying Interim Order of Suspension whereby it set out certain conditions and tasks Dr. Mercer must complete prior to reinstatement.
- 4. Dr. Mercer has previously provided the Board with proof that she completed all of the requirements set forth in the December 14, 2017 Order, including the requirement that she obtain an evaluation at CPEP, which she completed July 20-21, 2022.

- 5. After completing the evaluation, CPEP concluded that Dr. Mercer was "safe to practice with recommendations including a recommendation for structured remediation and a period of oversight". See CPEP report at p. 3, attached hereto as Exhibit "A".
- 6. According to CPEP, this finding means that Dr. Mercer can obtain this remediation while practicing. For this reason, the CPEP program of structured remediation **REQUIRES** that the physician have an active medical license.
- 7. On December 14, 2023, Dr. Mercer appeared before the Board at the Board staff's request to report on the status of her completion of the tasks ordered by the Board in the December 14, 2017 Board Order. At this meeting, the Board reviewed the CPEP evaluation report and advised Dr. Mercer to complete all recommendations of CPEP <u>prior</u> to seeking reinstatement of her license.
- 8. After the December 14, 2023 Board meeting, Dr. Mercer, as well as Board staff, reached out to CPEP and confirmed that the remediation program envisioned by CPEP can <u>only</u> be obtained if the physician has an active medical license.

REQUESTED RELIEF

For the reasons set forth above, Dr. Mercer respectfully requests that her license be reinstated to an active status under the following conditions:

- That the Board immediately reinstate Dr. Mercer's medical license so as to allow her to complete the CPEP remediation program.
- 2. That Dr. Mercer's employment setting wherein she will complete the CPEP remediation program will be approved in advance by the Board.
- 3. That upon providing proof of completion of the CPEP remediation program, Dr. Mercer may appear before the Board and request modification of her conditional medical license.

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I. Executive Summary

A. Background

CPEP, the Center for Personalized Education for Professionals, designed this Assessment for Mary Kathryn Mercer, D.O. to evaluate her in internal medicine. The CPEP Medical Director and staff reviewed information that the Oklahoma State Board of Osteopathic Examiners (Board) and Dr. Mercer provided for the Assessment. According to the Board's Second Order Modifying Interim Order of Suspension dated October 11, 2022, which modified two previous Orders (2016 and 2017), Dr. Mercer's license remained suspend, and she was required to follow recommendations from her Professional Renewal Center Evaluation including a CPEP Evaluation among other requirements. Dr. Mercer has been away from clinical practice since 2016.

B. Assessment Findings and Overall Recommendations

The range of possible Assessment findings include performance that is consistent with <u>one</u> of the following categories:

- a. Safe to practice with no or limited recommendations (safe to practice independently while remediating educational needs through ongoing professional development with or without informal collegial support).
- b. Safe to practice with recommendations (safe to practice independently while remediating educational needs in a CPEP Education Plan or similar setting that incorporates structure, support, oversight and accountability).
- c. Not safe to practice independently at this time (CPEP opines that formal remediation in a residency, fellowship or formal training setting is recommended).

Based on Dr. Mercer's performance during this Assessment and the extent of educational needs identified, CPEP opines that Dr. Mercer's performance is consistent with category (b), safe to practice with recommendations including a recommendation for structured remediation and a period of oversight. The educational needs identified in this Assessment are listed in Section III. Assessment Findings.

Health Recommendations

Dr. Mercer submitted several health-related documents for this Assessment. Review of this information revealed health conditions that have the potential to impact her ability to return to clinical practice and remediate her educational needs. CPEP noted that recommendations for further evaluations and participation in a health professionals program were made. CPEP recommends that Dr. Mercer follow all practice and health recommendations and any recommendations and requirements of the Board. Dr. Mercer's health will need to be optimally controlled and managed for her to safely practice and benefit from any educational endeavors.

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Educational Recommendations

CPEP believes it would be best for Dr. Mercer to first address all health and practice-related requirements prior to attempting to engage in any educational remediation activities.

Because Dr. Mercer demonstrated more significant educational needs, CPEP cannot guarantee that she will be able to access the educational resources needed for her to successfully address these needs outside of a formal training setting. In light of the extent of the educational needs identified, any remediation would require interest by the Board, extensive resources, and full commitment by Dr. Mercer.

CPEP recognizes that decisions about licensing or privileging are made at the local level and based on many factors other than the Assessment.

The following educational recommendations provide the foundation for structured remediation. Further detailed educational planning may include additional activities.

- Point of Care (PoC) Experience: Dr. Mercer should participate in a clinical experience to
 provide the necessary support required as she returns to clinical practice. The PoC
 experience is intended to allow appropriately graduated levels of independence through
 periods of observation and oversight as Dr. Mercer addresses immediate practice needs.
- Educational Preceptor: Dr. Mercer should establish a relationship with an experienced
 educational preceptor in internal medicine. This involves regularly scheduled meetings to
 review cases and documentation, discuss decisions related to those cases, review specific
 topics, and make plans for future learning. The preceptor serves as an educator and is not
 intended to function as a practice monitor.
- Continuing Medical Education (CME) and Self-Study: Dr. Mercer should engage in CME
 courses and self-study which include, but are not limited to, the topics indicated in areas of
 demonstrated need.
- Documentation: Completion of a medical record keeping course.

Limitations

CPEP's findings are based on the performance of the participant during the Assessment process. No direct observation of the participant in the procedural setting occurs. Therefore, conclusions address only whether the participant possesses the knowledge and judgment necessary to perform, without predicting actual behavior. CPEP is unable to evaluate whether a participant possesses the technical skills required in a procedural setting. Such concerns need to be addressed through direct observation of the participant's abilities by peer professionals. Concerns about complication rates should be addressed through comparison with published data.

The Assessment is not designed to provide an in-depth evaluation of fraudulent or unethical practice patterns, inappropriate behavior with patients, or the participant's boundaries with patients; nor is it designed to evaluate the consequences of physical or mental health disorders.

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II. Personalization of Assessment Process

An Associate Medical Director oversees the Assessment to ensure that the process is reflective of the participant's particular practice and that the results accurately reflect the participant's performance. Selection of testing modalities varies with each Assessment, using specific components from the table below that are determined to be appropriate for each participant's practice.

The table below outlines the processes and test modalities typically used in an Assessment and how each modality contributes to an Assessment.

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Dr. Mercer's Assessment is personalized in the following manner:

- Patient Charts: Because Dr. Mercer has been out of practice since 2016, CPEP did not request charts.
- Clinical Interviews: Three clinical interviews were conducted by board-certified internists. The consultants based the interviews on hypothetical cases and topic-based discussions.
- Simulated Patient (SP) Encounters: The exercise included three 20-minute remote format patient encounters. The SP cases were selected to represent conditions typically seen in the participant's internal medicine setting.
- SP Documentation Exercise: The exercise involved documentation of each interview with
- Electrocardiogram (ECG) Interpretation: The exercise included one ECG tracing for which the ventricular rate, PR interval, QRS duration, QT interval, and QRS axis were requested, and 10 ECG tracings for which a written description, interpretation, and course of action were requested.
- Multiple-Choice Question Examination: The multiple-choice examination included one 110-question exam.

Dr. Mercer does not include osteopathic manipulative treatment (OMT) as part of her practice; therefore, this topic was not discussed.

III. Assessment Findings

A. Principles and Practice; Patient Care; and Application of Knowledge

CPEP's findings of Dr. Mercer's Medical Knowledge and Patient Care are based on the activities described above.

1. Medical Knowledge

During this Assessment, Dr. Mercer demonstrated a fair fund of knowledge with multiple gaps and areas in which her knowledge lacked depth.

The following paragraphs are intended to provide an understanding of Dr. Mercer's overall demonstration of medical knowledge, supported by examples of strengths and examples of areas of identified need. It is not intended to provide a comprehensive recounting of all topics discussed. The list following the discussion includes the educational needs described as well as additional educational needs that were identified during the Assessment.

Dr. Mercer demonstrated acceptable knowledge of the diagnosis of migraine headaches, symptoms of Parkinson's disease, causes of abdominal pain, causes of abnormal liver function tests, role of anti-inflammatories and steroids in the management of acute gout attack, symptoms of fibromyalgia, red-flag symptoms in low back pain, non-opioid medication options to treat pain, and the role of state prescription drug monitoring program review for patients being prescribed controlled substances. She also had adequate knowledge of the diagnosis of urinary tract infections, triggers and the use of albuterol in asthma, antihypertensive medication classes,

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symptoms and medications for benign prostatic hypertrophy, prostate cancer screening, bleeding risk associated with low platelets, risks of unopposed estrogen therapy in females with a uterus, and antidepressant medication options. She also knew that human papilloma virus is a sexually transmitted disease that can increase cervical cancer risk.

Dr. Mercer's overall medical knowledge appeared to lack depth, and she demonstrated inadequate knowledge in multiple areas such as initial management of acute coronary syndrome, common presentation of angina, role of beta blockers in coronary artery disease management, secondary hypertension, difference between hypertensive urgency and emergency, treatment of hyperlipidemia, diabetes mellitus management guidelines and newer medications, osteoporosis, health maintenance, anemia, indications for imaging in low back pain, treatment of recurrent gout, diagnosis of fibromyalgia, acute and chronic management of migraine headaches, urinary incontinence, management of menopausal symptoms, as well as the difference between addiction and dependence.

Dr. Mercer completed a written ECG interpretation examination. She was asked to note the rate, intervals, and axis for one normal ECG and to provide descriptions, interpretations, and course of action for ten ECG tracings representing various cardiac conditions. Her performance on this exercise was inadequate.

Dr. Mercer completed one multiple-choice exam in ambulatory care. She achieved a total equated percent correct score of 66 with a percentile rank of 16. Her performance suggests the need for further study in ambulatory care.

The list below includes the educational needs discussed above as well as additional limited educational needs that were identified during the Assessment.

 - Role of vaginal estrogen therapy in management of urinary complaints;
- Women's health:
 - o Endometrial cancer: risk factors;
 - o Menopause:
 - Definition;
 - Review of current management, including but not limited to, contraindications to estrogen therapy and non-hormonal options.

2. Clinical Judgment and Reasoning

Dr. Mercer's clinical judgment and reasoning, as demonstrated during this Assessment, were generally inadequate with a few exceptions.

Dr. Mercer's information gathering for the hypothetical scenarios was variable. She gathered acceptable information for a hypothetical elderly patient with increased somnolence and another with asthma symptoms. However, her information gathering for scenarios of chronic stable coronary artery disease, anxiety/panic attacks, thrombocytopenia, and abnormal uterine bleeding was incomplete. In some discussions such as hypertensive urgency, anemia, and abdominal pain, her data gathering was disorganized and inadequate.

An area of relative strength for Dr. Mercer was recognition of the potential for introgenesis with commonly prescribed medications. She recognized that nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory drugs (NSAIDs) should be used with caution in patients with chronic kidney disease and peptic ulcer disease. She recognized that the diaretic hydrochlorothiazide could be causing more urinary incontinence in one scenario and be a trigger for gout in another.

Dr. Mercer appeared to recognize some of her limitations of knowledge and described appropriate use of consultants in the hypothetical discussions.

Dr. Mercer's ability to generate broad differential diagnoses was inadequate. For example, her described differential diagnoses for abdominal pain, anxiety symptoms, increased somnolence, abnormal kidney function, and anemia lacked structured and were overall, incomplete.

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During the interviews, Dr. Mercer struggled to adequately recognize acuity of illness. She failed to recognize the high-acuity condition urosepsis in a hypothetical elderly male patient with urinary tract infection. She did not recognize the acuity of illness for a scenario of chest pain and another of hypertensive urgency. She did not inquire about vital signs or physical examinations to fully assess severity of illness in one hypothetical patient with anemia and another with abnormal uterine bleeding. Dr. Mercer's described approach to a scenario of sciatica suggested that she misjudged the situation as being higher acuity than supported by the presentation.

Dr. Mercer's hypothetical patient care was significantly impacted by her broad knowledge deficiencies. Her approaches to scenarios of diabetes, hyperlipidemia, osteoporosis, migraine headache, recurrent gout, sciatica, menopausal symptoms, urinary incontinence, and health maintenance were inadequate. In addition, her described evaluations for hypothetical patients with chest pain, anemia, anxiety, and abnormal uterine bleeding were incomplete.

Limited discussions about opioid prescribing were included in Dr. Mercer's Assessment, but some concerns were identified. Her recommendations for opioid medications in scenarios of acute low back pain and acute gout attack were inappropriate, according to the consultants. Dr. Mercer also had limitations in her knowledge of the current guidelines for opioid prescribing for chronic pain management. She did correctly recognize that review of the state prescription drug monitoring program and urine drug testing should be utilized in patients on chronic opioids and was able to discuss some non-opioid pain medications. However, she did not readily recommend non-pharmacologic therapies during discussions.

Since patient charts were not available for Dr. Mercer's practice of internal medicine for this Assessment, CPEP is unable to comment about Dr. Mercer's application of knowledge in actual patient care.

The list below includes the educational needs discussed above as well as additional limited educational needs that were identified during the Assessment.

Educational Needs - Clinical Judgment and Reasoning

- Consistent ability to gather information in a logical, organized, and complete fashion;
- Structured formulation of differential diagnoses;
- Consistent ability to correctly assess acuity of illness and make appropriate plans;
- · Appropriate prescribing of opioid medications;
- Application of evidence-based medical principles to patient care;
- Treatment planning beginning to end.

3. Patient Care Documentation

a. Review of Documentation - Patient Charts

Dr. Mercer's patient care documentation was evaluated solely based on notes written at CPEP, as charts from her former practice were not requested. For this reason, no assessment of her ability to manage and organize a complete chart can be made.

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b. Review of Documentation - Simulated Patient (SP) Encounter Notes

Dr. Mercer was asked to document a progress note following each of the remote format SP encounters. Her notes were documented using an electronic medical record (EMR) and thus contained all relevant components of a single visit progress note. However Dr. Mercer did not consistently complete each section.

Dr. Mercer documented a chief complaint in only one of the three notes. She did not include a history of present illness (HPI) except for the limited comments made regarding the appropriate system mentioned in the very comprehensive, system-specific ROS that was included. She documented past medical history (PMH), past surgical history (PSH), medications, allergies, social history (SH) and family history (FH). Of note, the medications included for the abdominal pain patient were incorrectly documented. She did not document a physical exam.

The Assessment consisted of only specific diagnoses recorded in the Diagnoses and Assessment sections within the EMR templates. Although essentially a brief differential diagnosis was included, there was no narrative of her clinical thinking documented. Dr. Mercer did not indicate on what data these diagnoses were based, which diagnosis was most likely or how she would move forward to confirm the correct diagnosis.

For Plan of Care, Dr. Mercer recommended some medications and included the dose and frequency of use. Refills were not mentioned. In the case of the patient with cough, Dr. Mercer suggested performing pulmonary function tests and a referral to an otolaryngologist if the patient did not show significant improvement on the prescribed medications. No specific follow-up was documented for the other cases.

Although Dr. Mercer attempted to utilize an EMR to document her patient encounters, the notes were incomplete and lacked sufficient detail. Overall, her documentation was in need of improvement.

Educational Needs – Documentation

· Sufficient level of detail for all components of the progress note.

B. Practice-based Learning

Dr. Mercer reported 80 hours of continuing medical education (CME) activities in the past 36 months and provided limited detail about the specific CME activities; thus, CPEP is unable to comment as to whether she is selecting CME activities that were pertinent to the field of internal medicine. She described a limited variety of medical-content resources.

Educational Needs - Practice-based Learning

- Appropriate quantity and selection of CME activities pertinent to internal medicine;
- Appropriate variety of medical content resources, including internet-based resources.

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C. Communication Skills

1. Physician-Patient Communication Evaluation

The three Simulated Patients presented via videoconference with chronic cough, abdominal pain, and uncontrolled blood pressure.

Dr. Mercer initially presented as professional, warm, and straight forward with all three SPs having the same or improved impressions at the end of the interview, specifically commenting that her balance of professionalism and friendliness was exceptional. She followed a logical sequence and asked open-ended questions throughout the interview. Dr. Mercer was easy to understand with good voice volume. The education provided was well developed and delivered primarily in simple lay language. All three SPs understood the treatment plans. All three SPs rated Dr. Mercer's empathy at high with mention made about personalizing, a sense of respect, and verbal expressions. All three SPs would return to see Dr. Mercer citing a calm and friendly demeanor.

Some areas of improvement were noted. Dr. Mercer did not set expectations for the patient encounter initially. She asked leading questions, i.e., "you don't do/have" and "you're not." Dr. Mercer had a tendency to interrupt the SPs which impeded their ability to fully use their own words to describe their concerns. There was little in the way of verbal space for the SPs to ask questions or ask for clarification. Although Dr. Mercer used some open-ended questions throughout, there were too few in total. The pace of the interviews was too brisk, and Dr. Mercer asked for information more than once indicating that she was not listening well.

The communication consultant had primarily positive impressions of Dr. Mercer's communication skills with a couple of areas for improvement. Dr. Mercer displayed excellent interpersonal skills including eye contact, humor, personalization, and positive reinforcement. However, there were constant interruptions and a failure to get the SPs' stories. These were physician-dominated interviews that ran quickly. At times information given earlier in the interview was asked for again, appearing to be asked not for clarity but because the information was not heard or forgotten. As to the structural issues at the beginning of the encounter, try to develop an opening statement then immediately asking the patients to express their concerns and objectives for the encounter in their own words.

Overall, Dr. Mercer demonstrated mostly adequate communication skills with some areas of improvement.

Educational Needs

Physician-Patient Communication Skills

- · Set expectation with patient at the beginning on encounter;
- Avoid interrupting;
- Allow patients an opportunity to use their own words to describe concerns;
- · Slow pace of patient encounter;
- Develop an opening statement and then give patients an opportunity to express their concerns.

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2.Inter-Professional Communication Skills

Dr. Mercer's communication skills were consistently professional throughout the Assessment, both with the consultants and CPEP staff.

Educational Needs Inter-Professional Communication Skills

· None identified.

D. Professionalism

Nothing that transpired during this Assessment raised questions about Dr. Mercer's professionalism.

E. Systems-based Practice

The Assessment yielded inadequate data upon which to accurately comment on Dr. Mercer's awareness of the larger context and system of health care and the ability to effectively call on system resources to provide care that is of optimal value.

F. Other

1. Review of Health Information and Neuropsychological Evaluation

Dr. Mercer submitted several health-related documents for this Assessment. Review of this information revealed health conditions that have the potential to impact her ability to return to clinical practice and remediate her educational needs. CPEP noted that recommendations for further evaluations and participation in a health professionals program were made. CPEP recommends that Dr. Mercer follow all practice and health recommendations and any recommendations and requirements of the Board. Dr. Mercer's health will need to be optimally controlled and managed for her to safely practice and benefit from any educational endeavors.

2. Cognitive Function Screen

Dr. Mercer's Assessment did not include cognitive function screening since she had formal neuropsychological testing done elsewhere.

3. Observations of Behavior and Additional Considerations

Dr. Mercer was pleasant and cooperative toward CPEP staff and clinical consultants, and she conducted herself in a professional manner throughout the Assessment. She submitted all the required documentation in a timely manner.

Electrocardiogram Interpretation Exercise Results

Dr. Mercer's responses to the ECG examination were considered within the context of her internal medicine training.

Task #1

Note the rate, intervals, and axis for one normal ECG: Dr. Mercer was incorrect everything, except rate.

Task #2

Provide a description, interpretation, and course of action for 11 ECG tracings representing various cardiac conditions:

Organization: Dr. Mercer's notes did not show that she had a logical scheme to evaluate ECGs.

Dr. Mercer described one tracing correctly, was partially correct for seven, and incorrect for two:

- Did not describe/accurately describe/ describe all/localize ST/T abnormalities on several tracings;
- Over-interpretation of T waves on one tracing;
- Did not describe /identify/identify origin of underlying rhythm on seven tracings;
- Did not describe/localize P wave abnormalities on one tracing;
- Over-interpretation of P waves on one tracing;
- Did not describe RSR' in V1-V2 on one tracing;
- · Did not describe poor R wave progression on one tracing;
- · Did not describe all Q waves on one tracing;
- Mis-identified delta wave on one tracing;
- Over-interpretation of QT interval on one tracing;

Dr. Mercer's interpretations were correct in three, partially correct for five, and incorrect for two:

- Did not accurately describe/identify conduction system disorders: LBBB, IRBBB, IVCD/LBBB;
- Did not identify RAE/LAE on one tracing;
- Did not identify inferior wall MI as being of indeterminate age on one tracing;
- Of the five tracings for which by Mercer needed to consider infarct or ischemia as the cause of the pattern, she identified four;

Dr. Mercer's plans were correct and thorough in two instances, partially correct for three, and incorrect for five:

- Did not compare to old ECG on three tracings;
- Two plans were incorrect due to incorrect interpretation;
- Did not check for BP or for CHF on one tracing;
- Did not evaluate causes of TC on two tracings;

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- Did not initiate ACS management on two tracings;
- Five patients might have been put at risk by Mercer's plans; two for not initiating ACS management; two for not evaluating causes of TC; one for not checking BP or for CHF.

The consultant concluded that by Dr. Mercer did not demonstrate adequate ability to interpret ECGs. The main issue identified was formulating appropriate plans based on electrocardiographic findings.

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Appendix II

Description of Evaluation Tools

Selection of the testing modalities varies with each Assessment, using the specific components that are determined to be appropriate for each participant's situation.

Structured Clinical Interviews

Clinical Interviews are oral evaluations of the participant conducted by physicians, physician-assistant or advanced practice nursing consultants in the same specialty area. Each consultant is certified through a Board recognized by the American Board of Medical Specialties (ABMS), the American Osteopathic Association (AOA), the National Commission on Certification of Physician Assistants (NCCPA) or the American Nurses Credentialing Center (ANCC). The interview is conducted in the presence of the Associate Medical Director or Associate Nursing Director. The consultant asks about patient care management based on charts submitted by the participant and hypothetical case scenarios. Radiologic studies or recordings of surgical procedures may also be used in the interview process. These 90-minute oral interviews are used to evaluate the participant's medical knowledge, clinical judgment, and peer communication skills.

Note: On occasion, participants are unable to provide charts from their practice, either because they have not been in practice for a number of years or because the facility at which they work is unable or unwilling to release them. In these situations, hypothetical case scenarios are used as the basis for the interviews.

Multiple-Choice Examination

Physician-participants may be given timed multiple-choice examinations. The examinations are provided and scored by the National Board of Medical Examiners (NBME).

Physician assistants may also be given a timed multiple-choice examination or may be requested to submit scores from a recent Physician Assistant National Recertifying Examination (PANRE) practice examination.

Difficult Airway Simulation

Participants may complete a series of simulated airway management scenarios using a high-fidelity simulator. The scenarios are designed to test both technical and non-technical skills.

Fundamentals of Laparoscopic Surgery

Participants performing laparoscopic surgery may participate in the Fundamentals of Laparoscopic Surgery (FLS) Program, which is offered by the Society of American Gastrointestinal and Endoscopic Surgeons (SAGES). The FLS Program involves study materials, hands-on manual skills practice, and an exam composed of a multiple-choice exam and assessment of manual skills using an FLS Laparoscopic Trainer Box and scored by SAGES.

Electrocardiogram (ECG) Interpretation

Participants whose practice includes reading ECG tracings are presented one ECG for which the

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ventricular rate, PR interval, QRS duration, QT interval, and QRS axis are requested, and 10 ECG tracings for which an interpretation and course of action are requested.

Fetal Monitor Strip (FMS) Interpretation

Participants providing obstetric care in their practice are asked to read 12 FMSs and provide an interpretation and course of action for each strip.

Clinician-Patient Communication Evaluation

Effective communication and formation of therapeutic clinician-patient relationships are assessed through the use of SP encounters. The provider-participant conducts patient interviews in a simulated exam-room setting. The patient cases are selected based on the participant's specialty area. Both the SPs and the participant evaluate the interaction. The patient encounters are recorded and analyzed by a communication consultant.

Patient Care Documentation

Participants are asked to submit redacted copies of patient charts. The charts are reviewed for documentation legibility, content, consistency, and accuracy. The participant's attention to pertinent medical details is noted.

Review of Documentation - Simulated Patient Encounter Progress Notes

Following the SP encounters, the participant is asked to document each interaction in a chart note. The participant may hand-write, type or dictate the notes, or use templates brought from their practice. Radiologists who do not typically interact with patients in their professional roles are given a documentation exercise using digitally reproduced radiographic images.

Cognitive Function Screen

MicroCogTM, a computer-based assessment of cognitive skills, is a screening test to help determine which provider-participants should be given a complete neuropsychological work-up. The test is viewed as a screening instrument only and is not diagnostic.

This screening test does not require proficiency with computers; a proctor is available to answer questions about test instructions. Test performance or expected test performance can be impacted by a number of factors, including normal aging and background. A neuropsychologist analyzes the test results, taking these factors into account.

Review of Health Information

The participant is asked to submit the findings from a recent physical examination as well as hearing and vision screens. If indicated, program staff requests information related to specific health concerns.

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Appendix III

CPEP Educational Recommendations: Explanations and Implications

Note: CPEP conducts Assessments and Educational Interventions for physicians, physician assistants, advanced practice nurses, and podiatrists, and the following is applicable to all healthcare providers that are evaluated by CPEP.

Performance on a CPEP Assessment falls along a broad spectrum. Often, for both the participant involved and the referring organization, the critical questions are, "What does this mean?" and "How do I/we move forward from here?" CPEP provides direction through the Educational Recommendations that are provided in the Assessment Report.

While the educational activities that would benefit a participant are very specific to that individual, CPEP Educational Recommendations fall into three broad categories.

Independently address educational needs

No participant is expected to perform perfectly during an Assessment, and no physician knows everything. Some participants who participate in an Assessment demonstrate minimal or limited educational needs, which we believe they should be able to address independently through self-study, CME, and other resources. We recommend that these participants incorporate these topics into their ongoing professional education activities. Although CPEP does not use the terms "pass" or "fail," if thinking along those terms, it is reasonable to consider that an individual receiving this recommendation has "passed" the Assessment.

The wording used to convey this in an Assessment Report is typically similar to the following: "CPEP believes that Dr./Mr./Ms. Smith should have the resources to address these educational needs independently, without the benefit of an Educational Intervention. All professionals have a responsibility for self-directed, ongoing learning and Dr./Mr./Ms. Smith should continue to make this a part of his work."

Formal Training Setting

On the other end of the spectrum, some participants demonstrate educational needs that are of a quantity or quality such that CPEP believes that they are not equipped with the resources to address their educational needs while they continue to practice. CPEP recommends that these participants address their educational needs in a formal training setting such as a residency, fellowship, or other structured setting. Our opinion is that it would not be safe for this participant to practice independently; they are in need of the structure and rigor of an academic setting to provide an intensive and highly supervised educational experience. As stated previously, CPEP does not use the terms "pass" or "fail." However, it is reasonable to consider that an individual receiving this recommendation has "failed" the Assessment.

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CPEP acknowledges that residency positions may be difficult for practicing participants to secure; therefore, the wording residency-like setting is intended to suggest that other situations may be acceptable, such as a voluntary position in a training setting, a fellowship, or other such situation in which the participant can benefit from learning in a formal training or educational setting. To further clarify, a recommendation that an individual address their educational needs in a training setting does not necessarily indicate that the equivalent of a full residency be completed; the specific needs of the participant will vary and the training might range from one year or longer.

The wording used in an Assessment Report to convey such a recommendation will be similar to the following: "Because of the extent of the deficiencies identified, CPEP believes that Dr./Mr./Ms. Smith should retrain in a residency or residency-like setting. CPEP does not believe that Dr./Mr./Ms. Smith demonstrated the ability to remain in independent practice while attempting to remediate his clinical skills."

Structured Educational Intervention

In the middle of the spectrum are those participants who demonstrate educational needs that CPEP believes should be addressed with external structure, oversight, and/or some level of supervision. These participants should be able to address their educational needs while they continue or return to practice.

The Educational Recommendations in the Assessment Report will read something comparable to: "CPEP recommends that Dr./Mr./Ms. Smith participate in structured, individualized education to address the identified areas of need." Participants and referring organizations have found value in CPEP Education Services, through which we provide expertise in developing specific and clear educational objectives, structure in the educational process, and a means by which integration and implementation of new learning and approaches can be demonstrated. CPEP Education Services are available, if desired and requested by the participant or referring organization, and would include development of an Educational Intervention Plan (a detailed learning contract) and ongoing support, monitoring, and oversight during the course of the participant's educational process. FINDINGS OF FACT, CONCLUSIONS OF LAW AND AGREED ORDER OF DEFERRED PROSECUTION

This matter comes before the Oklahoma State Board of Osteopathic Examiners [Board] at a hearing held before the Board on June 16, 2016, in the above-styled individual proceeding. The Board is represented by the Special Prosecutor for the Board, Patricia High of Patricia L. High, P.C. The Respondent, Mary Kathryn Mercer, D.O. [Dr. Mercer] and her counsel of record, Ryan W. Hearne, appear in person at the hearing.

The Board incorporates by reference the Complaint as a part of these Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Agreed Order as if it appeared in full herein. The Board adopts, by clear and convincing evidence, the following Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Dr. Mercer is the holder of a license issued by the Board to practice osteopathic medicine in the State of Oklahoma, License No. 2887. As of the date of this Order, the license issued to Dr. Mercer is in good standing.

- 2. The Board has previously disciplined Dr. Mercer for disruptive behavior and other violations of the Oklahoma Osteopathic Medicine Act. On December 10, 2009, Dr. Mercer was placed on a two-year Preceptorship, ordered to submit to random urine drug screens, reduce her work-load and participate in therapeutic counseling. That Order was terminated for good cause on December 8, 2011.
- 3. After being contacted by Board Investigators about allegations in the current Complaint, Dr. Mercer independently initiated the request for evaluation by Acumen Assessments.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Board has jurisdiction to hear this matter pursuant to the Oklahoma Osteopathic Medicine Act, 59 O.S. § 640 et. seq., Rules of the Board, 510 OAC § 1-1-1 et. seq. and the Oklahoma Administrative Procedures Act, 75 O.S. § 250 et. seq. The Board concludes that, based upon Dr. Mercer's agreement to follow the recommendations of Acumen Assessments, Dr. Mercer's license shall remain in effect. The Board further concludes that for good cause shown, the prosecution of this case shall be deferred for a period of two (2) years so long as Dr. Mercer remains compliant with the following terms and conditions.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Board that Dr. Mercer's license to practice osteopathic medicine in the State of Oklahoma remains in effect, and unrestricted, and that the following shall apply:

1. The prosecution of this case shall be deferred for two (2) years until on or about June 21, 2018, and that no sanction will apply if Dr. Mercer timely complies with all criteria contained herein.

- 2. Dr. Mercer shall enter into a monitoring contract with OHPP for a period of time deemed appropriate by that program. OHPP is to address Dr. Mercer's disruptive behavior.
- 3. Dr. Mercer shall acquire an OHPP approved professional coach to help her mediate the issues raised in the Acumen Assessment Report. The Coach is to be provided a copy of said Assessment and be given unrestricted communication with Acumen Assessments, OHPP, and the Board. If the Coach requires compensation, it is to be done at Dr. Mercer's expense.
- Dr. Mercer shall, at her own expense, acquire an OHPP approved psychiatrist to pursue a trial of a mood stabilizer, perhaps, Lamictal. This psychiatrist shall be provided a copy of the Acumen report and have unrestricted communication with Acumen, OHPP, and the Board. Dr. Mercer shall follow the recommendations of the psychiatrist as to the length and frequency of visits.
- 5. Dr. Mercer shall acquire a primary care physician. She shall refrain from self-medication.
- 6. Dr. Mercer shall work with Board Staff to acquire a Board approved physician to shadow her in her practice for one day to provide feedback about how she can manage her practice more effectively. Dr. Mercer shall bear the cost of this physician's services. If recommended, this shadowing should be repeated every quarter.
- 7. Pursuant to the plan of action Dr. Mercer put together as part of the Acumen Assessment, she is to make the following changes to her practice:
 - a. She is to stop answering the telephone. That is a staff function.
 - b. She is not to give her cell number to patients.
 - c. She is to save making return phone calls until a time slot at the end of the day.
 - d. She is to work a maximum of eight (8) hours a day in patient encounters.

- e. She is to limit the number of patients she sees in a day to thirty (30).
- f. She is to delegate normal staff functions to staff in order to avoid getting overwhelmed. This includes medical records requests, insurance forms and patient scheduling. In short, she is to utilize her staff as a buffer between her and patients so that she can focus on practicing medicine.
- 8. Her staff is to perform telephone triage of all new patients and shall make it clear before they come in for their first appointment that Dr. Mercer does not practice pain management.
- 9. Board Staff shall have the authority to supervise, monitor and enforce all provisions of this order on behalf of the Board.
- 10. Dr. Mercer shall appear quarterly before the Board to report on her status. Board staff shall have the authority to direct Dr. Mercer to provide documents relevant to the appearance.
- 11. Dr. Mercer shall pay administrative fees and costs incurred in this proceeding in the amount of twenty-five-hundred dollars (\$2500.00). Board staff is authorized to arrange for payment increments. Said amount shall be paid in full six months before Dr. Mercer is eligible for termination of this Order.
- 12. Dr. Mercer shall be responsible for insuring that all reports of professionals are provided directly to the board.
- 13. During the pendency of this deferral period, Dr. Mercer shall permit any representative of the Board to enter her office for official duties.
- 14. If Dr. Mercer fully complies with all the terms and conditions of this Order, it shall be dismissed with prejudice on or about June 21, 2018. Any non-compliance with this

Order shall result in immediate sanction based upon evidence already in hand and based on any newly discovered evidence.

- 15. This Order is remedial in nature.
- 16. This Order is subject to the Open Records Act. and is therefore a public record.

IT IS SO ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED this 16th day of June, 2016.

This was a very positive experience, and they were able to process over 2500 renewal applications through the API during this period which took a significant burden off their processing staff and allowed them to focus on other things.

They manually audited 20% of all renewal applications and found no issues or discrepancies in data. She anticipates being able to audit fewer accounts during their next renewal cycle. She did identify one minor problem, but Alabama's IT team, working with Dale's team were able to quickly resolve the issue.

Questions regarding API:

- Q. Did the API information include all the information from the IMLC renewal application?
 - A. Yes, the API does include all the application information.
- Q. What happens if the doctor needs to complete a 2-step renewal with the board?
 - A. One of the boards currently using the API renewal does require a 2-step renewal process and the board was able to put a hold on the IMLC portion of the application until the 2nd step was completed, and then they can complete the renewal through API.
