Modified CCR Form and Instruction Manual Adopted

At the June 9, 2022 meeting of the Board, changes to both the Certified Corner Record (CCR) form and the Instruction Manual for Oklahoma Certified Corner Records were modified as authorized by the Corner Perpetuation and Filing Act, O.S. Title 65, Sections 3.116-3.123. These changes are intended to clarify some of the confusion in the language and to place more emphasis on certain sections that continue to cause concern for some surveyors.

CENTER OF SECTION: In 2018, OAC 245:15-21-2(b) was revised to include the requirement that the Center Quarter Section Corner must be filed if it is used as control in a survey and monumented, or an existing monument is accepted. While there are Federal instructions in the BLM Manual for establishing the legal center of section, professional land surveyors also must consider long established evidence of the center of section that may not fall in the same place as a calculated position. To perpetuate the center corner for following, it is particularly important for the center of the section to be filed in those instances where the calculated position is not used. It is within the jurisdiction of the PLS to determine when a long-established position for a corner is the best evidence of the center of section location. It follows that the most effective way to perpetuate that position is by filing a CCR and giving the following PLS' the information they need to rely upon that position. To summarize, if the center of the section is used as control in the survey and you monument that position or accept an existing monument at that position, you are required to file a CCR for that position.

CORNERS USED FOR PROPORTIONAL MEASUREMENT: Even though there are few situations in which there is no evidence available for you discover so that you will be able to classify a corner as obliterated, there occasionally are remote locations where there is absolutely no evidence of the location of the original corner. Those corners are to be classified as lost and must be established by proportional measurement. Since the corners used in establishing the single or double proportion are necessary as control in the survey, CCR's must be filed for those corners.

SHOWING OR LISTING SUPPORTING EVIDENCE:

The language in the revised manual and form has been updated to add emphasis to the importance of including supporting evidence to monuments both found and set. Following in the footsteps of the previous surveyor is a foundational surveying principle; so, leaving defensible supporting evidence of why you accepted a monument or why you placed a monument where you did is necessary to give the following surveyors confidence in your position. Of course, those surveyors following you are responsible for verifying the points they use as control, so your CCR's need to be completed in such a way as to fulfill the purpose of the Corner Perpetuation Act which in part reads "the providing for property security and a coherent system of property location and identification; and thereby eliminating the repeated necessity for re-establishment and relocation of such corners once they are established and located."

Only PLS' are charged with the responsibility of the determination and preservation of land boundaries in this state. For almost 44 years, The Corner Perpetuation and Filing Act has provided a platform to assist surveyors to systematically protect the boundaries and to leave lasting footsteps for those surveyors who follow. The Board considers the perpetuation of public land corners as a primary function of surveyor licensure, actively enforces of the provisions of this Act and will continue to work with surveyors to make the instruction manual and form as complete and clear as possible.

Blew Land Surveying, Inc., dba Blew & Associates, CA 5387, and Buckley D. Blew, P.L.S. 1681, Case No. 2021-068 Through Consent: Blew Land Surveying, Inc., dba Blew & Associates issued numerous ALTA/NSPS Land Title Surveys and Elevation Certificates that failed to achieve minimum standards as required by the Oklahoma Minimum Standards for the Practice of Land Surveying. In this regard, Blew Land Surveying, Inc., dba Blew & Associates were found Guilty and assessed an administrative fine of \$2,000. Buckley D. Blew, signed, sealed, and issued the ALTA/NSPS Land Title Surveys that failed to achieve minimum standards as required by the Oklahoma Minimum Standards for the Practice of Land Surveying. In this regard Blew was found Guilty and assessed an administrative fine of \$2,000. Because the surveys and elevation certificates issued by Blew Land Surveying, Inc., dba Blew & Associates and Buckley D. Blew were in violation of the Minimum Standards for the Practice of Land Surveying the firm engaged in dishonorable, unethical, or unprofessional conduct of a character likely to deceive the public. In this regard Blew Land Surveying, Inc., dba Blew & Associates and Buckley D. Blew were found Guilty and assessed an administrative fine of \$2,000.

Gregory S. McVicar, P.L.S. 1828, Case No. 2021-070 Through Agreement: Gregory S. McVicar surrendered his Certificate of Licensure to the Board in lieu of formal administrative action and is permanently barred from reissuance of licensure as a professional land surveyor in the State of Oklahoma.

Kenneth L. Pepowski, P.E. 32920, Case No. 2021-086 Through Agreement: Kenneth L. Pepowski surrendered his Certificate of Licensure to the Board in lieu of formal administrative action and is permanently barred from reissuance of licensure as a professional engineer in the State of Oklahoma.

Robert J. Jurmu, P.E. 32903, Case No. 2021-086

Through Agreement: Robert J. Jurmu surrendered his Certificate of Licensure to the Board in lieu of formal administrative action and is permanently barred from reissuance of licensure as a professional engineer in the State of Oklahoma.

Clinton J. McAdams, Case No. 2021-102

Through Consent: Clinton J. McAdams did not have a Certificate of Licensure to offer and/or practice land surveying in the State of Oklahoma at the time the land surveying services were offered and provided. In this regard McAdams was found Guilty, assessed an administrative fine of \$1,500 and Reprimanded.

Shiver-Megert & Associates, LLP, CA 8852, Case No. 2021-104

Through Consent: Shiver-Megert & Associates, LLP did not have a Certificate of Authorization to offer and/or practice engineering in the State of Oklahoma at the time the engineering services were offered and performed. In this regard Shiver-Megert & Associates, LLP were found Guilty, assessed an administrative fine of \$1,500 and Reprimanded.

Abrahamson & Associates and George W. Abrahamson, Case No. 2022-003

Through Consent: Abrahamson & Associates did not have a Certificate of Authorization to offer and/or practice engineering and land surveying in the State of Oklahoma at the time the engineering and land surveying services were offered and performed. In this regard Abrahamson & Associates were found Guilty, assessed an administrative fine of \$2,000 and ordered to Cease and Desist from offering and/or practicing engineering and/or land surveying in the State of Oklahoma until such time as they are licensed to do so. George W. Abrahamson did not have a Certificate of Licensure to offer and/or practice engineering in the State of Oklahoma at the time the engineering services were offered and provided. In this regard, Abrahamson was found Guilty, assessed an administrative fine of \$1,250 and ordered to Cease and Desist from offering and/or practicing engineering in the State of Oklahoma until such time as he is licensed to do so.

RMS Engineering, Inc., CA 8366 (Inactive) and Reza Sadeghbeigi, P.E. 31905, Case No. 2022-006

Through Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Final Order: RMS Engineering, Inc. and Reza Sadeghbeigi failed to comply with the terms imposed by the Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Final Order in Board Enforcement Case No. 2019-079. In this regard RMS Engineering, Inc. and Reza Sadeghbeigi were found Guilty, and the Certificate of Authorization No. 8366 and P.E. Certificate of Licensure No. 31905 are hereby REVOKED.

June 2022

Wall Engineering, LLC, CA 5413 and Brandon Wall, P.E. 21108, Case No. 2021-057

Through Consent: Brandon Wall prepared, signed, sealed, and issued the electrical engineering design drawings which were outside his area(s) of engineering competence as designated in official Board records. In this regard Wall was found Guilty, assessed an administrative fine of \$1,500 and Reprimanded. At the time Wall prepared, signed, sealed, and issued the electrical engineering design drawings outside his area of competence as designated in Board records, he failed to engage other competent licensed engineer(s) when he contracted to furnish services outside his area of competence. In this regard Wall was found Guilty, assessed an administrative fine of \$1,500 and Reprimanded. Wall Engineering, LLC aided and assisted Wall when he prepared, signed, sealed, and issued the electrical engineering design drawings which were outside his area of competence as designated in official Board records. In this regard Wall Engineering, LLC was found Guilty, assessed an administrative fine of \$1,500 and Reprimanded.

Modular Structural Consultants and Yurianto Yurianto, P.E. 28662 and Chris H. Kim, P.E. 31641, Case No. 2021-103

Through Consent: Modular Structural Consultants did not have a Certificate of Authorization to offer and/or practice engineering in the State of Oklahoma at the time the services were offered and performed. In this regard Modular Structural Consultants were found Guilty, assessed an administrative fine of \$1,200 and ordered to Cease and Desist from offering and/or practicing engineering in the State of Oklahoma until such time as they are licensed to do so. Yurianto Yurianto knew or should have known that Modular Structural Consultants did not have a Certificate of Authorization to offer and/or practice engineering in the State of Oklahoma at the time the engineering services were offered and provided and has, therefore, aided and assisted the firm in the unlicensed offer and/or practice of engineering in the State of Oklahoma. In this regard, Yurianto was found Guilty and assessed an administrative fine of \$1,200. Yurianto Yurianto failed to meet the requirements for having direct control, personal supervision and being in responsible charge of Barun and Yurianto failed to include Barun's title block or his personal contact information on the engineering calculations and drawings. In this regard, Yurianto was found Guilty and assessed an administrative fine of \$1,200. Chris H. Kim knew or should have known that Yurianto did not meet the requirements of being in direct control, personal supervision and being in responsible charge of the services being offered and performed by the Firm and that the Firm did not have a Certificate of Authorization to offer and/or practice engineering in the State of Oklahoma. In this regard, Kim was found Guilty and assessed an administrative fine of \$1,200.

Open Range Engineering Solutions, PLLC, CA 5779 and Ronald E. Nelson, Case No. 2022-004

Through Consent: Ronald E. Nelson did not have a Certificate of Licensure to offer and/or practice engineering in the State of Oklahoma at the time the engineering services were offered and performed. In this regard, Nelson was found Guilty and assessed an administrative fine of \$1,000. Open Range Engineering Solutions, PLLC knew or should have known that Ronald E. Nelson did not have a Certificate of Licensure to offer and/or practice engineering in the State of Oklahoma at the time the engineering services were offered and performed and has, therefore, aided and assisted Nelson in the unlicensed practice of engineering in the State of Oklahoma. In this regard, Open Range Engineering Solutions, PLLC was found Guilty and assessed an administrative fine of \$1,000.

Zach Cox, P.E. 33171, Case No. 2022-009

Through Consent: Zach Cox did not have a Certificate of Licensure to offer and/or practice engineering in the State of Oklahoma at the time the engineering services were offered and performed. In this regard, Cox was found Guilty, assessed an administrative fine of \$1,500 and Reprimanded. Cox failed to apply his Oklahoma seal to the engineering services provided to his client. In this regard, Cox was found Guilty, assessed an administrative fine of \$1,500 and Reprimanded.

Aaron Demaray Tainter, TL 943, P.E. 33422, Case No. 2022-016

Through Consent: Aaron Demaray Tainter failed to submit a complete permanent P.E. application to the Board within thirty (30) days of the issuance of the temporary license. In this regard, Tainter was found Guilty and assessed an administrative fine of \$1,200.

Kupper Engineering, LLC, CA 6976 and Scott T. Kupper, P.E. 27094, Case No. 2022-017

Through Consent: Kupper Engineering, LLC did not have a Certificate of Authorization to offer and/or practice engineering in the State of Oklahoma at the time the services were offered and performed. In this regard Kupper Engineering, LLC was found Guilty, assessed an administrative fine of \$1,500 and Reprimanded. Scott T. Kupper knew or should have known that Kupper Engineering, LLC did not have a Certificate of Authorization to offer and/or practice engineering in the State of Oklahoma at the time the engineering services were offered and performed. In this regard Scott T. Kupper was found Guilty, assessed an administrative fine of \$1,500 and Reprimed. In this regard Scott T. Kupper was found Guilty, assessed an administrative fine of \$1,500 and Reprimanded.

July 2022

Foresight Land Surveying, LLC, CA 7652 and Jason R. Lilly, P.L.S. 1950, Case No. 2021-063

Through Consent: Foresight Land Surveying, LLC, failed to achieve minimum standards as required by the Oklahoma Minimum Standards for the Practice of Land Surveying. In this regard Foresight Land Surveying, LLC was found Guilty, assessed an administrative fine \$2,500 and Reprimanded. Jason R. Lilly, failed to achieve minimum standards as required by the Oklahoma Minimum Standards for the Practice of Land Surveying, and failed to file Certified Corner Records for the public land survey corners used as control with the Archives and Records Division of the Oklahoma Department of Libraries within 90 days after the survey was completed in violation of the Corner Perpetuation and Filing Act. In this regard Lilly was found Guilty, assessed an administrative penalty of \$5,000 and Reprimanded. Additionally, Lilly failed to comply with the terms of the Consent order in Case No. 2018-045. In this regard Lilly was found Guilty, assessed an administrative penalty of \$4,000, ordered to file Certified Corner Records for the corners not filed in Case No's. 2018-024 and 2021-063, take and successfully complete the class in the Minimum Standards for the Practice of Land Surveying offered by the Oklahoma Society of Land Surveyors at its 2023 Annual Convention, successfully complete a Board approved course in Land Surveying Ethics within one year of the date of the Consent Order, and shall be audited for compliance with continuing education requirements in the next renewal cycle of his Certificate of Licensure. Failure to comply with the provisions of this order shall prompt the Investigation Committee to file an immediate Notice to Appear before the Board to show cause why the Certificate of Authorization and the Certificate of Licensure should not be suspended or revoked.

Osterle, knew or should have known that Rizzo International, Inc. did not have a Certificate of Authorization to offer and/or practice engineering in the State of Oklahoma at the time the engineering services were offered and performed, therefore, Osterle has aided and assisted Rizzo International, Inc. in the unlicensed offer to practice and practice of engineering in the State of Oklahoma. In this regard, Osterle was found Guilty, assessed an administrative fine of \$3,000 and Reprimanded.

Interested in Retiring Your P.E. or P.L.S. License?

OAR: 245:15-7-1(c) states, "When a professional engineer or land surveyor in good standing desires to retire his or her license, he or she may do so upon application to the Board, subject to reinstatement and continuing education requirements by the Board." If retirement is the reason for not renewing your license and you choose to place your license on Retired status, you may do so from the online renewal site. Register and log in to your online renewal account, select "Renew", then choose the retirement option when prompted and complete the process online. By choosing the Retired status, you will no longer be required to earn continuing education hours or be required to pay a fee. However, you will not be allowed to practice your profession in Oklahoma. You will receive a wallet card showing Retired status and you will remain on the Board's online roster as Retired. **PLEASE NOTE:** If you renew your license and certify that you have met the continuing education requirements, you shall NOT be allowed to retire your license after the fact in lieu of an administrative action if you are chosen for audit and do not have the required hours.
